

Learning to Tell Time

The demise of the analog clock has probably affected the learning curve a little. But flashing digital displays still don't offer to children or

other fine people the precise meaning of time that goes along with merely knowing the numbers. So it's 3-0-2 p.m.: What does that signify, and why should we care? The question of time always comes down to this: What does knowledge of the hour have to do with me?

Time means different things to different people. It also means different things to the same person—but let's take our time with this idea. Ask an indolent person sleeping off the latest six-pack what 3:02 means and he might say, "Time for another beer." A shop-keeper might call it two hours after closing time. A school child running for the bus won't hear the question. A depressed person may sigh: "One hour

is as good as another."

For the average person, 3:02 has many meanings depending on the day. A workday is different from a Saturday. Vacation time and the holiday season seem to change the texture of time altogether. A week in bed with the flu changes the feeling of time, even the pace at which it moves. Waiting in the hospital at 3:02 for word from a surgeon about a loved one is not the same as waiting for the groom two minutes late for the wedding, or waiting for the mail delivery, or waiting for Godot. Maybe we're anxiously anticipating spring break, or perhaps nothing at all, because no future possibilities seem from here to make a difference, to offer hope or rescue.

Being a seer, Isaiah could look to the horizons of time and see a new day dawning. To prophets, time is like a ribbon of road set before us that only requires a certain amount of determined walking to get where we want to go.

The light of the Lord is out there; how badly do you want to see it? Get walking, and you'll arrive to bask in it. Stay put, and you'll never see that day shine forth. Saint Paul, who could certainly dance with the prophets on a good day, imagined that we're all farther down that road to kairos time than we suspect.

How do we want to arrive at the fateful hour: steeped in the current sludge of sinfulness or shimmering in the freshly polished armor of virtue? Meanwhile—we can say meanwhile, because in eternity the perspective is not linear—Jesus says that winding your watch or glancing at your cell phone won't give you the information you need about the advancement of the hour. In the reign of God, it's never 3:02. It's always now.

CATHOLIC TRIVIA

QUESTION

When we say the Penitential Act at Mass, why do we strike our chest?

ANSWER

Our rituals and liturgical celebrations are filled with a variety of symbols, some of which also relate to our gestures and physical postures (e.g. kneeling, sitting, processing, making the Sign of the Cross). The custom of striking our breast during the "I Confess" of the Penitential Act of the Mass is one of those gestures that is loaded with symbolism.

The tradition of Christian's striking the breast (above the heart) is rooted in the image of Sacred Scripture, especially texts like Psalm 51 which speak of a "humbled contrite heart" or how God heals broken hearts, binding up our wounds (see Psalm 147:3). Early Christian writers like Saint Augustine of Hippo and Saint Jerome also refer to this custom in their writings.

Ultimately, this practice is an expression of our sorrow for those times when we have been guilty of faults and a sign that we are willing to take responsibility for our sins and failings. That we all perform this gesture together is also an act of solidarity, recognizing that none of us, regardless of where we are on our journey of faith, is without fault and the need for grace and forgiveness.


ANGEL GIVING TREES

beginning **this weekend**. Everyone is




