With Continued Repentance, the Church will Survive

Saint Peter is elevated to our attention for at least nine crucial Matthean moments. This gospel is invested in the development

of a singular disciple destined to become the keeper of the keys. Though Peter is called to discipleship in ch. 4, he has no speaking part on that occasion or up until this one in ch. 14, when he attempts to walk on water. It's the first time in Matthew that Peter distinguishes himself from the generic group of disciples. It's the moment that prepares him for his fateful confession in ch. 16: "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

Up to now the 12 apostles have functioned like a conglomerate of pale witnesses to Jesus' ministry. Occasionally they venture a question, but it's "the disciples" who ask it—as if none of these men has yet found his voice in the commanding presence of the Teacher. Let's face

it: We'd likely be no different in the company of one who heals the sick, multiplies food, casts out demons, and restores the dead. Not to mention one who teaches with such authority that religious leaders are confounded.

Once Peter dares to address the Lord personally on this fearful night, his leadership potential is out of the bag. Jesus seems to know it, too: From now on he'll select Peter for his inner circle of three to go where the others are not invited. Perhaps Jesus continues to mull over the three in ensuing episodes, weighing their merits. Peter has a forgiveness handicap: "Lord, must I forgive my brother seven times?" Meanwhile the sons of Zebedee, hiding behind their mother's skirts, crave the glory seats in the coming reign. Peter will make his daring confession yet follow it with a glaring lack of comprehension by rejecting any talk of the Passion to come. Peter is "blessed" for what the Spirit makes known to him—

and "Satan" for tempting Jesus to seek a less costly way.

Peter's warring spirits are evident from this first stormy hour. He has the inspiration, energy, and bravado to get out of the boat, and a legion of doubts that cause him to sink in short order. This Petrine trait echoes again at the Last Supper, when Peter swears his faith will never be shaken, only hours before he will deny his Lord multiple times. "O you of little faith," Jesus must chide his friend—and, by extension, us. For Peter is ultimately chosen to be the rock upon which the church will stand and, occasionally, sink like a stone. Peter's flaw is alive and well in his 21st-century heirs. But as long as we mirror Peter's persistent repentance, thankfully, the church will survive.

WEEKLY REFLECTION**Looking for God**

What do we think when we see Jesus coming to save us?

The first thing the Apostles scream is “Ghost!” when they catch sight of Jesus walking towards them on water. That always makes me laugh. After all they have witnessed thus far as the companions of the Messiah, they see someone walking on water and they still react like extras in a bad episode of Scooby-Doo.



We are always more quick to believe a bad thing than a good thing. We can easily believe gossip and hearsay about a friend, but we fear being taken for a fool when it comes to faith. We would rather look cynical than stupid.

“Save me, God, for the waters have reached my neck,” reads Psalm 69. “My eyes fail, from looking for my God.”

I think back on my life, on all the various ways that God has rescued me from slipping beneath the surface. Rarely did it ever occur to me, in the midst of it, that I was being rescued. In fact, I usually thought I was being held underwater. Did I hear His voice directing me, or did I only hear my own despairing? “Save me, God.” Was I looking for Him, or were my eyes shut in fear? “My eyes fail, from looking for my God.”

It’s never until after the fact — sometimes years after, or decades — that we see things clearly. That we see Christ in the situation, making his way toward us, hand outstretched.

CATHOLIC Q&A**QUESTION**

What lessons should I learn from the Assumption of Mary?

ANSWER

Growing in holiness is similar to training in a sport. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God’s will, living each day with confidence in God’s mercy and love. At the Nativity, in Jesus’ public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: “For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church’s coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people.”

It is this image of holiness that we strive to imitate. In the office, at home, or in our community, we look for signs of God’s grace that call us to an ever greater love of him and each other. A greater awareness of God is a sign of our conversion of heart that lives the lessons Mary teaches.

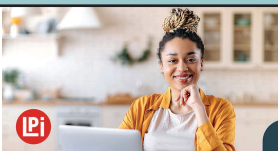
