# Lord, Not This!

Our experiences in this life can be pretty grand. Let us count the ways this world delights us: sunsets, flowers, falling in love, the birth of a child, birthday cake, Christmas lights, shade trees, the Grand Canyon, our favorite song, that new car smell, friendship, Thanksgiving dinner, holding hands, joyful news. Ask the assembly to add to the list, and it becomes a Julie Andrews homily: “These are a few of my favorite things.”

We could also make a list detailing the ways life disappoints us. No one needs to hear that litany, which weighs in each heart like an anvil. How do we move forward with the legacy of our history rattling behind us like Jacob Marley’s chains?

Jeremiah demonstrates how to find courage to go on, beyond the death of loved ones, the cancer diagnosis, the traumas of abandonment or unemployment or failure. Life holds out

such promise that when we run up against mortal limits, or the offenses of a broken world, understandably the spirit rebels. Suddenly we feel cheated, lied to, even robbed by somebody—maybe God. We don’t deserve this suffering, we tell ourselves. We didn’t earn it. We may not be perfect people, but the violations we face often seem disproportionate to our personal quota of badness.

Jeremiah was not a bad guy, yet his career was a magnet for misery. Being a professional truth-teller, he didn’t mind telling God exactly how he felt about that fact. Better to be honest in prayer than to gloss over our true feelings with pieties. Unburdening his heart of the outrage and hurt led Jeremiah to his personal bottom line: a fierce resolve to remain loyal to what he carried in his very bones. That was his deep connection to the holy will of God. If the prophet had not released the magma of his other passions, he might not have discovered the bedrock of this one.

Jesus taught his disciples for quite some time before venturing on to the subject of his upcoming Passion. First they had to hear how blest are those persecuted for the sake of justice.

They had to appreciate that eye-for-an-eye retaliation is not the key to peace, that loving enemies is better than hating them. They had to cease judging others and depend totally on God for their support and vindication. Having sat through all these lessons and more, however, the disciples still proved unwilling to receive the truth. Jesus would have to teach this lesson twice more—and embody it, too—before they could embrace his decision to unite his will to his Father’s. Yet even Jesus would ask if the cup might pass before he agreed to drink it. Suffering always requires frankness in its preparation.

Since the Holy Mass is the greatest and most powerful prayer of the Church, having a Mass offered for a specific intention is a powerful way to intercede for the living, pray for the dead, and give thanks to God.

To request a Mass intention at Mission San Diego, stop by our Visitor Center & Gift Shop and complete a Mass Intention Request Envelope. Requests for a specific date and time should be made at least one month in advance. If no date is requested, the Mass will be scheduled as soon as possible.

In the Diocese of San Diego, the recommended offering for a Mass intention is \$10.00. Offerings received from Mass intentions are given to the priest who celebrated the Mass as part of his compensation. At the Mission San Diego, priest's Mass intentions are announced by way of the Sunday bulletin.

## CATHOLIC Q&A

### QUESTION

Why do priests wear vestments? Do they have a special meaning?

### ANSWER:

Vestments are clothes worn for a specific purpose. Priests will joke that they cover a thousand flaws. But our own manner of dress often corresponds to what we do. We dress up for special occasions, and for special guests. We wear certain clothes for golf, for outdoor activities, and years ago, we even had our "Sunday best" clothes we wore just for Church. Vestments are much the same, and each one has a meaning. The alb is a reminder of the baptismal garment. The stole is a symbol of ordained ministry and authority within the Church. The chasuble reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage of faith, passing through this life towards heaven.

Priests wear vestments for two basic reasons. First, they draw attention to the importance and solemnity of the act of worship. The color of the vestments indicates the season of the year or the feast being celebrated. Secondly, vestments draw attention to what the priest does, rather than who he is. In the celebration of the Mass, the focus is on what we do together, on our common unity, and on the mystery and person of Christ.
