I Hate to Tell You This, But ...

To be honest, I don't like today's readings. I find them troubling. Like you, I'm in the truth-telling business, yet I harden my heart

against this message. Scripture is not wishy-washy, and these passages are clear-cut diamonds, and just as sharp. Jesus lays out the invitation—no, the obligation—to confront each other with wrongdoing in the spirit of benevolent correction. Most of us prefer to decline, because it's an icky business.

A few caveats are in order. First, we have to be sure we know what "right-doing" is. That involves taking a fearless moral inventory of ourselves: sorting out the difference between our personal preferences and God's own truth. This initial step is where most would-be rescuers go wrong. Before approaching another about the splinter in their eye, we'd best get the plank out of our own. It helps to begin by seeking counsel from someone wise and asking: Am

I doing this right? Do I have the facts straight before I take on the spiritual works of mercy known as "instructing the ignorant" and "warning the sinner"? Or is it more a case of being called upon to "counsel the doubtful" or even "forgive offenses"?

Once we're sure where we stand, we face the second, equally imperative task: benevolent correction, with the accent on benevolent. Too often we come out swinging the sledgehammer of righteous indignation instead. The stories of parents screaming moral instruction at their children or spouses hurtling accusations at each other are legion. Even if we whisper the need to reconsider a course of action, we must check that we're not smiling inwardly, enjoying the superior position too much. Self-righteousness is the killer of every good intention. It bears repeating: Self-righteous smugness befouls the moral high ground and makes it stink.

To be sure our intentions are pure, we might ask: Do I feel motivated by love, or by anger or disgust? Am I calm, or roused to do battle? Do I aim to help or

to bludgeon? If our intention is anything but love, we're not prepared to engage the spirit of correction.

When I'm in the sinner's seat, I admit I rarely respond well to correction initially. Ego-death is no different from any other: Most of us move through Elisabeth Kübler-Ross' stages of dying: denial, anger, bargaining, depression. If we follow all the way to the fifth stage, acceptance, we'll profit from correction. Obviously it takes as much spiritual preparation to receive as to offer the gift of instruction. Just as you can't expect a baby to walk, you can't expect a person to do what they're not spiritually equipped to do. That's why Jesus is clear that this kind of intervention happens within the family of faith. Spiritual maturity is needed to engage this process and informs its success.

To request a Mass intention at Mission San Diego, stop by our Visitor Center & Gift Shop and complete a Mass Intention Request Envelope. Requests for a specific date and time should be made at least one month in advance. If no date is requested, the Mass will be scheduled as soon as possible.

In the Diocese of San Diego, the recommended offering for a Mass intention is \$10.00. Offerings received from Mass intentions are given to the priest who celebrated the Mass as part of his compensation. At the Mission San Diego, priest's Mass intentions are announced by way of the Sunday bulletin.

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CATHOLIC Q&A

QUESTION

As we celebrate Labor Day, can you tell me about Catholic teaching regarding labor?



ANSWER:

One of the most important principles of Catholic social teaching is the dignity of work and the rights of workers. Four encyclicals address this foundational social teaching: *Rerum Novarum* (1891) by Leo XIII, *Quadragesimo Anno* (1931) by Pius XI, *Laborem Exercens* (1981), and *Centesimus Annus* (1991) by John Paul II. They address both the theology and dignity of work. In Genesis, God takes the initiative in creating the world, calling forth human beings to be faithful stewards of creation. We are thus formed to share in God's continuing creative activity by partnering with God in finishing the world and helping bring it to completion and fulfillment. From this perspective, work can be spiritually understood in terms of sharing in God's ongoing activity to build, create, and transform the world. Human beings are co-creators with God. This vocation demands self-discipline.

Besides an exercise in self-discipline, work is also the means by which we develop and fulfill ourselves. In work, we shape the world and our environment. Through work, we also shape ourselves. Pope John Paul II summarized this point in *Laborem Exercens* #6, "the value of work is not primarily the kind of work being done, but the fact that the one who is doing it is a person."

Labor Day offers an excellent opportunity to reflect on how we view work in light of our Catholic social teaching.

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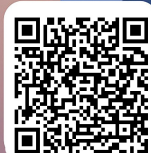
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
