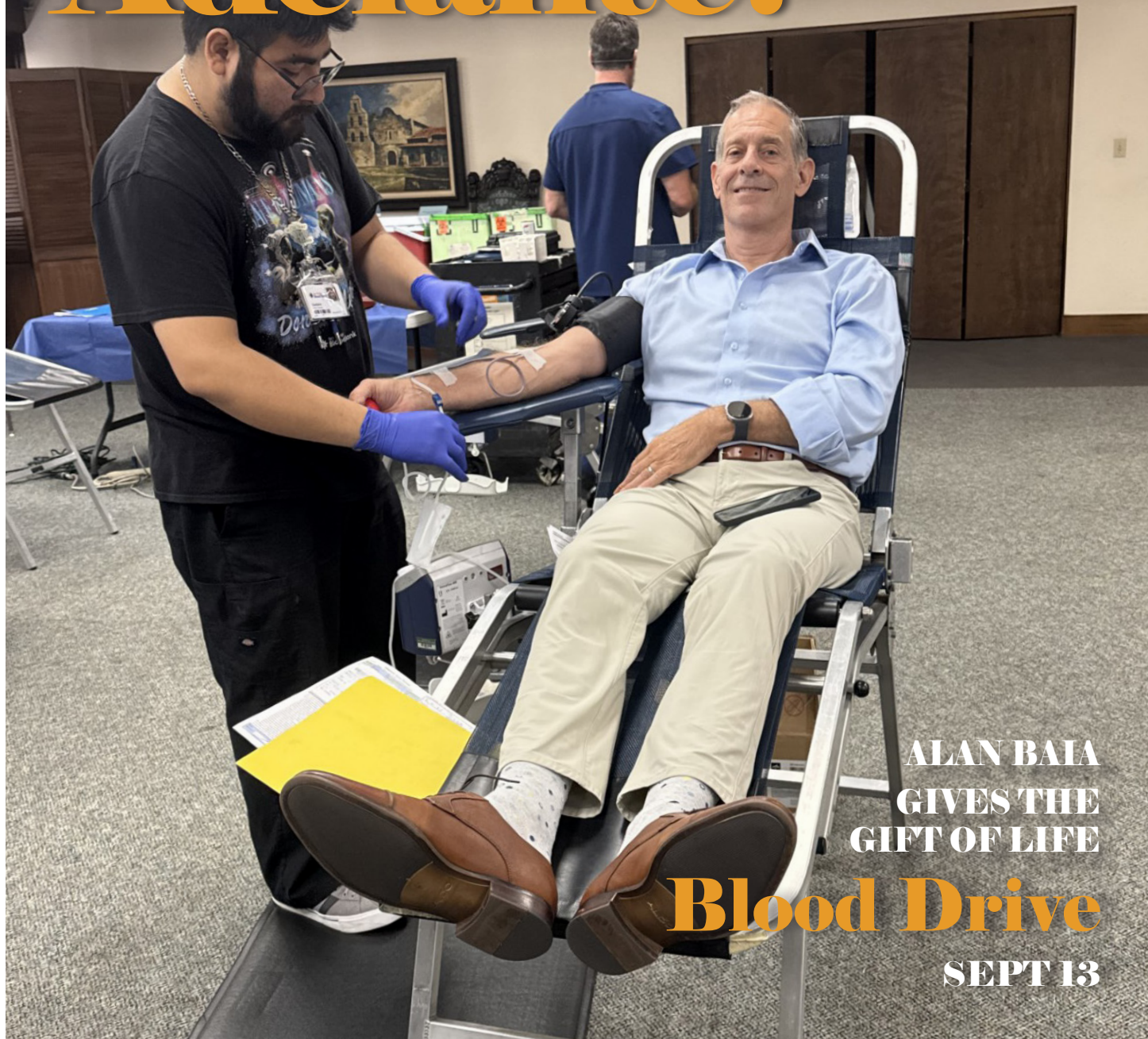

God's Dubious Fairness

Some of us can't balance a checkbook—although in these days of online payments and direct deposit, who writes checks anyway?

But we spend enough time in the kitchen, at least, to know how to measure things, or have enough arithmetic under our belts to know when a sum is equal to its parts. One thing's for sure: God's mercy doesn't add up. There's far too much of it around, most of it undeserved.

Do we want what we deserve, then? Not if we're honest. As the psalmist points out, in our younger days many of us weren't as smart as we are now. We made errors in judgment, which is to say we often failed to judge at all in our eagerness to embrace life's enticements. Few would want to be judged on the merits of our first 20 years. Or our first 40. Some of us would rather

be taken at face value now than by what we did last week!

A scorekeeping God would do that: keep credit-and-debit columns on each of us. If everything we ever did was weighted equally, no matter when or under what circumstances we acted, we'd all be doomed right now. We might as well lock the doors of the church and go home to embrace our ruin. But the merciful God responds with a complex algorithm of grace we can't comprehend. Intention and deliberation affect our culpability, according to sacramental theology. Having an informed conscience matters. Our current state of contrition and intention for future amendment factor in. The gravity of an issue, venial or mortal, is a question to be asked.

Above and beyond and around all the parts of our dilemma as sinners is the sum of the whole, which is God's desire to save. God's determination to rescue the lost is much, much greater

than our feeble power to get lost in the first place. Because God resolves to be the God who saves, the sum will be freedom from sin and death no matter what our actions merit. It's as if God writes the happy total at the bottom of the page and then erases whatever necessary to make it so.

God's not as worried about the math as we are. This is the God who multiplies a basket of food and feeds 5,000, or counts 1,000 years as a day. It's not that God can't add but that the algorithm of grace is so much finer than what we arrive at on our own. "The wages of sin is death": One plus one equals two, but who wants this dreadful solution? Better to grant God the courtesy of doing the higher and more gracious math.

MASS INTENTIONS

The tradition of offering a Mass Intention is a deeply meaningful and ancient Catholic practice. Since the Holy Mass is the greatest and most powerful prayer of the Church, having a Mass offered for a specific intention is a powerful way to intercede for the living, pray for the dead, and give thanks to God.

To request a Mass intention at Mission San Diego, stop by our Visitor Center & Gift Shop and complete a Mass Intention Request Envelope. Requests for a specific date and time should be made at least one month in advance. If no date is requested, the Mass will be scheduled as soon as possible.

In the Diocese of San Diego, the recommended offering for a Mass intention is \$10.00. Offerings received from Mass intentions are given to the priest who celebrated the Mass as part of his compensation. At the Mission San Diego, priest's Mass intentions are announced by way of the Sunday bulletin.

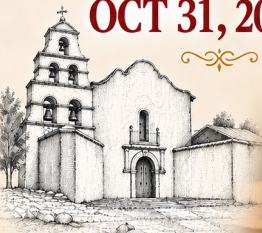

CATHOLIC Q&A

QUESTION

What is the “Miraculous Medal” and why is it called that?

ANSWER:

The medal of the Immaculate Conception that has come to be called simply the “Miraculous Medal” dates back to an apparition of Mary to Saint Catherine Laboure, who was then a novice sister with the Daughters of Charity. On November 27, 1830, Our Lady appeared to her standing on a globe, with shafts of light streaming from her hands and the words, “O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee,” surrounding the image. In the same vision, Catherine saw a capital “M” with a cross above it and below two hearts. Catherine seemed to hear a voice telling her to have what she saw struck as a medal and a promise that those who wore the medal would have the protection and intercession of the Mother of God. The first 1,500 of medals were distributed in 1832. Many miraculous favors were attributed to the use of the medal.

Saint Catherine’s “Miraculous Medal” is among the recognizable and popular symbols of modern Catholicism. Reflecting on its widespread use, the 2001 Vatican document, “Directory on Popular Piety and Liturgy,” observes that the medal “recalls the mystery of Redemption, the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Sorrowful Heart of Mary. It signifies the mediatory role of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mystery of the Church, the relationship between Heaven and earth, this life and eternal life.”
