How do you get there from here?

How do you get to holy from where you're sitting? Is it a matter of saying enough prayers, going to church for years, not breaking the Commandments, being generous to the annual bishop's appeal? Those things might help; I'm not one to knock any of them. Especially the bishop's appeal, which is a way of being faithful to the common good of our sisters and brothers. But sanctity is not the pot of gold at the end of any of these rainbows automatically.

And maybe, honestly, holiness is not even on your bucket list. The faces on the holy cards rarely look like they're having a good time. I've got a heavenly host of saints' images all around my desk, with expressions ranging from pensive (the Madonnas) to brooding (Saint Paul) to grim (Jerome!). I'd love to have a view of the laughing, dancing communion of saints, but apart from some grinning

Mother Teresas and mischievous Pope John Paul IIs, those are hard to find.

Yet when Jesus fashioned his most famous teaching, the Beatitudes, he capitalized on what would make us "happy"—which is a more accurate translation than "blessed." Which leads you to wonder: Shouldn't being among the blessed be a source of joy for us? Of course one must admit the list of qualifying folks doesn't sound as if they've got a lot to smile about: the poor (in spirit or otherwise), the mourners, the downtrodden, the oppressed, the persecuted and insulted. I suppose being a compassionate, pure-hearted peacenik isn't so bad. But ask me again when I'm actually practicing those virtues.

So what makes this lot so happy, according to Jesus? Their reward in heaven will be great. In a culture that views delayed gratification as no gratification at all, that sounds like the not-so-good news of Jesus Christ. Is Jesus saying, "Suffer now to be happy later"? When life is presented

in those terms—the cross today or the flames tomorrow—that's not exactly comforting. Happily, that's not what Jesus is saying. The common denominator in the Beatitude Club is humility, not suffering. If we want to belong to this Happy Club, we have to exercise that most essential of all virtues.

What does it mean to be humble? To know when to bow down or bend the knee. We bow before the will of God, which is to love and be loved. We bend the knee before God alone. Those who are humbled by their present circumstances or who humble themselves by conforming their lives to God's will are mutually blessed. As Mother Teresa once said, we must empty ourselves to receive a blessing because even God cannot fill what is full. Want happiness? Seeking holiness? Start with humility.

CATHOLIC Q&A

QUESTION

Can you explain what we mean by a vocation or calling? I have heard this term used in many different contexts and am not sure what it means. Does it apply to religious life?



ANSWER

A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be administered during Mass on **Sat, Feb 14** in the St. Francis Chapel at 9:00 am.

Who may receive the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

- Baptized persons over the age of seven and whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age may receive the sacrament of healing.
- Those who are elderly may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present.
- Those who have recently been anointed and whose illness has progressed may receive the sacrament again.

Caregivers and those who are able-bodied may consider bringing someone who cannot come to the Mass on their own. A light reception will follow in the California Room. All are welcome. It is not necessary to RSVP.

ST. BLAISE BLESSING

The **Blessing of Throats** will take place on **Tues, Feb 3**, at the 7:00 am and 5:30 pm Masses in memory of St. Blaise, a 4th-century bishop and martyr known for his miraculous healing of a boy choking on a fishbone. This special blessing is a centuries-old Catholic tradition asking God to deliver the recipient “from every disease of the throat and every other illness.”

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Feb 2 is exactly 40 days after **Dec 25**, the nativity of Jesus. Jewish law (Ex 13:2, 12) dictated that Jesus, as the firstborn, be consecrated to God. This was done by the parents as they presented their Son in the Temple.



Jewish law further specified (Lv 12:2-8) that a mother was ritually impure after giving birth, and that she had to wait a set period of time (forty days for a boy) before she was to offer a sacrifice to the Lord for purification.

The convergence of these two Jewish regulations occasions Luke's account of both the Presentation of the Lord and the Purification of Mary. These days the liturgical emphasis is more on the Presentation of Jesus. Luke highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah and praised God for being able to see and experience such a marvel in their lifetimes.

Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is “a light for revelation to the Gentiles.” This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day which were to be used in the ceremonies, rituals, and processions throughout the church year. Thus Feb 2 is also known as Candlemas Day. This day is indeed a rich feast to be savored.

BLESSING OF CANDLES

Celebrate the **Feast of the Presentation of the Lord** by bringing your candles to the 7:00 am or 5:30 pm Mass on **Mon, Feb 2**. Candles for use in your home throughout the year will be blessed at the beginning of each Mass along with candles designated for use in the liturgy. The tradition of blessing candles symbolizes Christ as the Light of the World.

LENTEN FISH DINNERS

Lent is fast approaching and the Knights of Columbus and Columbiettes will again offer Friday fish dinners. Pre-sale dinner tickets will be available on **Feb 8** and **Feb 15**, after all Masses. Dinner tickets for adults are \$20.00, children (6- 12) \$10.00. A "season-ticket" is \$100.00, for six adult tickets (pay for 5 dinners, receive 6 dinner tickets). Adult beverages of wine and beer tickets are \$5.00. Clam chowder is available for \$5.00. 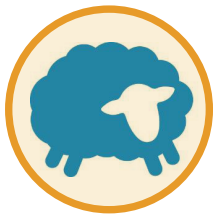
