

Covenants in Flesh and Blood

Legal promises are mostly made of paper. The party of the first part agrees to X and the party of the second part reciprocates with Y. It's all very clean and tidy. Everyone knows what's expected of them. The contract is binding until it expires or the terms are broken or the page is torn up. When people breach these kinds of promises, the consequences are also mostly composed of paper, this time, the monetary kind.


The biblical people of Israel contracted a series of divine promises made of increasingly more binding materials: commandments written in stone and a kingdom that ran through a particular family's bloodline. Ultimately God sealed a covenant with the nation as a whole. Circumcision marked the spot in flesh and blood. Wherever these people went, God would go with them—even into exile. This people-covenant was best expressed through the figure of Isaiah's faithful servant, who was summoned

to act as a "light to the nations." The servant embodied the nation's calling to be the radiant light that would serve as a beacon to the whole world, drawing everyone into God's promises.

People-covenants are harder to dispose of than the paper kind or even those chiseled in stone like the Decalogue. A covenant in flesh and blood is like the child in a faltering marriage whose reality and rootedness in a home beg to differ that the marriage-commitment never happened. Sacraments teach us how to understand sacred covenants: What God binds together cannot be dissolved by ripping up a page or writing a check. Baptism unites you with God through death and life to eternity. Eucharist makes you one with the life of Christ. Marriage and holy orders are both people-covenants which are lasting and true. None of these promises are small matters, which is why Christians take

them very seriously.

Saint Paul, schooled in Pharisaic arguments based on law, had counted heavily on covenants made of words.



In his new life as an apostle of the gospel, he deliberately relinquished his dependence on smart-talk and put all his confidence in the sign of the cross. For him the cross was the greatest of all covenants made in flesh and blood. There is no way to shred or annul this promise. You can't buy it off with any substance the world values. God has staked God's claim on the world in the body and blood of God's Son. If you eat this bread and drink this cup, you renew the bond that Christ-life has on you. The church is a people-covenant to which the nations look for divine light.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

CATHOLIC Q&A

QUESTION

Are near-death experiences real?

ANSWER

There is a lot of curiosity and fascination with the idea of an afterlife and communicating with those who have died. In movies, television shows, and numerous books, people make claims about their ability to communicate with the dead, or having had a near-death experience. There is no objective way to verify any of this. While details about people and events can be surprisingly accurate, it is just circumstantial evidence that might be explained in other ways.

On the other hand, when people have unusual experiences, sometimes called near-death or out-of-body, it is real to them. They react with the emotions and thoughts that one would expect. At times, they report details they could not have known any other way, such as bits of conversation, or meeting people they had never known in this life. So certainly, to the person, they experience something. We believe in a life after death, we believe in the communion of saints. These things are not a contradiction to faith, but we should not base our faith on them, nor change our beliefs. They are unexplained and will likely remain so.

Who may receive the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?



- Baptized persons over the age of seven and whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age may receive the sacrament of healing.
- Those who are elderly may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present.
- Those who have recently been anointed and whose illness has progressed may receive the sacrament again.

Caregivers and those who are able-bodied may consider bringing someone who cannot come to the Mass on their own. A light reception will follow in the California Room. All are welcome. It is not necessary to RSVP.

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

Feb 11 is commemorated as the **World Day of the Sick**.

The theme for 2026, as chosen by Pope Leo XIV, is "The compassion of the Samaritan: Loving by bearing the pain of others." The Vatican's Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development said the theme "highlights this aspect of love of neighbor: love needs concrete gestures of closeness, through which we enter into the suffering of others, those who are ill, especially those who at the same time experience poverty, isolation and loneliness."

The World Day of the Sick was established by Pope Saint John Paul II in 1992 to offer prayers for those who are suffering from illnesses. In establishing the day, Pope John Paul II said that he desired it to be "a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church, and of reminding everyone to see in his sick brother or sister the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising, achieved the salvation of mankind."

Pope Saint John Paul II chose Feb 11 as the date because it coincides with the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, a title given to the Blessed Mother after her appearances to St. Bernadette Soubirous in Lourdes, France, in 1858. Each year, millions travel to Lourdes, seeking healing.

The World Day of the Sick is also an opportunity to recognize the ministry of health-care workers, hospital chaplains, and all who care for the sick, serving as a reminder that they are carrying on the healing ministry of Christ.

The anointing of the sick is administered to individuals suffering from physical, emotional, or mental illness. It is also administered to those having surgery, even routine procedures. In addition, the sacrament is appropriate for elderly weakened by advanced age or suffering from chronic or long-term illnesses. Anyone struggling or recovering from alcoholism or other addictions can also be anointed, as can individuals being treated with chemotherapy, radiation, or physical therapies.


