# There Ought to be a Law

My 85-year-old mother is addicted to cop shows and courtroom dramas. She's not an active lawbreaker herself, mind you, but she loves to invest her evenings in following criminals down their morally darkened paths outsmarting clever law-enforcers and heavily-degreed legal counsels by slipping through loopholes in jurisprudence and all but disappearing behind the wall of their crimes in triumph—until the end of the hour, that is, when some infinitesimal fact comes to light, condemning the guilty and vindicating the innocent. The disturbing thing is, I'm not sure which my elderly mother enjoys more: that justice is finally served, or that the perp almost got away with it!

Many of us have a morally ambiguous relationship to law. We love having plenty of laws nailed into place to protect us and our property from other people. At the same time we play fast and loose with the laws that

inconvenience us. Tax laws, traffic laws, and municipal laws are only three kinds of rules some of us are comfortable breaking if we think we can get away with it. Most of us are pleased to defend the rule of law until a particular facet of it gets in our way, and let's presume that we churchgoers are the law-abiding segment of the population! Some folks have far less respect for the rules than we do.

So we become glued to serials like *The Sopranos*, *Damages*, *Breaking Bad*, or any story where the moral lines are vague between the good guys and the bad ones. Like my mom, we're attracted to stories that confess a disconcerting truth: We're all ready to break the law given the right set of circumstances. Perhaps we've convinced ourselves that most laws are neither good nor bad but arbitrary. If a given law crosses our sovereign free will or basic self-interest, we might be willing to look the other way and "break bad"—just this once.

Biblical law was established to be a different kind of law altogether from

what folks were used to. The Hebrew word for law is more like "guidance" or "instruction" than a line drawn in the sand. Divine law wasn't viewed as negatively prohibitive or punitive but positive and helpful. The point wasn't to constrict human freedom but to keep people safe, happy, and at peace.

A red light isn't meant to make you late for an appointment, after all—even if it does just that; it's intended to keep you and your neighbor from plowing into each other at an intersection. Law was deemed such a cheerful thing in Israel that psalms were written to praise the joy of living lawfully. God's gift of law is evidence that God is serious about wanting to preserve the happiness of the community so favored. When Jesus extends the laws as deep and high as you can conceive, is this his way of making life harder—or simpler than ever?

## Fast & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

## CATHOLIC Q&A

### QUESTION

Why is the Church against stem cell research, especially if it offers the possibility of cures for diseases like Alzheimer's and Parkinson's?

### ANSWER

Like so many issues, the truth about stem cell research is more complicated than a few sound bites and vague promises of cures. For the Church, the problem is with embryonic stem cell research, not the research itself. The destruction of human life, even for a seemingly noble cause, is never acceptable. The ends cannot justify the means. Stem cells can be obtained in other ways, including from the placenta as well as from adults. So research is possible without the destruction of other life.

On the other hand, stem cell research shows much promise, but no concrete results. Some scientists also dispute what diseases might be cured by new discoveries. The research is still in its early stages. The question for our country is whether we should invest a lot of money in research now, looking for cures that will probably remain out of reach for most people, or should we invest that money in other programs with more immediate benefits, especially those that stress prevention and education. It is indeed a complex issue that requires close scrutiny and investigation before we jump to inaccurate conclusions or make decisions based on good, but misinformed, intentions.

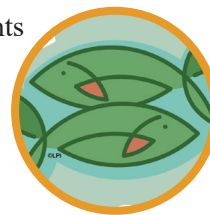

## DIOCESE OF SAN DIEGO

As previously announced by the Diocese in 2022, at the conclusion of a three-year visitation, the Apostolic See (*specifically the then-Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life*) by means of a Decree dated 13 May 2022 and approved in forma specifica by Pope Francis, suppressed the religious institute formerly known as the Trinitarians of Mary. With this suppression, the former members of the Trinitarians were automatically dispensed from their vows and are no longer permitted to present themselves as religious. There is no right of appeal, and the Trinitarians have ceased to exist as a religious institute recognized by the Catholic Church.
