Spring at Zion

Have you noticed the refreshing changes at Zion this Spring? Gerry has been busy painting the Sanctuary and the Lounge over the winter, our Minister's office is clean, bright & inviting with fresh new paint, a total revamp, and even new flooring. The flooring for Hati's office was such a good price we went ahead and purchased enough for the lounge & kitchenette area as well – it's in storage until next fall/winter.

The washroom off the Lounge has a new, higher, toilet and the plan is to revamp the washroom to be handi-capped accessible.

Three Jay Electrical has replaced the ancient panel which was in the main entrance to the Sanctuary, which was a serious safety concern. Check out the new panel. There are other areas in the hall and Sanctuary that have had some electrical upgrades, we're not finished with this project yet. Take time to check out the LED lighting in the Book Nook – what a difference! If you wonder why we went with Three Jay (Paul Wendt) – they are members of the BC Hydro Alliance and work closely with Hydro. We do have a charge from BC Hydro for relocating the service to the sanctuary – the existing one was non-conforming with today's regulations. The job was more complex than anticipated. Paul has been very patient with us.

Our Spring cleanup crew have really cleaned up – be sure to look behind the hall, it shows we care and adds some much needed parking spaces. A good neighbour fence is coming soon.

The one thing that isn't looking so bright is our building fund, it's been taking a bit of a hit. Our electrical upgrades have cost approx. \$6,000 to date (that's including the charge for the relocation of service)

Plywood, paint & painting supplies, new toilet has come in at approx. \$1500.

The flooring, rounded out, \$3300.

An estimate for the fencing is \$800.

There's lots to do still, the costs would be a lot more if it weren't for all the free labour! Thank you to all who have contributed their time & effort.

If my calculations are accurate, we've spent \$11,500.

A \$65 donation will pay for one box of flooring, \$50 covers a gallon of paint. We're talking 52 boxes of flooring and 9 gallons of paint.

The income from the IPE concession and other fundraising projects is needed for operating costs, so we are asking for your help to cover the building projects.

We'll have two fundraising thermometers to track our progress. Please indicate whether your donation is for flooring and/or paint. Thanks
