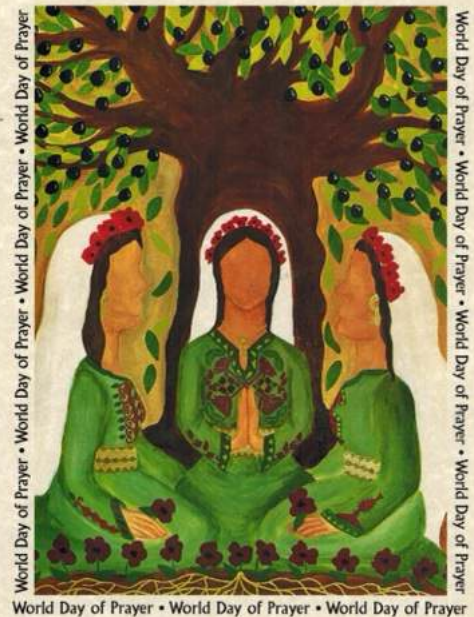

World Day of Prayer 2024

Hosted by St. Andrew's United Church this year on
March 8th at 2 pm

"I beg of You Bear with One Another in Love"

This is the Theme of the World Day of Prayer written by Christian women in Palestine. In the past services have mostly involved women. It is now seen as a service that speaks to all, for all people. All are welcome to the service, which this year is being held at St. Andrew's United church on March 8th at 2 pm. The service will be followed by a special lunch prepared by many hands including Palestinian cuisine. **You are invited.** All our local churches have been invited to participate, and includes a special guest speaker, Rev. Juanita Austin, who has lived and worked in Palestine.

Palestine, the geographical area, which is home to the state of Palestine, as well as modern Israel has witnessed the invasion of various powers throughout history. The land has had many, many names depending on the tribes that have settled at different times. Historic Palestine geographical area includes Bethlehem, Nazareth, the River Jordan, where Jesus was baptized, and eastern Jerusalem

The West Bank including East Jerusalem and the Gaza Strip were under Jordanian and Egyptian Administration from 1949 to June 1967. Tensions continued between Israel and its Palestinian neighbours with the land once more being divided and changed four times between 1946-2000.

The Gaza Strip, or simply Gaza, is located on the eastern coast of the Mediterranean Sea, bordering Egypt and Israel, and is the 3rd most densely populated area in the world with 49% of the population being

children. In October 2023 escalated military activity occurred and continues to occur in this area.

It is established that there are over 5 million Palestinians living today in Palestine and Israel with 2% being Christian and over 12 million Palestinians living around the world, including the United States, Canada, Brazil, Chile, and Honduras.

Some of the crucial things that keep people's spirits strong and vibrant are Art and Culture, including Poetry, visual art embroidery, folk dancing, theatre and cinema. Palestinians have tilled, sowed, planted and harvested both large and small plots of the land of "milk and honey" for centuries, with Palestinian women making up a majority of those doing agriculture. This includes numerous plants, oils, fruit, nuts, citrus. All are an important part of agriculture, medicinal purposes, healthy cooking. As well, a high value is placed on education, health care, though it lacks financial support and water with lack of rain.

The World Day of Prayer movement reached Palestine in 1950 brought by the wives of clergy of various denominations. They started to pray at the YWCA headquarters, in the Protestant Churches in Jerusalem, Ramallah, Nablus and the Bethlehem area. Collaboration continues with a variety of church-related organizations including the YMCA and Kairos. We look forward to sharing some of their story with you this year.
