# World Day of Prayer 2022

*Many options to join safely*



Given that many churches and communities will be unable to gather in person for World Day of Prayer 2022, please consider these **options**:

- 1) The 55 minute service video, produced by the Women's Inter-Church Council of Canada, can be watched at home, or via Zoom with others, or via local TV stations. As of February 1, 2022, the video can be downloaded from [wicc.org](https://wicc.org/get-involved/events/) for FREE. Community TV stations broadcasting this recording can be found at <https://wicc.org/get-involved/events/>. To buy a copy of the video, go to <https://wicc.org/wicc-store/> and order a DVD or USB stick.
- 2) During a Zoom or Facebook live meeting with others, participants can take turns reading the various speaking parts. For a print copy of the service, please download it from [wicc.org](https://wicc.org) (after first registering as a Service Coordinator). Add other resources from [wicc.org](https://wicc.org). This could include the music recordings and the devotional message.
- 3) Gather via Zoom to discuss the service after watching it individually.

*Your support is needed to provide World Day of Prayer services in Canada, and to fund our grant program which helps women and children affected by social injustice issues.*



## **ZION UNITED CHURCH OFFICE POSITION**

Zion United requires an Office Administrator for 10 hours per week. We feel the importance of this position is to facilitate effective communication and coordinate the functionality of the church office during this extended period when our pastoral charge is between ministers. The church council is recommending this position remain in place upon the arrival of our new minister.

Duties and responsibilities:

- Prepare and print bulletins for worship
- Prepare the power point presentation for worship
- Serve as the recording secretary for Zion council meetings
- Check telephone, email messages, and mail on a regular basis, and to forward information to those responsible to act on the mail or messages
- Liaison with the committees any information pertinent to their responsibilities
- Co-ordinate the weekly volunteer rosters { greeters, coffee hosts, scripture readers }
- Order/purchase office supplies and insure office equipment is maintained
- Work with volunteers as required to assist with the functioning of the church office
- Maintain updates on social media platforms { Facebook, Instagram, web site etc. }

- Contract { based on 10 hours weekly at \$ 20.00 an hour }




## Slow no Tempo Concert!
