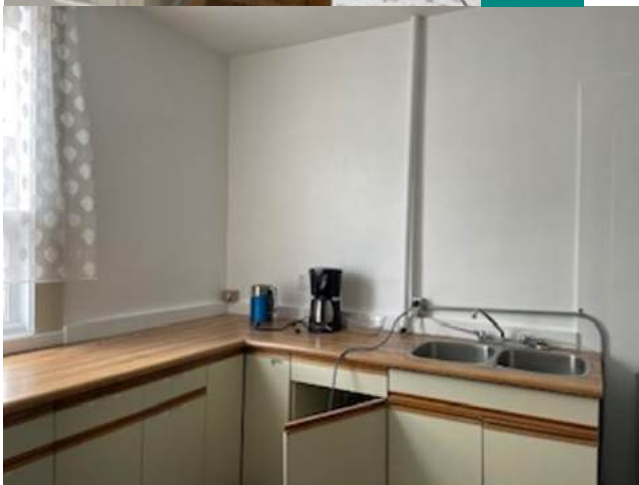

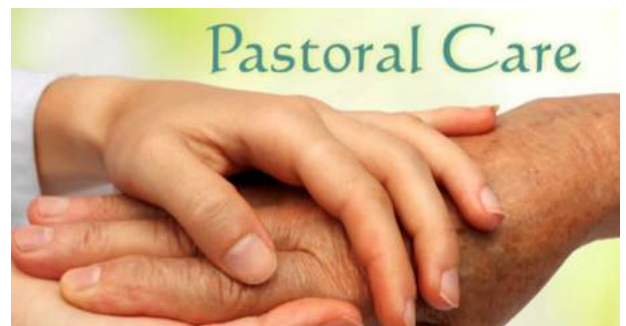

A Snapshot of the Zion Finance Committee

The work of the Finance Committee members may not be as visible as that of some other church groups, but it is important to the smooth functioning of the church to make sure that the following is done:

- The bills are paid
- The Sunday offerings and other money that comes in are deposited in the bank.
- The annual offering envelopes are ordered and distributed.
- Requests for set up or change to Pre Authorized Remittance (PAR) are sent to the United Church of Canada.
- The monthly payroll is submitted to the UC payroll processing group.
- The annual Charitable Donation Receipts are produced and distributed.
- Members of the Committee review the Financial Statements prior to each Council meeting and provide feedback and/or questions to be addressed.
- The Committee liaises with Zion's investment advisor at RBC Dominion Securities.
- The Committee aims to meet quarterly to review the financial picture and communicate it to the congregation.
- The Committee prepares the operating budget to be presented at the Annual Meeting.

The Committee currently consists of the Treasurer Leona Harrison, the Envelope Secretary aka Cash Depositor Diane Foshaug, along with Jim Skinner, Isobel Kay, Eleanor Kiefer, Marj Bailey and Pat Hudson.
