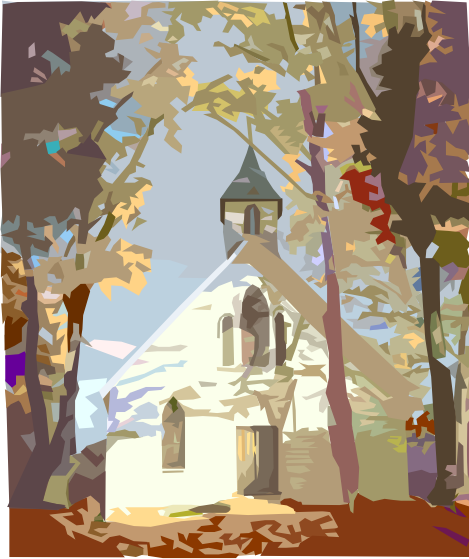
Askew's Cards

After a spirited discussion, **an alternative motion was proposed**, to form a committee to research a feasible and sustainable ministry plan for the future of St. Andrew's United Church. This plan would be presented to the congregation on **September 8th, 2024**, for review. On **September 15th, 2024**, the congregation will then decide on the feasibility of the plan. If this plan does not provide for the long-term future of the Church, then the motion to disband effective December. 31, 2024 would be upheld.
