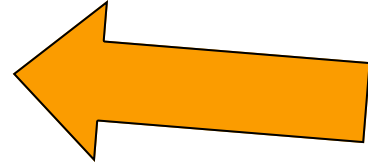
## Slow no Tempo Concert!
