50 Years Flies By!

James Alexander (Manson) is now a professor of classical piano music in Bern, Switzerland:)

No one laughed when he sat down to play

Twelve-year-old Jamie Manson may be the youngest fulltime United Church organist in Canada.

Zion United Church, Armstrong, B.C., reluctantly offered him the job last September—reluctant not because of his ability; no more accomplished organist was available, but because of his age. "What about his school work?" some of the music committee worried. "What about choir practice? What about weddings and funerals?"

They needn't have worried. Jamie hasn't missed a thing.

Under its former organist, Ron Heal, the congregation had been enjoying both formal anthems and modern selections, and had its best choir in years. Then Mr. Heal had a severe heart attack and had

to give up the responsibility. It was he who suggested Jamie as his replacement.

The boy, son of Zion's minister, the Rev. Alex Manson, had been playing the piano since he was big enough to reach the keys. He began lessons at five with his father, also an accomplished musician, and Mr. Heal. He not only excelled at the piano but, like any boy, found an interest in popular guitar and later in the trumpet and tenor saxophone in the school band, and naturally tried the church organ from time to time.

Now every Sunday Jamie arrives after Sunday school, kicks off his shoes and takes his place at the electric organ, fully prepared to give it all his talent and attention. He never misses the 6:30 choir practice, and is home in time for homework. The brides and their mothers love him. Mrs. W.J. Bradley, a part time organist, plays for most funerals. The choir has discovered it need not go back to simpler music. Bach and Handel or Simon and Garfunkel—their new organist can play almost anything on sight.

It is hoped that long before Jamie goes off to college, Mr. Heal will be back at the organ. Meanwhile, they say, Jamie and his dad make a great team.
