## We're with You: 20 Years of Nightstop & Mediation Service

across Wyre Forest & South Worcestershire



We're with You. Three simple words that capture the heart of everything Nightstop does — standing alongside local young people in crisis, offering safety, support and hope when they need it most.

This year, the charity celebrates 20 years of supporting young people in Wyre Forest and South Worcestershire, helping them find not just a roof over their heads, but also the stability

and confidence to rebuild their lives. Together with volunteer hosts, local businesses and supporters, Nightstop has helped thousands of young people find safety and a brighter future.

#### Who they are and what they do

Nightstop's mission is to prevent youth homelessness before it starts. The service provides emergency accommodation in the homes of trained volunteer hosts, giving young people aged

16–25 a safe place to stay. Volunteer hosts provide more than a bed: a warm meal, a listening ear and reassurance. Volunteers also support administrative roles, fundraising and participate in charity events and talks, making Nightstop's work possible.

Many young people experiencing homelessness are "hidden homeless", staying on friends' or relatives' sofas until luck runs out. For these young people, the risk of crisis is constant, making

stream more important than ever particularly given the current lack of affordable move-on housing. Nightstop also provides Mediation, helping young people aged 11-25 and their families rebuild relationships. Many referrals come from young people at risk of homelessness due to familv tensions. Additional services include Crisis Support for urgent situations and Educational Programmes in schools and colleges to raise awareness of youth homelessness and improve communication skills.

Nightstop's preventative work up-

#### Real stories, real change

Homelessness can happen to any young person sometimes because of who they are.

Eighteen-year-old Archie was asked to leave home because of his sexuality. He was anxious about shared accommodation and struggled with low self-esteem. Nightstop placed Archie with a supportive host family, helped him access employment and guided him toward independent accommodation. With support, he and his partner secured a safe home where they could keep their pet. Eighteen-year-old Rita left a home marked by parental addiction, domestic violence, and neglect. Struggling with anxiety, selective mutism and depression, she was supported by Nightstop, who arranged safe accommodation, advocated on her behalf and helped her manage daily needs. Rita has since returned to college and now volunteers as a Nightstop young ambassador. Each young person supported gains safety, confidence and the opportunity to build a brighter future.

#### Accessing Support

Young people in crisis can con-

tact Nightstop directly to access emergency accommodation, mediation or guidance. Referrals can also be accepted from schools, colleges or other organisations.

#### "We're with You" Campaign

To celebrate its 20th anniversary, Nightstop is launching their "We're with You" campaign, highlighting that no young person should face homelessness alone. The campaign also celebrates the compassion of hosts, volunteers, fundraisers, partners, and local businesses — and shows how the community can get involved. An accompanying video, printed, and online graphics are available to share the message.

## Get Involved, Fundraise or Donate

Individuals, businesses, clubs, groups, schools, and colleges can get involved in fundraising in so many ways from hosting bake sales, quizzes, taking on spon-sored challenges, or choosing Nightstop as their charity of the year, the team are on hand with ideas, resources and support. All donations go directly to supporting local young people in crisis and will make a huge difference and can be made online.

## Get Involved in Nightstop Events this Christmas

The charity has two fun ways to show support: their official Christmas Jumper Day is on Friday 5th December (or a date to suit you) and their Festive Afternoon Tea & Christmas Shopping is on Thursday 4th December from 2-4pm at St George's Church in Kidderminster. For 20 years, Wyre Forest & South Worcestershire Nightstop & Mediation Service has been a vital support for young people in crisis. With continued community involvement, the charity will remain a safe haven for years to come.

## All Steamed Up!

A Rally with a Difference at Severn Valley Railway



Steam fans are in for a real treat this autumn, as Severn Valley Railway prepares to host a steam rally with a difference at its Bridgnorth Station over the weekend of 1st and 2nd November.

This special event will see more than ten miniature, road-going steam engines gathering at the top of the line, offering visitors the chance to get up close to these beautifully crafted machines. Unlike the mighty locomotives that haul the Severn Valley's heritage trains, these mini marvels have all the power and charm of their full-sized counterparts — just in pocket-sized form! Visitors can expect to see an impressive variety of working models, including a Foden steam lorry, a Burrell steam roller, and a Fowler ploughing engine, all lovingly maintained by their owners. One of the highlights is the remarkable "Waterous" engine, a scale model of a Canadian machine once produced in large numbers in Ontario — a rare sight even for seasoned enthusiasts.

While the miniature engines puff away on display, the Severn Valley's full-sized locomotives will continue their regular passenger services along the 16-mile heritage line between Bridgnorth and Kidderminster. That means visitors can combine the best of both worlds — a nostalgic train ride through the autumn countryside and a wander among the miniature engines, each one a masterpiece of traditional engineering.

Organisers promise a relaxed, family-friendly atmosphere with plenty of photo opportunities and the chance to chat with the dedicated owners who keep

these tiny engines in working order. It's the perfect way to celebrate the magic of steam as the railway heads toward its festive season.

Once the rally wraps up, Severn Valley Railway will briefly pause regular services to make way for its much-loved Christmas programme, featuring the Elf Express from Bridgnorth and the Santa Steam Specials from Kidderminster events that bring joy to families year after year.

Whether you're a lifelong steam enthusiast or just looking for a unique day out, the Steam Rally at Bridgnorth Station promises a fascinating glimpse into Britain's enduring love affair with steam power — great fun for all ages and right on our doorstep.

# The History of Bonfire Night

# Remember, remember the Fifth of November...

As the evenings grow darker and the crisp autumn air begins to bite, there's something magical about wrapping up warm, gathering around a crackling bonfire, and watching the sky light up with bursts of colour. Every November, communities across Britain come together to celebrate Bonfire Night — but behind the fireworks and toffee apples lies a story of treason, politics, and survival that goes back more than 400 years.

The story begins in 1605, during the reign of King James I. A group of English Catholics, angered by their persecution and hoping to restore their faith to power, plotted to blow up the Houses of Parliament. Their aim was to kill the King and his government during the State Opening of Parliament and replace them with a Catholic monarchy. At the heart of this plot was Guy Fawkes, an experienced soldier who had fought in Catholic armies in Europe. Fawkes was given the dangerous task of guarding 36 barrels of gunpowder hidden in a cellar beneath the House of Lords — enough to destroy the entire building.

However, the plan began to unravel when one of the conspirators sent an anonymous letter

warning a friend not to attend Parliament that day. The authorities searched the cellars in the early hours of 5th November 1605, discovering Fawkes and his deadly cargo. He was arrested, tortured for information, and eventually executed, along with his fellow plotters.

The news of the King's narrow escape spread quickly, and Londoners lit bonfires in celebration. Parliament soon declared that the 5th of November should be observed as a day of thanksgiving, and so began what we now know as Bonfire Night or Guy Fawkes Night.

In the years that followed, the tradition grew. Effigies of Fawkes — or "Guys" — were burned on the fires, children collected pennies "for the Guy," and fireworks became a spectacular part of the celebrations, symbolising the gunpowder that never exploded.

Over time, the event has changed from a politically charged occasion into one of the most loved community celebrations of the year. Today, it's a chance for friends and families to come together, enjoy food and drink, and watch the night sky come alive with fireworks.

Whether you're heading to a big organised display or lighting sparklers in the back garden, Bonfire Night remains a tradition that connects us to centuries of British history — a fiery reminder of a plot that failed, and a celebration that has stood the test of time.





# Japanese Knotweed: A Growing Threat to Redditch Gardens

Across Worcestershire there has been a worrying rise in sightings of Japanese knotweed, with more than 700 reported infestations across the county. This invasive plant is now considered one of the most destructive in the UK, and experts warn that Redditch could be facing an increasing risk if local homeowners and landowners don't stay alert.

Japanese knotweed, a fastgrowing plant native to East Asia, spreads through underground rhizomes that can extend deep and wide beneath the soil. Even the smallest fragment can regrow into a new plant, making it extremely difficult to eradicate once established. Its roots can push through concrete, damage walls, and compromise building foundations, making it a serious concern for property owners. The financial impact can also be

significant. Properties affected

by knotweed often face a drop in value, and mortgage lenders may refuse loans until professional treatment has been carried out. Across Worcestershire, this has already caused headaches for homeowners trying to sell or renovate their homes.

In the Wyre Forest, residents are being encouraged to check gardens, verges, and nearby open spaces for signs of the plant. During spring and summer, knotweed appears as tall, bamboo-like shoots with reddish stems and broad green leaves arranged in a zig-zag pattern. In late summer, clusters of small white flowers may appear.

If you suspect Japanese knotweed on your property, avoid cutting or digging it out yourself, as this can cause it to spread further. Instead, contact a professional removal service or seek advice from the local council. Early detection and proper treatment are key to preventing a small problem from becoming a large and costly one.

By staying vigilant, Wyre Forest residents can help protect their gardens and green spaces from this persistent invader.

# Local Lowdown Quirky Tales & Local Lore

The Bewdley Bear According to local lore, a travelling show once lost its performing bear near Bewdley in the late 18th century. Search parties combed the forests and riverbanks, but the creature was never found. Over the centuries, sightings have persisted huge pawprints in the mud. livestock vanishing overnight, and eerie roars echoing through the Wyre Forest. Even today, some walkers claim to hear heavy footsteps and low growls among the trees at dusk proof, perhaps, that the legendary Bewdley Bear still prowls its woodland home.



The Stourport River Lights Along the banks of the River Severn at Stourport, old fishermen once spoke in hushed tones of strange floating lights that drifted silently across the water. Some believed they were the restless souls of those who'd drowned in the treacherous current, while others swore they marked the hiding place of lost treasure buried deep beneath the riverbed. Generations later, a few locals still whisper that, on still November nights, the lights return pale, wavering, and eerily beautiful, gliding just above the misty surface before fading into darkness.

Kidderminster's proud weaving past hides a haunting legend known as "the cry of the weaver." As the story goes, those passing the town's oldest mill buildings after dark sometimes hear the rhythmic whirr of looms and the soft sigh of a weary worker toiling through the night. Some say it's the echo of generations who spent their lives at the looms: others dismiss it as nothing more than imagination and wind through broken windows. # Wyre Forest Talking Newspaper Celebrates 45 years

The Wyre Forest Talking Newspaper, (WFTN) held their Annual General Meeting on Saturday 4th October this year, and following the main meeting, guests enjoyed a celebration buffet, to mark the charity's 45th birthday.

The meeting was well attended by more than 50 guests including Mayors of Stourport and Bewdley, local councillors and WFTN volunteers old and new. Mike Dickins and Mary Blake, who both volunteered with WFTN from the beginning, also attended and helped to cut celebration cakes.

WFTN was originally set up in 1980 by the Kidderminster and District Lions, who had raised funds to help support visually impaired people. The original plan was to make a perfumed garden. However, Bob Roberts, who was himself blind, encouraged them to instead, set up a Talking Newspaper, and here we are, now into our 46th year.

WFTN provides a weekly reading of local newspapers for blind and partially sighted people in the Wyre Forest area of North Worcestershire. It's a free service run entirely by volunteers and is available to anyone who has difficulty reading or holding a newspaper. It's distributed to listeners on memory sticks that play on the equipment, provided free of charge by WFTN. We also produce a magazine recording, three times a year, with articles from various local and national magazines, and a seasonal Christmas


The studio is located at the St Barnabas Community Hall in Franche. We have three teams of volunteers, namely Early Birds, Night Owls and Puffins, who take it in turns to come into the studio each Friday evening. Duties are split between reading and preparing the memory sticks to go out to our listeners.

Reading takes place in the studio with the editor and technician on the other side of a glass window. Each reader has a board, prepared by our editor, to include articles from The Shuttle and other newspapers. There's a half-timebreak for coffee, biscuits and a natter. Once the week's recording is transferred onto memory sticks and put in padded envelopes to be posted to our listeners, the job's done for that week

We're always looking for new volunteers and listeners. There are various volunteer roles available, such as reading the news, admin, editing, technician and liaising with listeners. We welcome volunteers from all backgrounds, ages, cultures, experiences, skills and interests.

Our volunteers are a friendly bunch of people, from all walks of life, and being part of WFTN not only helps our listeners, it's a great way of meeting new friends. If you

think this might be for vou, or know of someone who would like to become a listener, more details about the charity and how to become involved, are on our website. www.wftn.org WFTN is a registered charity, and whilst the service is completely free to listeners, we are self-funded. Costs include premises rental, replacement and maintenance of equipment, and sundry expenses.



## Mark Garnier Member of Parliament for Wyre Forest

The party conference season has drawn to a close. Despite the appearance of this being just about politicians talking to themselves, what is coming out from these conferences tells us about what is facing us all.

The Conservative conference has highlighted the priorities of my party –security and prosperity. Securing our borders and driving economic growth.

However, more importantly, these conferences shed greater light on the differences between our parties.

We know, for example, that Labour favours a bigger state, with greater taxes levied on the private sector to pay for the state sector and, importantly welfare. Fighting for the underdog has been the key objective of Labour for over a century, and to be fair, they have achieved a great deal for workers. But now they are keen to continue to allow the welfare bill to expand, and the cost of that will come from increased taxation. We'll know exactly how much we'll be charged on the 26th November, when we have the next budget.

Meanwhile, Reform have confirmed that, whilst socially to the right wing, economically, they are to the left. They favour nationalisation of utilities, raiding private pensions to match fund nationalisation costs.

And that leaves just the Conservative Party on the right of centre economically. This is important, because Wyre For-

est has around 3,500 business here, many of which are small and micro businesses. 25

These businesses already know what a Labour budget looks like, with hikes to employers' national insurance. This has severely damaged business confidence and knocked economic growth. So, whilst Conservatives see businesses as the engines of economic growth, employment and prosperity, Labour sees them as a cash cow for their state-owned ambitions.

Of course, this is all pretty irrelevant as there will unlikely be an election before 2028 at the earliest. So, we have up to 4 years of slowing investment, international money fleeing our shores, and increased unemployment.

I may be wrong. The policies of big state may produce economic growth, and I will be forced to eat my words. But the legacy of the last 110 years is that every single Labour government there has ever been, has resulted in higher unemployment and economic decline. Every single one.



## History: Did You Know? **Kidderminster's Domesday Past**

Did you know that Kidderminster was officially recorded in the Domesday Book of 1086? Back then, the town appeared under the names Chedeminstre or Chideminstre, and it was already a thriving and important settlement. At the time, it was held by Bishop Odo of Bayeux, halfbrother to William the Conqueror and one of the most powerful Norman lords in England.

The Domesday entry paints a vivid picture of early medieval life in the area, describing villagers. smallholders, slaves, and even a working mill, which would have served the surrounding farmland. It suggests that Kidderminster was already a busy agricultural hub long before its later fame as a centre for carpet weaving and textile production.

The town's position beside the River Stour was key to its suc-

cess. The river provided water for farming and milling, and would later play a vital role in the town's industrial development. Over the centuries. Kidderminster grew from a rural manor into a bustling market town and then a proud manufacturing centre known

around the world for quality carpets. So next time you stroll through the town centre, it's fascinating to imagine that people were living, working. and trading on this same land nearly a thousand years ago.



## **November Garden: Preparing for** Winter and Planning Ahead

November might seem like a quiet time in the garden, but it is one of the most important months for preparation. The leaves have fallen, the air feels crisp, and while growth slows down, there is plenty to do to protect your garden and set it up for success next year.

Start by giving your garden a good tidy. Clear away fallen leaves from lawns and paths, and add them to a compost heap or leaf bin to create rich leaf mould for next year. It is also a great time to cut back any dead or dying perennials and remove old annuals. Leaving a few seed heads in place can provide food and shelter for birds and insects during the colder months, so do not feel the need to be too neat. If you have a lawn, give it one last light mow on a dry day and rake out any moss or debris. Avoid walking on frosty grass, as this can damage the blades and leave brown patches.



Autumn leaves are gold for the compost bin, so make use of them. Mixing them with grass clippings and kitchen waste helps create a perfect balance for decomposition. Turn the pile occasionally to keep it aerated. November is also the time to think about bulbs. Plant daffodils, crocuses, and tulips now for a burst of spring colour when winter finally fades. If you prefer pots, layer different bulbs in the same container - taller ones like tulips at the bottom, then daffodils, with crocuses or snowdrops near the top — for a long lasting display.

Tender plants will need protection as temperatures drop. Move pots to sheltered spots, cover delicate shrubs with horticultural fleece, and insulate containers with bubble wrap to prevent roots from freezing. Check greenhouse heaters and make sure everything is well ventilated to avoid damp and mould. Birds are your garden's winter companions, so keep feeders topped up and provide fresh water. A mix of seeds, suet, and mealworms will attract a variety of visitors and help wildlife through the lean months.

Finally, take a moment to look ahead. November is perfect for planning changes to your garden layout, browsing seed catalogues, and dreaming about next spring's colours. A little planning now will make your spring work much easier and more reward35

Even though the pace of gardening slows, there is still plenty of satisfaction to be found outdoors. Wrap up warm, enjoy the peace of your late autumn garden, and know that every small task vou do now will help vour garden thrive once the growing season returns.







## **Spiced Apple & Cranberry Crumble**



#### **Ingrediants**

- 5 medium cooking apples, peeled, cored, and sliced
- 100g fresh or dried cranberries
- 75g soft brown sugar
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- ½ tsp ground nutmeg
- Zest of 1 orange

#### For the crumble topping:

- 150g plain flour
- •100g cold butter, diced
- 75g demerara sugar
- 50g rolled oats

#### Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 190°C (170°C fan) or Gas Mark 5.
- 2. Place the sliced apples and cranberries in a large bowl, then mix with the brown sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, and orange zest.

Tip the mixture into an ovenproof baking dish.

- 3. To make the topping, rub the butter into the flour using your fingertips until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in the demerara sugar and oats.
- 4. Sprinkle the crumble topping evenly over the fruit, making sure it's well covered.
- 5. Bake for 30–35 minutes, until the fruit is bubbling and the topping is golden and crisp.

#### Serving suggestion:

This crumble is best served hot with custard, cream, or a scoop of vanilla ice cream. The cranberries add a lovely burst of colour and tangy flavour, making it a perfect dessert for November – and a great recipe to carry through into the festive season. There's something truly special

about the aroma of spiced apples drifting through the kitchen on a dark evening. This pudding is a real crowd-pleaser, easy to prepare in advance, and the perfect way to bring a little extra warmth to the table this winter.

# November Motoring Getting Winter-Ready


