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May 1

Fruit That Remains

John 15:16 Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you.”

Jesus reveals a powerful truth—our lives are designed to produce fruit that lasts. Just as residual income continues to flow after the work is done, there is a Kingdom principle of “fruit that remains.” When we obey God—through serving, witnessing, giving, or sharing the Gospel—those acts continue working long after the moment has passed. Every seed we sow in faith carries the potential for a future harvest. Sometimes we may not see immediate results, but God is always at work behind the scenes.

Your obedience today is never wasted. A word spoken, a message shared, or a life lived for Christ can reach someone at just the right time—even years later. God causes what you release in faith to return with increase. Jesus said that bearing much fruit glorifies the Father.

As we remain connected to Him, our lives will produce fruit that endures—changed lives, restored hearts, and souls brought into the Kingdom. This is fruit that remains. Be encouraged—what you are doing for God is still working, even when you cannot see it.

Prayer Focus: Father, thank You for allowing our obedience to carry impact beyond what we can see. Help us remain faithful in sharing You, trusting that You are bringing increase in Your perfect timing. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

Verse of the Day: John 15:8 Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples.

Living the Word Today: Stay connected to God and keep sowing. What you release today will continue working, producing fruit that remains—even into eternity.

May 2

Due Season

Gal 6:9 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.

There are seasons in life where it feels like you are giving your best and seeing very little in return. You are praying, serving, showing up, and doing what you know is right, yet the results seem delayed. It can be discouraging when your effort does not immediately match your expectation. But God never forgets what you sow. Due season means there is a set time for your harvest, and it is not random or forgotten. It is already scheduled by God. The challenge is staying faithful while you wait.

Heb 10:36 For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise.

The promise is not just about what you do, but also about how you endure. Your consistency matters. Your obedience matters. Even when no one else sees it, God is keeping record of every seed planted in faith. God also reassures us that the timing of our harvest is intentional.

Ecc 3:1 To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven.

Your due season is not late, and it is not early. It is right on time according to His plan. Keep going, keep trusting, and keep sowing. The harvest will come, and when it does, it will be worth every moment you chose not to give up.

Prayer Focus: Lord, help me to stay faithful in the waiting and not grow weary in doing what is right. Strengthen my heart to trust Your timing and believe that my due season is coming.

Verse of the Day: Rom 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

Living the Word Today: Your harvest is already on the way. Stay consistent because God always honors faithfulness.

May 3

Seeing Through the Lense of Truth

John 7:24 Judge not according to the appearance but judge righteous judgment.

We all see life through our own experiences, emotions, and assumptions. What we have been through can shape how we interpret people, situations, and even intentions. Sometimes we respond to others based on what we think we see instead of what is actually true. That can lead to misunderstandings, hurt feelings, and missed opportunities to show love. God calls us to look deeper and not just react to the surface. The truth is, our natural view can be limited, but God's perspective is clear and full of wisdom.

Pro 3:5 Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.

When we rely only on what we feel or assume, we can easily get it wrong. But when we allow God to guide our thoughts, He helps us respond with grace instead of judgment. Seeing through the lens of truth means choosing to pause, pray, and seek understanding before reacting. The Bible also reminds us that love should lead the way in how we treat people.

1 Cor 13:4 Charity suffereth long and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up.

When we let truth and love shape our view, we begin to treat others with patience and compassion, even when we do not fully understand them. We start to see people the way God sees them, not just through our own limited lens. That shift can change relationships, heal wounds, and reflect Christ in a powerful way.

Prayer Focus: Lord, help me to see others through Your truth and not just my own understanding. Teach me to respond with love, patience, and wisdom in every situation.

Verse of the Day: 1 Sam 16:7 For the Lord seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart.

Living the Word Today: How you see people will shape how you treat them. Ask God to help you see clearly so you can love correctly.

May 4

Don't Harden Your Heart

Rom 9:17 For the scripture saith unto Pharaoh, Even for this same purpose have I raised thee up, that I might shew my power in thee, and that my name might be declared throughout all the earth.

Some moments in Scripture can feel difficult to understand, and one of them is when it says the Lord hardened someone's heart. It can seem confusing at first, but when you look closer, you begin to see a deeper truth. God is never unjust, and He does not create evil in a person. Often, a hardened heart is the result of repeated resistance to God. When someone continually rejects truth, God will allow their heart to become firm in that decision and even use it to accomplish His greater purpose.

Exo 7:13 And he hardened Pharaoh's heart, that he hearkened not unto them; as the Lord had said.

Pharaoh had multiple opportunities to respond to God, yet he chose pride and control instead of surrender. Over time, his heart became set in that direction. God used even Pharaoh's resistance to reveal His power and deliver His people. This reminds us that nothing is wasted in God's hands, not even opposition. When we stay open, humble, and willing to obey, we position ourselves to experience His grace and not just His power on display.

Heb 3:8 Harden not your hearts, as in the provocation, in the day of temptation in the wilderness.

Prayer Focus: Lord, keep my heart soft and responsive to Your voice in every season. Help me to choose obedience and humility so I stay aligned with Your will.

Verse of the Day: Psa 51:10 Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.

Living the Word Today: God is always speaking, leading, and correcting out of love. The question is how we respond. A soft heart keeps us close to Him, while a hardened heart creates distance.

May 5

A Forgiving Spirit

Eph 4:32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

Forgiveness is not always easy, especially when the hurt feels deep and personal. Letting go does mean denying the offense, rather, it's releasing weight of the offense. We must trust God to handle what we cannot fix. When we hold on to hurt, it quietly affects our peace, our thoughts, and even how we treat others. God invites us into something better, something freeing. Jesus made forgiveness a clear part of how we are to live. Let that offense and hurt go. Release the anger and bitterness.

Matt 6:14 For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you.

God takes the condition of our hearts seriously. Forgiveness is not about the other person deserving it. It is about us staying aligned with God and walking in His grace. When we forgive, we choose obedience and healing at the same time.

Col 3:13 Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye.

There is also strength that comes from walking in forgiveness. Recalling God's forgiveness changes your perspective. It softens your heart and helps you extend that same grace to others. A forgiving spirit does not mean you forget everything, but it means you refuse to let the offense control you. It is a decision that keeps your heart free.

Prayer Focus: Father, help me to release every offense and walk in a spirit of forgiveness. Teach me to forgive the way You have forgiven me, with grace and sincerity.

Verse of the Day: Dan 9:9 To the Lord our God belong mercies and forgivenesses, though we have rebelled against him.

Living the Word Today: Forgiveness is about your freedom. Let it go so your heart can stay right and pure before God. Forgive quickly.

May 6

Children of God Are World Overcomers

1 John 4:4 Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world.

Every day we are faced with choices that reveal who we belong to. It is easy to blend in, follow what feels normal, and go along with what everyone else is doing. But being a child of God means something deeper than just saying the right things. Being a child of God shows up in how you live, how you think, and how you respond when no one is watching. There is a difference between being influenced by the world and being led by God, and that difference matters. The Bible makes it clear that we cannot fully belong to both.

1 John 2:15 Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

This does not mean we withdraw from people or everyday life, but it does mean our values, priorities, and desires should reflect God's heart. Being a child of God is about choosing His way even when it is not the popular choice. It is about allowing His truth to guide your decisions instead of worldly pressures or ungodly opinions of others. God has given us a clear identity and a standard to live by. When you belong to Him, there is a transformation that takes place from the inside out. You begin to think differently, act differently, and see life differently.

Eph 4:22-23 That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts; And be renewed in the spirit of your mind.

Prayer Focus: Father help me to live in a way that reflects that I belong to You. Strengthen me to choose Your truth over the influence of the world every day.

Verse of the Day: **2 Cor 6:17** Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing and I will receive you.

Living the Word Today: Who you belong to will shape how you live. Let your choices reflect your identity as a child of God.

May 7

God Is Sovereign

Psa 103:19 The Lord hath prepared his throne in the heavens; and his kingdom ruleth over all.

Deep peace comes from knowing God is sovereign. It means He is in control, not just in the big moments, but in the details we do not always understand. Life can feel uncertain at times, and situations can shift without warning, but none of it catches God by surprise. He sees the full picture when we only see a small part. When you remember that He rules over all, it helps settle your heart even when things do not make sense.

Isa 46:10 Declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure.

We don't have to try to figure everything out on our own. God invites us to trust His authority instead of leaning on our limited understanding. God is not reacting, He is already aware of the outcome. Even when things feel delayed or unclear, His plan is still moving forward. You may not always understand the path, but you can trust the One who is leading it. God's sovereignty also reminds us that nothing is wasted in His hands. You can make plans, set goals, and move forward, but ultimately it is God's purpose that prevails. That is not something to fear, it is something to rest in.

Pro 19:21 There are many devices in a man's heart; nevertheless the counsel of the Lord, that shall stand.

Prayer Focus: Lord, help me to trust You fully, even when I do not understand what is happening around me. Remind me that You are in control and that Your plan for my life is good.

Verse of the Day: Rom 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

Living the Word Today: God's sovereignty means you do not have to carry the cares or the weight. Trust Him to lead, guide, and work things out in His perfect timing.

May 8

Drive Out the Enemy – Not the Person

Eph 6:12 For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

Taking things personally when someone hurts you, speaks against you, or treats you unfairly is common. The natural reaction is to see them as the enemy and respond out of frustration or pain. But God calls us to see deeper than what is happening on the surface. People are not the real enemy. There is often something spiritual influencing the situation, and if we only fight the person, we miss the real battle. Learning to separate the person from the attack helps you respond with wisdom instead of emotion.

Matt 5:44 But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you.

That kind of response does not come from ignoring the hurt, but from understanding that God is working on a deeper level. Choosing love, prayer, and restraint, is not being weak. You are choosing to fight the right battle in the right way. God has given us authority to deal with what is behind the attack.

Jas 4:7 Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

We are not powerless. When we stay submitted to God and stand firm in His truth, we can resist the enemy without tearing down the person. We can correct, set boundaries, and still keep our heart right.

Prayer Focus: Lord, help me to see clearly and not mistake people for the real enemy. Teach me to respond with love.

Verse of the Day: John 10:10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

Living the Word Today: Stay grounded in God so you can respond to attacks in a way that brings peace and not more damage.

May 9

Be Not Easily Offended

Psa 119:165 Great peace have they which love thy law: and nothing shall offend them.

Making someone feel offended does not take much these days. A word, a look, or even a misunderstanding can quickly turn into frustration or distance. But God calls us to something higher. When your heart is rooted in Him, you are not easily shaken by every little thing. Being easily offended can steal your peace and strain your relationships but learning to let things go keeps your heart steady and your spirit free. The truth is, not everything deserves a reaction. Sometimes it is wisdom to pause, pray, and choose peace instead of responding out of emotion. Love is not easily provoked.

1 Corinthians 13:5 Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil;

When you respond gently instead of reacting quickly, you shift the atmosphere. You are not ignoring what happened, but you are choosing to handle it in a way that reflects God's character instead of your feelings in the moment.

Pro 14:29 ASV He that is slow to anger is of great understanding: But he that is hasty of spirit exalteth folly.

When you grow in patience and understanding, you stop taking everything personally. You begin to see people through grace instead of assumption. That does not mean you never address issues, but it does mean you are not controlled by them. A steady heart brings peace not only to you, but also to those around you.

Prayer Focus: Lord, help me to guard my heart and not be easily offended by small things. Teach me to respond with patience, wisdom, and love in every situation.

Verse of the Day: Pro 19:11 The discretion of a man deferreth his anger; and it is his glory to pass over a transgression.

Living the Word Today: We do not have to react to everything that comes our way. Choose peace and let God shape your response.

May 10

A Mother's Faith: The Hidden Prayers That Shape Generations

Pro 31:28 Her children arise up, and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praiseth her.

A mother's quiet strength in faith often goes unseen. It shows up in whispered prayers late at night, in moments of worry turned into trust, and in the steady decision to believe God for her children no matter what. Many of those prayers are never heard by anyone else, but they are never ignored by God. A mother's faith creates a covering, a foundation, and a legacy that reaches far beyond what she can see in the moment.

2 Tim 1:5 When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also.

Faith can be passed down through generations by words, example and consistency. What a mother believes, prays, and lives out daily has the power to shape the hearts and futures of her children. Even when it feels like nothing is changing, those seeds are taking root.

Jas 5:16 The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

God honors the heart that seeks Him on behalf of others. That includes every mother who prays in faith, even through tears and uncertainty. Her prayers are working, even when she cannot see immediate results. They are building something eternal. They reach into places she cannot physically go. Over time, those hidden prayers become visible fruit, shaping lives, strengthening families, and impacting generations to come.

Prayer Focus: Father, thank You for the power of faith and the privilege of covering my family in prayer. Strengthen me to trust You even when I cannot see the results right away.

Verse of the Day: Pro 22:6 Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.

Living the Word Today: Your prayers are not wasted, even when they feel unseen. Stay faithful, because what you are building in the spirit will show up in time.

May 11

Contentment in Every Season

Phil 4:11 Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content.

Contentment is something we all have to learn. It does not come naturally, especially when we see others doing well or when we feel like we should be further along. It is easy to focus on what is missing instead of appreciating what God has already provided. But contentment is not about settling. It is about trusting that God knows exactly what you need in this season and choosing to live well right where you are.

Phil 4:12 I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.

The Apostle Paul understood this in a real way. He experienced both lack and abundance, yet he found stability in God. That kind of mindset does not depend on circumstances. Contentment comes from a deep trust in God's provision. When you know He is faithful, you can rest even when things are not perfect.

1Tim 6:6 But godliness with contentment is great gain.

God also reminds us that contentment protects our hearts from chasing the wrong things. When you combine a relationship with God and a grateful heart, you gain something far more valuable than temporary success. You gain peace. You gain stability. You gain a life that is not constantly pulled by comparison or pressure. Living well with what God provides means you are not waiting to enjoy life later. You are choosing to see His goodness right now.

Prayer Focus: Father, help me to be content in every season and to trust Your provision for my life. Teach me to appreciate what You have given me and to rest in Your faithfulness.

Verse of the Day: Heb 13:5 Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee.

Living the Word Today: Contentment is not about having everything you want. It is about trusting God enough to be at peace with what you have.

May 12

Building a God First Home

Jos 24:15 But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.

Building a God first home starts with a decision. It is not about having everything perfect or knowing every scripture by heart. It is about choosing to make God a priority in your everyday life. That can look like praying together, speaking truth over your family, and making space for God in simple moments. Your home does not need to be complicated to be spiritual. It just needs to be intentional.

Deut 6:6-7 And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.

Leading your family spiritually begins with living what you believe. Children and loved ones learn more from what they see than from what they hear. Faith, therefore, should be a daily practice—not something reserved for special occasions. When your family consistently sees your walk match your words, it builds a strong and lasting foundation.

Psa 127:1 Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it.

Create an atmosphere where God is welcome. That can be through worship, encouragement, and keeping peace in your home. When God is at the center, everything else has a place to grow properly. You do not have to do everything at once. Start small, stay consistent, and trust that God is working through your efforts to shape your home into a place where His presence is felt.

Prayer Focus: Lord, help me to lead my home in a way that honors You and reflects Your truth. Give me wisdom and consistency as I build a foundation rooted in You.

Verse of the Day: Pro 22:6 Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.

Living the Word Today: A God first home is built through daily choices, not just big moments. Stay consistent, because what you do each day is shaping your family's future.

May 13

Healing Family Wounds with Grace and Truth

Eph 4:32 Be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

Family wounds can run deep because they involve people we love and trust. Words said in anger, misunderstandings, and unresolved issues can leave lasting marks on the heart. It can be hard to move forward when the pain feels personal and close. But God offers a way to heal that does not ignore the hurt while also not allowing it to define the future. Healing begins when we invite His grace into places we have been trying to manage on our own.

Pro 19:11 The discretion of a man deferreth his anger; and it is his glory to pass over a transgression.

Grace helps us release what we are holding, but truth helps us deal with what is real. There are times when letting go brings peace, and there are times when honest conversations are needed for restoration. Both require forgiveness, humility and a willingness to listen. Healing does not mean pretending nothing happened. It means allowing God to guide the process so that relationships can be restored in a healthy way. Forgiveness and love are vital to healing and restoration.

1 Pet 4:8 And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.

God also reminds us that love has the power to cover and restore. That kind of love is not based on perfection. It is rooted in a decision to care, forgive, and move forward with wisdom. When grace and truth work together, they create space for healing that is real and lasting. It may take time, but God is able to mend what feels broken and bring peace back into your family.

Prayer Focus: Father, help me to extend grace while also walking in truth as I seek healing in my family. Give me the wisdom to respond with love and the strength to forgive where it is needed.

Verse of the Day: Mat 5:9 Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called the children of God.

Living the Word Today: Healing takes both love, forgiveness, grace and truth working together. Trust God to guide you through the process.

May 14

What We Should Really Pass Down to Our Children

Pro 13:22 A good man leaveth an inheritance to his children's children: and the wealth of the sinner is laid up for the just.

When we think about what we want to leave behind for our children, it is easy to focus on money, property, or material things. Those things can be helpful, but they are not the most valuable gifts we can give. True legacy is built through what we model, what we teach, and how we live. Our children are watching how we handle challenges, how we treat people, and how we walk with God. What we pass down spiritually and emotionally will last far longer than anything material.

Deut 6:5-7 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.

When faith becomes part of everyday life, it builds a foundation that will guide them long after they leave home. God also shows us that a strong legacy includes integrity, wisdom, and a relationship with Him. That means the way you live today is shaping the blessings your children will experience tomorrow. Luxury may come and go, but a legacy rooted in God will continue to produce fruit for generations. When you choose to invest in their spiritual growth, you are giving them something that cannot be taken away.

Pro 20:7 The just man walketh in his integrity his children are blessed after him.

Prayer Focus: Lord, help me to focus on building a legacy that honors You and impacts future generations. Teach me to live in a way that leaves behind faith, wisdom, and integrity.

Verse of the Day: Psa 37:25 I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread.

Living the Word Today: What you pass down matters more than what you pass on. Choose to invest in what will last beyond this life.

May 15

Faith-Filled Decision Making

Pro 3:5 Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.

Every day we are faced with decisions that shape our lives, both big and small. It is easy to rely on what makes sense in the moment or what feels comfortable, but faith filled decision making calls us to something deeper. It requires us to trust God even when the outcome is not clear. When you choose to put Him first in your decisions, you invite His wisdom into places where your own understanding may fall short.

2 Cor 5:7 For we walk by faith, not by sight.

Faith does not mean ignoring reality, but it does mean trusting God above what you can see. That kind of walk requires surrender. You may not always have all the answers, but you can be confident that God does. When you seek Him through prayer and His Word, He gives direction and clarity in ways that go beyond logic alone.

Pro 3:6 In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.

We do not have to figure everything out by yourself. You can pause, pray, and trust that He will lead you step by step. Faith filled decisions may not always feel easy, but they will always align you with God's purpose. Over time, you will see that His way leads to peace, growth, and lasting results.

Prayer Focus: Father, help me to trust You in every decision I make and not rely on my own understanding. Guide my steps and give me clarity as I seek Your will.

Verse of the Day: Jas 1:5 If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him.

Living the Word Today: Faith filled decisions require trust even when the path is unclear. Stay connected to God and He will lead you in the right direction.

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May 16

Keep Watch Over Your Mouth

Psa 141:3 Set a watch, O Lord, before my mouth; keep the door of my lips.

Words are powerful. They can build someone up or tear them down in a matter of seconds. It is easy to speak out of emotion, especially when you feel hurt, frustrated, or misunderstood. But God calls us to be intentional with what we say. Keeping watch over your mouth means slowing down long enough to let wisdom guide your response instead of reacting in the moment.

Pro 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.

That means what you say does not just disappear after it is spoken. It produces something. Your words can bring peace, healing, and encouragement, or they can create tension and damage. Choosing your words carefully is not about being silent, it is about being purposeful.

Eph 4:29 Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers.

When we allow our words to be guided by grace, we create space for growth and connection. We may not get it right every time, but as we stay mindful and seek God's help, our words will begin to line up with His truth more consistently.

Prayer Focus: Father, help me to guard my mouth and speak words that honor You. Teach me to respond with wisdom, grace, and self-control in every situation.

Verse of the Day: Pro 13:3 He that keepeth his mouth keepeth his life but he that openeth wide his lips shall have destruction.

Living the Word Today: Our words carry more power than we realize. When we choose to speak life, what we say brings growth and not harm.

May 17

Being Present for Our Loved Ones in a Busy World

1 Cor 16:14 Let all your things be done with charity.

Life can get full very quickly. Between work, responsibilities, and everything pulling for our attention, it is easy to be physically present but mentally somewhere else. The people we love can end up getting what is left instead of our best. Being present is more than just being in the room. It is giving your attention, your care, and your time in a way that lets others know they matter. Those small moments of connection often mean more than we realize.

1 John 3:18 My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in truth.

God calls us to love in a way that is active and intentional. That means love is not just something we say, it is something we show. Listening without rushing, putting distractions aside, and making time for meaningful conversation are simple ways to live this out. These choices build trust and strengthen relationships over time.

Ecc 3:1 To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven.

There is also wisdom in slowing down and valuing the moments we have. Time is a gift, and once it passes, we cannot get it back. Being present allows you to fully experience the season you are in and invest in the people God has placed in your life. May 18

Prov 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.

Life can feel heavy and uncertain sometimes, like hope is slipping away and the situation is not changing fast enough. In those moments, what you say matters more than you may realize. Your words can either agree with the fear or align with God's promises. Speaking life does not mean denying reality. It means choosing to declare what God says even when your feelings are trying to say something else.

2 Cor 4:13 We having the same spirit of faith, according as it is written, I believed, and therefore have I spoken we also believe, and therefore speak.

Faith is not just something you hold inside. It shows up in what you say. When you begin to speak life, you are reminding your heart and your mind that God is still in control and still able to move. There is power in agreeing with God's truth over your situation.

Mark 11:23 For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith.

Your words are not empty when they are rooted in faith. They carry authority when they line up with God's promises. Even when hope feels far away, keep speaking life. God is able to bring light into the darkest situations.

Prayer Focus: Father, help me to speak life even when my situation feels difficult and uncertain. Strengthen my faith so that my words align with Your truth and not my fears.

Verse of the Day: Psa 34:18 The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart; and saveth such as be of a contrite spirit.

Living the Word Today: Our words have the power to shape our perspective and strengthen our faith. Keep speaking life and trust that God is working even when you cannot see it.

May 19

Healing While Staying Connected: Boundaries That Honor God

Pro 4:23 Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life.

Healing does not always require walking away from people; at times, it means learning how to remain connected in a healthier, God-honoring way. When relationships have been strained or hurtful, we must guard our hearts while still allowing God to work through love, grace, and restoration. Boundaries are not about shutting people out, but about walking in wisdom and peace. Healthy boundaries create space for healing, growth, and peace, so that relationships are not continually rooted in pain, but are given the opportunity to be restored in Christ.

Eph 4:26 Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath.

Our feelings are valid, but how we handle them matters. Setting boundaries can look like limiting certain conversations, taking time to process before responding, or choosing when and how we engage. It is not about being distant or cold. It is about being intentional so that our actions reflect both truth and love.

Rom 12:18 If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men.

The Bible teaches us to remain rooted in love and peace as we heal. That shows us that we are responsible for our part, not the entire outcome. We can set healthy boundaries and still carry a forgiving spirit. We can protect our heart and still pray for those who have hurt us. Verse of the Day: 1 Cor 16:14 Let all your things be done with charity.

May 20

Inviting God into Your Relationships: More than Just Praying Together

Psa 127:1 Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it.

Inviting God into our relationships goes beyond saying a prayer together from time to time. It is about allowing Him to shape how we communicate, how we respond, and how we love each other daily. A relationship that includes God is not perfect, but it is guided. It means choosing patience over pride, grace over offense, and truth over assumptions. May 21

The Importance of Christian Community and Connection

Heb 10:25 Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching.

God never intended for us to walk this journey alone. We all need people who can encourage us, pray with us, and remind us of truth when life feels heavy. Christian community is more than just gathering on a Sunday. It is about building real connections with people who are growing in their faith and willing to walk alongside you. Those relationships help strengthen you in ways that you cannot always do on your own. We need church.

Mat 18:20 For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.

There is a special strength that comes from being connected to other believers. There is encouragement, accountability, and support that flows through those connections. It is easier to stay focused, stay encouraged, and stay grounded when you have people around you who are also seeking God

Gal 6:2 Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ.

When we are connected, we have people to lean on and people who can lean on us. That kind of connection builds unity and reflects God's love in a powerful way.

May 22

Moving from Appreciation to Transformation

1 Thes 5:18 In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.

Gratitude is more than saying thank you when something good happens. It is a way of seeing life through the lens of God's faithfulness. When you begin to practice real gratitude, it shifts how you think, how you respond, and how you live. Instead of focusing on what is missing, you begin to recognize what God has already done. That change in perspective can bring peace even in the middle of challenges.

Heb 13:15 By him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to his name.

Sometimes gratitude is easy, but other times it requires a choice. It may not feel natural to give thanks during difficult seasons, but that is where transformation begins. When we choose gratitude in every situation, we are building a heart that stays connected to God no matter what comes our way.

Psa 100:4 Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name.

Gratitude leads to a deeper awareness of God's presence in our life. Thankfulness draws us closer to Him and keeps our heart open to His work. Over time, gratitude moves from being something we say to something we live. It shapes our attitude, decisions, and outlook on life in a lasting way.

May 23

Psa 77:11 I will remember the works of the Lord: surely I will remember thy wonders of old.

The Bible often points us back to remembrance as a spiritual practice. When we recall past testimonies, whether our own or someone else's, it stirs hope. Secret Prayer Is Rewarded Openly

Mat 6:6 But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly.

A certain type of bravery does not get attention or applause. It lives in the quiet moments, in the sacrifices that no one else sees. Military families understand this in a deep way. While one serves on the front lines, others are holding things together at home. They carry responsibility, worry, and long seasons of waiting. Their strength is not always visible, but it is real and it matters. God sees every unseen sacrifice and every secret prayer.

1 Cor 4:2 Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful.

Faithfulness is not about being noticed. It is about being consistent in the role God has given you. Military families show us what it looks like to keep going, to keep loving, and to keep believing even when life is uncertain. That same kind of faithfulness is something God honors, whether it happens in a home, in a deployment, or in everyday life.

Heb 6:10 For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have shewed toward his name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister.

Verse of the Day: Gal 6:9 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.

Living the Word Today Stay faithful because God hears and honors prayers.

May 25

Remember and Live

Deuteronomy 4:9 Only take heed to thyself, and keep thy soul diligently, lest thou forget the things which thine eyes have seen, and lest they depart from thy heart all the days of thy life: but teach them thy sons, and thy sons' sons;

Remembering in the Kingdom is not just about looking back—it is about allowing what we remember to shape how we live today. God never intended for His people to simply recall His works as history. He calls us to carry His faithfulness forward, to live in a way that reflects His goodness and honors what He has done in our lives. When we truly remember, it influences our choices, priorities, and perspectives.

Especially felt at special occasions and holidays, sometimes we can sit at the dinner table and notice someone or something is missing. The laughter is quieter. The conversations feel different. The seat that once held someone you love now sits empty, and the weight of that absence can be hard to put into words. Grief has a way of showing up in ordinary moments, reminding us of what used to be. Yet even in that silence, God is present. He meets us right there, in the space where love still lingers.

Pro 20:7 The just man walketh in his integrity: his children are blessed after him.

The empty seat is not just a reminder of loss, but also of legacy. The people who are no longer physically present have left something behind in us. Their love, their prayers, and their example continue to live on. What they poured into our life does not disappear. It becomes something we carry forward in how we live, love, and lead others.

2 Cor 1:3-4 Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort; Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble,

God brings comfort in a way that reaches deeper than what we can explain. He understands our grief and walks with us through it. The silence at the table does not mean we are alone. God fills those spaces with His presence, His peace, and His gentle reminder that love never truly leaves.

May 27

All Things Are Become New

2 Cor 5:17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

Sometimes what feels normal is not what God intended. Patterns can be passed down through families and communities until they feel familiar, even when they bring hurt or limitation. It can be easy to follow what you have always seen, but God calls you to something higher. Choosing a new path in Christ means recognizing what needs to change and having the courage to walk differently, even if it feels unfamiliar at first.

Rom 12:2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

God gives us the power to break cycles that once seemed unchangeable. Transformation starts on the inside. As our thinking changes, our decisions begin to shift. What once felt normal no longer fits, and you begin to choose what aligns with God's truth instead of what you have always known.

Jer 29:11 For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the Lord, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end.

Rom 12:18 If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men.

Family conflict has a way of pulling us into a place where being right feels very important. We want to be understood, we want our points to be heard, and sometimes we just want acknowledgment that we were not wrong. But holding tightly to being right can cost you peace. God calls us to something higher than winning arguments. He calls us to protect unity, guard our hearts, and choose peace even when it is not easy.

Pro 15:1 A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger.

The truth is, not every situation requires us to prove our point. When emotions are high, choosing a gentle response can shift the entire atmosphere. It does not mean you are ignoring truth. It means you are handling it with wisdom. Letting go of the need to control every outcome allows God to work in ways that you cannot force on your own.

Heb 12:14 Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord.

God also reminds us that peace is something we actively pursue. That means peace is not passive. It is a choice you make, even when it requires humility. Love is not always about doing things your way. Sometimes it shows up in the willingness to step into someone else's space and honor how they do things, even when it feels unfamiliar. When you visit family or travel to be with others, you may notice different routines, traditions, and preferences. It can be tempting to correct, suggest changes, or compare. But love often looks like choosing humility and respect over personal comfort. It means recognizing that not everything needs to be adjusted to fit you.

Phil 2:4 Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others.

God calls us to be mindful of how we treat others in shared spaces. That means being considerate of what matters to them. It might be how they prepare meals, how they organize their home, or how they carry out traditions that are meaningful to them. Honoring those things shows care and maturity. It communicates that you value the person more than your preferences.

1 Cor 10:32 Give none offence, neither to the Jews, nor to the Gentiles, nor to the church of God.

There is a grace that comes with learning to adapt in love. That does not mean you lose who you are, but it does mean you are thoughtful in how you show up. Choosing peace and respect in these moments strengthens relationships and creates a welcoming environment. Love is not always loud. May 30

Finding Joy in Unexpected Places

Neh 8:10 The joy of the Lord is your strength.

Joy is often in quiet moments, small victories, or even in the middle of situations that feel difficult. We often think joy comes from everything going right, but God shows us that joy can exist even when life feels uncertain. It is not based on perfect circumstances. It is rooted in His presence and His faithfulness.

Rom 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

God has a way of revealing His goodness in places we might overlook. That means even challenging moments can hold purpose and hidden blessings. When you begin to look for God in every situation, you start to notice joy in places you once ignored. A kind word, a moment of peace, or a reminder of His love can shift your entire outlook.

Phil 4:4 Rejoice in the Lord always: and again I say, Rejoice.

May 31

Living to Live Again

John 11:25 Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live.

Life with Christ is not just about the here and now. Life with Christ is about something greater that continues beyond what we can see. There is a hope that anchors us, reminding us that this life is not the end of the story. When you are living for God, your choices, your faith, and your obedience carry eternal value. You are not just living for today. You are living with eternity in mind, knowing that what you do now matters later.

Phil 1:21 For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.

Sometimes life brings loss, disappointment, or moments that feel like endings. But God has a way of bringing life out of places that seem final. This kind of perspective shifts everything. It reminds us that even when things change or seasons come to a close, God is still at work. He is preparing something beyond what we can fully understand. Living for Him gives purpose to every season, even the hard ones.
