## Pastor Paul Dunham So What's Next?

What a celebration of 200 years it has been for our bicentennial!! As we took a great look back at where we also are looking forward. What's next for our church?

This is especially an interesting question, because we have so many areas of the church that are in a time of transition. I think we have gotten new people- or are getting new people- in these roles: Pastor, children's ministry director, finance chair, discipleship chair, lay leader, music director, youth director, and probably some more that I've missed because "new pastor" is on that list.

A few things come to mind when looking at all this newness. First, we are united behind our mission: Our Mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly. We are all about loving Jesus and sharing the love of Jesus in all we do. Everything we are building towards aligns with that.


# Small Group Ministry Update Meeting - November 5th at 6:45 pm in the Crossing

In February 1736, John Wesley departed from England and sailed to America, ultimately arriving in Savannah, Georgia. His unwavering faith in God and his outspoken criticism of various leaders of the time led to significant ridicule and an arrest warrant. Afterward, he left Savannah and headed north to Perrysburg, South Carolina. Unfortunately, his reputation preceded him, resulting in curses from locals, disorientation in the South Carolina wilderness, and even physical abuse, all because the leaders were resistant to the truth he preached. In December 1737, John returned to England, but his efforts were not in vain; Methodism began to flourish in America.

Last month, I mentioned that we would be assigning finance personnel to reach out to leaders of various mission groups to assess their needs for 2026. This process has now begun, and during this time, the known recurring costs will be recorded in our QuickBooks program. Our aim is to prepare a complete budget for 2026, ready for approval by mid-November.

Please remember that once the budget is finalized and approved, a copy will be accessible in the office. Additionally, there will be a monthly report detailing Sharon's expenditures in relation to the budgeted amounts. Members of the leadership board will also receive updates on the monthly balance sheet.

As always, I extend my heartfelt thanks to the members of Sharon Church for your support in helping us fulfill God's intentions for our community.

#### **Giving Thanks for All Things**

It's easy to list the blessings in life: good health, family, a satisfying career, a comfortable home. We might even be thankful for things others take for granted such as freedom and clean drinking water, reliable transportation and food enough to eat. Then there are the little things, such as gardens, sunrises, pets and coffee.

But what about life's storms or unanswered prayers? Should we be thankful for these? Loss and hardship remind us of our dependence on God. He uses trials to draw us closer to him, to show us that He is our rock and refuge. In misfortune and grief, we discover God's comfort and strength. Should we not, then, be thankful for the storms, too?





#### A Day to Honor Our Veterans

On November 11, 1918, the Germans and the Allied Nations, which included the United States, signed a document to initiate an armistice (cessation of hostilities), thus ending World War I. A year later, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation designating November 11 as Armistice Day. It was to be a day of reflection — a day to remember those who died in the country's service and to offer Americans the opportunity "to show sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nation."

Wanting to recognize more specifically America's veterans, Congress passed a bill changing the name of the day from Armistice Day to Veterans Day. The change was made in May 1954.

On this national holiday, churches around the nation hold services of prayers and praise. Followers of the Prince of Peace pray for peace among the nations of Earth and for the day when "they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more" (Isaiah 2:4, NRSV).
