This month marks the anniversary of John Wesley's departure from England in 1735 as he set sail for America, ultimately arriving in Savannah, Georgia, in February 1736. Due to his firm belief in God and his outspoken criticism of several leaders of the time, he faced considerable ridicule and even an arrest warrant for his efforts. After leaving Savannah, he journeyed to Perrysburg, South Carolina. Unfortunately, his reputation preceded him; he was met with curses in the streets, became lost in the South Carolina wilderness, and faced physical abuse, as local leaders resisted the truth he represented. In December 1737, he returned to England, yet his efforts in America bore fruit as Methodism continued to flourish.

Last month, I mentioned that we would be assigning finance personnel to reach out to leaders of various mission groups to assess their needs for 2026. This process is underway, and during this time, known recurring expenses will be entered into our QuickBooks program, allowing us to prepare a comprehensive budget for 2026 by mid-November or early December for approval.

Please remember that once the budget is finalized and approved, a copy will be available in the office. Additionally, a monthly report detailing Sharon's expenditures in relation to the budgeted amounts will be provided. Members of the leadership board will also receive the monthly balance sheet information.

As always, I extend my heartfelt thanks to the members of Sharon Church for your contributions in helping us fulfill the vision that God has for Sharon.


