Vaccination Policy

The team at Arapahoe Park Pediatrics cares deeply about the health and wellbeing of its patients and feel strongly that children and adolescents should be vaccinated on schedule with currently available vaccines. We are still following the vaccine schedule recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP).

We strongly believe vaccinations are safe and effective in preventing serious disease, possible life-long disabilities and even death. We encourage our families to discuss any questions or concerns they may have about vaccines.

Infants' immune systems are still developing, which makes them vulnerable to dangerous conditions. Vaccination ramps up their immune system to recognize and fight off any potential infections and diseases.

Infant vaccinations are staggered to "start up" their immune systems over the first year.

Vaccines are safe and have been around for a long time. They have been proven effective by an abundance of scientific research and evidence by thousands of physicians and scientists before they are licensed for use.

We firmly believe, based on all available literature, evidence and current studies, vaccines do not cause autism.

We firmly believe vaccinating children and young adults is one of the most important health promotion interventions performed by healthcare providers.

Vaccination protects our patients, staff and community from vaccine-preventable diseases.

A trusting and open relationship between provider and parent is very important to us at APP. We value our family's values and opinions and believe in building a foundation of trust on important medical agreements, including vaccination.
