2025 Fair Association Ticket Information & Rules

Ticket Prices and Classifications

- Season/Exhibitor Pass \$40 This entitles each holder access to the grounds throughout the fair
 and entitles the holder to exhibit in open class. Advanced Season/Exhibitor passes will be sold at all
 Schnucks stores, and the Purdue Extension Vanderburgh County office. Beginning July 19, season
 passes will be available at the fair office and gates. Discounted season passes will be available in
 advance at the Vanderburgh County Extension Office June 1-30th for \$35.
- *Single Admission* \$10 (Children 9 and under are free). Available at gate only. Single admission tickets are \$10 each.
- *Exhibitor Only Pass* \$20. This entitles each holder to exhibit in the Home and Family Arts, Farm Products and Floriculture departments up to 5 entries or fewer and 1 single entry to the fair. Exhibitors entering more than 5 entries will still be required to obtain a season pass. This pass does not apply for exhibitors in open class livestock shows and will only be available Sunday, July 20th during the open class entry time in the auditorium.
- Association Membership All members must fill out an application on or before October 30th of each fiscal year, this form can be found online at www.vanderburghcountyfair.com
- Members are entitled to voting privileges for Fair business.

General Rules

- NO REFUNDS will be given for admission.
- NO REFUNDS for Seasonal/Exhibitor passes.
- UTV's, Side by Sides and golf carts are not allowed on grounds without being registered in the fair office.
- Dogs and/or other animals are not allowed on the fair grounds unless they are a service dog or animals in a show or contest.
- No illegal drugs, firearms, or alcoholic beverages are allowed on the fairgrounds. All vehicles, packages, parcels, diaper bags, purses, backpacks, etc. and persons are subject to search.
- No public display of advertisement materials such as business logos, company names or product displays, etc. may be on the fairgrounds without prior permission by the Fair Executive Committee and/or Fair Association.
- The Association will carefully preserve all articles while on exhibition but will not be responsible for any losses or accidents that may occur.
- Straw or shavings must be furnished by the exhibitor.
- Judges shall not award prizes to unworthy exhibits, whether there is competition or not; nor shall they award premiums on articles incorrectly entered or incorrectly named.
- In any emergency, the matter will be left to the discretion for the Fair Board.
- · All season/exhibitor passes must have the exhibitor's name printed on the pass to exhibit in Open Class.



Pre-registration is required. Entry forms, including the Venmo/PayPal link, are available at www. vanderburghcountyfair.com or P.O. Box Address. Entry deadline: Friday, July 11, 2025. Entry fee: \$10 per person, per act, with a maximum of \$100 for groups of 10 or more. Please review all rules and regulations carefully, as non-compliance may lead to disqualification. Check-In begins 1 hour prior to the contest. Please be checked in no later than 30 minutes before the start time.

The Fair Talent Contest is not a 4-H event; 4-H participation is not required. Contestants must be Indiana residents. Non-Vanderburgh Co residents may enter the group competition if the majority of the group is from Vanderburgh Co. Solo acts must be from Vanderburgh Co.

DIVISIONS

Junior – Ages 12 and under. Solo & Group. If a participant turns 13 at any time in 2025, they must compete in the Senior Division.

Senior - Ages 13-21. Solo & Group.

Exhibition – For those ineligible due to age, residency, or other reasons, or for those who wish to not be judged. Exhibition acts are not eligible for prizes or advancement to state competition to represent Vanderburgh Co.

Contestants may compete in one solo and/or one group act. Group acts must compete in the division based on the majority age. No one over 14 allowed in the Junior Division.

CATEGORIES

Categories will be divided by solo male, solo female, or group (2+ performers, male or female).

A) VOCAL – Vocal performance with instrumental accompaniment (must remain purely supportive). Background vocals on CD should be minimal. No props allowed.

B) INSTRUMENTAL – Instrumental performance without vocal utterance. Accompaniment is allowed but must be purely supportive. No same-type instruments for accompaniment.

C) DANCE – Dance performance (ballet, pointe, tap, jazz, lyrical, modern, hip-hop, step). Dancerelated acrobatic/tumbling skills allowed (2 per solo, 4 per group). Props must be part of the costume (e.g., hat, cane, umbrella).

D) CLOGGING – Clogging performance (freestyle, artistic, traditional, hoedown, precision).
 Tumbling is not allowed. Props must be part of the costume.

E) TUMBLING/RHYTHMIC GYMNASTICS – Floor routines with more than two acrobatic/ tumbling skills. Must provide own mats & runners. Props/scenery allowed. No spotters.
F) NOVELTY – For acts that don't fit other categories, such as skits, impersonations, lip sync,

comedy, magic, recitations, mime, juggling, unicycling, hula hooping, reenactments, jump rope, or theatrical performances. Props allowed.

*If fewer than three acts are entered in a category, they may be combined with another category. For concerns about stage space limitations, please contact a chairperson to discuss possible alternate options.

RULES

- Time Limits: Setup: Two-minute limit for setting up props, instruments, mats, etc. Teardown: One-minute limit for clearing the stage.
 Performance: Solo acts: 2 minutes / Group acts: 2.5 minutes / Bands: 5 minutes
 Timing: An official timer begins when the music starts (if used), or at the first movement or vocal utterance. Exceeding the limit incurs a 10-point deduction, with disgualification at 30 seconds.
- Prohibited Items & Acts: No cheerleading, baton twirling, or acts using batons, machetes, or sharp instruments. Fire, dry ice, fog, straw, or confetti are not allowed on stage.
- Props, Costumes, & Equipment: Props are hand-carried items, not part of the costume (e.g., hats, canes, and similar accessories are part of the costume). Contestants are responsible for their costumes and special properties. Microphones and a piano will be provided.
- 4. Accompaniment: If used, contestants must provide their own accompanist (live or recorded).
- 5. Sound & Music: A sound system and operator will be provided for all acts that require it. Instrumentalists may bring their own amplifier. All music must either be on a CD (one song, good quality, scratch-free) and/or an Apple or Android device. The sound operator will provide a 1/8-inch plug (3.5mm audio cable) to connect the headphone jack on devices. Contestants must provide a person to operate the device, and the device may need to be removed from its case. CDs will be collected at registration and retrieved following the awards. Label CDs with contestants' names. Music errors may result in a 10-point deduction. All acts must use the provided lighting system.
- Liability: Contestants are responsible for their costumes, props, and equipment. The fair is not liable for lost, stolen, or damaged items.
- 7. Judging & Concerns: Awards will be given to all participants, with prizes for the top three in

each combined category. Judges' decisions are final. Written complaints may be submitted to Vanderburgh County Fair Assoc., P.O. Box 58, Inglefield, IN 47618, by July 30, 2025. Verbal complaints will result in disqualification and ineligibility for the following year.

- State Fair Representation: Vanderburgh Co. may send one act per category in both Junior and Senior Divisions to the Indiana State Fair Talent Contest, with a second-place winner also eligible at the discretion of the co-chairs.
- 9. Multiple Wins: A performer winning in both solo and group acts may be sanctioned for both. Contestants must inform us if they are already sanctioned in another county to avoid multiple sanctions. If a winner elects not to participate, they must notify a chairperson by noon on Sunday, July 27, 2025. The next eligible act may be contacted to represent Vanderburgh Co.
- Fair Grounds Entry: Contestants and parents are responsible for Fair Grounds entry fees. *The Talent Contest Chairpersons will interpret the rules, and their decisions are final.

- Contestants chosen as Queen and First Runner Up must be at least 18 years of age and cannot have reached their 22rd birthday on or before June 1, 2026. Younger contestants and other members of the Queens Court must be 16 years of age by July 21, 2025.
- Contestants and moms/chaperones are required to attend a "Contestant Meeting" on July 2, 2025 at 6 pm, in the Conference Room at the 4-H Center. Individual contestant photos will be taken at this meeting, please come prepared to have a head shot taken.
- 3. The Entry fee for the pageant is \$20.00, to be paid at the "Contestant Meeting"
- 4. Contestants must be an Indiana resident, a U.S. citizen, and represent their home county (county of legal residency). One of the contestant's parents or legal guardians must also be an Indiana resident. The only exception: the contestant may reside in an adjoining county if the majority of their activities are in the county in which they entered the contest.
- 5. Contestants cannot have a child or be knowingly pregnant at the time of the county fair queen pageant or the State Fair Queen Program. If the 2025 queen becomes or is pregnant anytime during her reign she will be required to relinquish her title.
- 6. Each contestant must be an active member of at least one worthwhile organization in her community, such as church groups, Girl Scouts, 4-H, etc.
- Any contestant who has competed in a State Fair Queen Program cannot compete again and cannot compete for the title of Miss Vanderburgh County.
- 8. The contestants will be judged on the basis of poise, personality, and the ability to converse. At the county level, the judging is divided into five divisions: speech, interview, professional wear, evening gown and on stage word response. Points and score sheets are for judges' assessment only. Final selection is the judges decision.
- 9. The requirements for each division include:

Speech – Prepare and present a speech no longer than one minute, on the topic of their choice. Speeches will be scored on natural speaking ability, deliver, pose and originality. Each speech will be timed, with one point deducted for speech going over one minute. Speeches with be delivered before he judges at the preliminary judging.

Attire: Denim (jeans/skirt/capris -contestants choice) and Queen T-shirt that is provided to each contestant

Interview – Each contestant will have one (1), three minute interview with each of the three judges

individually. Therefore, each contestant will give three separate interviews (9 collective minutes total), answering impromptu questions asked by each judge. Interviews are private and not open to the public.

Attire: Suit, Pant Suit, Jumpsuit or Dress

Professional Wear – same attire as Interview

Formal Wear – at lease one portion of the hemline must be floor length (touching the floor or top of the contestant's foot). A gown with the skirt split above the knee (more than 2" above the kneecap), a low-cut bodice and/or cut/design inappropriate for the county pageant may be discounted by the judges. Formal wear worn during Preliminary Judging must also be worn during the Competition finals/evening competition.

On Stage Word: Contestants will give one impromptu on-stage response, to be scored by the judges.

- The Vanderburgh County Pageant will be held on Monday, July 21, 2025. Preliminary judging will occur during the day at Blue Grass Church, 14200 Petersburgh Rd, Evansville, IN 47725. The public pageant and crowning will be in the 4-H Center Auditorium, following the official fair opening.
- Contestants are required to attend a practice for the public pageant, on Sunday, July 20, in the 4-H Center Auditorium at 6:00 pm.
- 12. Miss Vanderburgh County, Court and Miss Congeniality must be prepared to spend July 21-26 at the fair, attending daily events, additional information will be shared during a meeting on Tuesday morning of the fair.
- 13. All contestants are expected to participate in community service, which includes assisting with the Senior Day Lunch on the Tuesday of the fair, and working a shift in Kids Corner, on the Saturday of the fair.
- 14. The 2025 Queen will compete January 2-4, 2026 at the Indiana State Fair Queen Program competition. Additional information will be provided to the winner.
- 15. The Pageant Committee reserves the right to adjust the pageant rules according to the number of entries for this 2025 year.


