Thank you for allowing me to preach at our mission church, The Vine in Mount Pleasant. Pastor Tim Williams and his wife Heather have done an outstanding job reaching people in their community for Christ. They now average over 50 people each Sunday and had 23 children on Easter! They have baptized many new believers and currently have 12 people in their New Members class. God is doing extraordinary things at The Vine because of your generosity and prayers. Please continue to pray for Tim and The Vine.

On another note, this week we will continue our series, "That You May Believe." We will begin chapter 5. With that in mind, I want to show you a textual variant found in some translations. If you are a King James (KJV) reader, you'll notice that verses 3b-4 are in the KJV, but not in modern versions. KJV reads: John 5: 3 In these lay a great multitude of impotent folk, of blind, halt, withered, waiting for the moving of the water. 4 For an angel went down at a certain season into the pool, and troubled the water: whosoever then first after the troubling of the water stepped in was made whole of whatsoever disease he had. Most other translations don't have the words that are underlined above. Other versions read: John 5: 3 In these lay a multitude of invalids—blind, lame, and paralyzed. 5 One man was there who had been an invalid for thirty-eight years.

Where did verse 3b and 4 go? The earliest "original autographs" of Scripture no longer exist in their original form. Biblical inerrancy, which means the Bible is free from error, is tied to the idea of the original autographs being inspired and accurate. Since we no longer have the original autographs, textual criticism comes into the picture. It is the process of examining ancient manuscripts to determine the most accurate text of a work. The earliest manuscripts for the Gospel of John do not have verses 3b-4. The 47 scholars who began translating the KJV in 1604 used the Textus Receptus of the Greek New Testament to translate into English. Unfortunately, the Textus Receptus is not the earliest manuscript of the New Testament. The earliest known manuscripts of the New Testament, like Codex Sinaiticus and Codex Vaticanus, date back to the 4th century and do not include verses 3b-4. Most modern Bible translations omit or footnote John 5:3b-4 because these verses are not found in the earliest and most reliable Greek manuscripts of the Gospel of John. Scholars believe they were likely a later addition meant to explain the local belief about the pool of Bethesda.

Okay, since we're here, what do we make of the angel that is mentioned in verse 5? Most scholars believe that the pool was fed by an underground spring. Under certain conditions, this spring would force air and water into the pool that would cause it to look as if it was being stirred. Ancient traditions and superstitions began to circulate that it was an angel stirring the pool and the first person into the pool while this was occurring would be healed of whatever their ailment might be. As we'll discover from our text, God is the only One who can heal, not an angel. With this in mind, I won't spend much time addressing this on Sunday.
