ALVA INC met

Concerns shared for planned Packinghouse Road Party Venue

New members and attenders of a revitalizing ALVA INC met Tuesday February 8th to discuss the plans for election of the

new board, and increasing membership further.

Secretary Connie Dennis, reading from the minutes of the last meeting, said that Alva INC's purpose is to allow only 'controlled growth' in the Alva Development Plan area of Lee County. Former long-time president of the group, Ruby Daniels, lived out 'Keep Alva Rural' throughout her life, as the slogan for the group. A challenge in any time of growth, but with over 1,000 new residents settling in Lee County every month, vigilance over development of homes and businesses will be more difficult than ever.


Roxanne Gause, chair of the Volunteer Committee, spoke of the plans her team is working on to attract new members and present nominees for the board by the March meeting. Elections are scheduled in May, but could possibly be held earlier.

A very informative presentation by Veronica Martin of the TDM Engineering Company for the owner of the former Woodman's Lodge building on Packinghouse Road, south of the Alva Diner, received many good questions, some of which

were



answered here, and others were noted to be answered when she returns at a later meeting with more information.

The owner has so far planned a wedding and party venue on the former property using the existing building, several small structures built in 2021 before approvals were obtained which are now being sought, and at least one larger building planned for future construction.

A new bit of information shared at this meeting is that the current owner apparently has the property up for sale, even though he is pursuing a zoning change; perhaps to make the property more attractive to a new buyer.

Steve Brodkin of the **Concerned Citizens of Bayshore** (North Fort Myers east and the North Olga area) presented information on Mike Greenwell's proposed 400,000 sq ft retail development along SR 31 south of North River Road, along with 131 homes on that same land. Mr. Greenwell's engineers will be meeting with the North Olga and Alva INC resident groups sometime in 2022.

Finally, some shared concern that the southern end of the 2020 planned state expressway which would have created a continuous four lane divided limited access highway from the Orlando area south as far as Immokalee or farther through Central Florida might be reconsidered for construction. The project was cancelled south of Orlando by the state assembly so the money could be used, we were told, for covid-19 relief.

The next meeting of Alva INC will be held the second Tuesday evening of March, the 8th. Meetings are planned for the second Tuesday of each month regularly.

All are welcome, and any Alva area (Hendry County line to the Hickey Creek Mitigation Park, east to west along the) resident may join as a voting member of Alva INC, while residents outside of Alva may join but without voting privileges.



Lee County school district facing fine for overcrowded classrooms

(TY WINK NEWS-Feb 11)

The Lee County school district is facing a nearly \$3 million fine if it doesn't find a way to reduce class sizes.

At one point, almost two dozen schools had more students per teacher than



what is legally allowed. Collier County schools comply with the class size requirements. One charter school did not and faces a fine of \$8,000. Charlotte County schools said they are in compliance with class sizes.

The class limits are:

For pre-K through third grade, 18 students, Fourth through eighth grade, 22 students, High school, 25 students. The biggest challenge to accommodate these class sizes, according to the school district, is a teacher shortage.

The Lee County school district plans to hire more qualified teachers and have existing teachers work through their planning period, with proper compensation, to reduce class sizes. They also plan to appeal the fine.

In 18 schools, the class sizes are legally unacceptable according to state law.

Rachel Ballard's daughter goes to one of those schools and sits in a crowded classroom at Three Oaks Elementary. She is in kindergarten with 22 other students in the classroom. "I know that the more it grows, the less time that teacher has, you know, because even though she is in a gen-ed class, my daughter is autistic, and she has ESE needs," Ballard said. "That teacher, you know, she has to focus on everybody and make sure that, you know, everybody gets help, and sometimes that's hard, especially when you're one person, and you have such a big classroom."

Lee County schools blame the big class sizes on the teacher shortage and Lee County's surging population.

The district welcomed more than 1,600 new students from Oct. 2020 to Oct. 2021, but not nearly enough teachers to make up for the growth. The district is short about 100 teachers. "We can't get the teachers so what we're having to do is just keep putting kids into classrooms," said Kelly Letcher, director of business services at the school district. "We are just busting at the seams."

So, the district is aiming to hire more teachers. Stephanie Canada is a former teacher. "Whenever you have that many students, you're dealing with those issues just even more so you being able to contact parents and things like that you know you only have so much time in a day," said Canada. Letcher said the school district wants to have a qualified teacher in the classroom, "not just a body in the classroom."

Lee County schools have until Oct. 2022 to get those class sizes down to the legal limits or face the \$2.7 million fine. Ballard is worried if nothing changes, her child will pay the price. "I want to make sure that my daughter gets the proper learning and the proper timing she needs with her teachers because if not, she's just going to fall behind, and it's not going to be good," Ballard said.

The school board voted, and now a compliance plan is in place to send the state. That means 18 schools in Lee County need to drop their class sizes to comply with Florida law and avoid that \$2.7M fine.

"Seeing those individual class sizes go from 20 to 25 to now 30 to 36," said Canada. That means there are 10 to 15 more kids in a single classroom than there were before.

But, prior to COVID-19, even class sizes, according to Canada, were large. "I was teaching a core class. I was under the impression that the state law says 25 students, and I was having upward of 36 in some of my classes," she said.

Canada says many teachers did and clearly still are experiencing what she did. "There is no teacher that doesn't have a class that's less than that. It means you don't have enough teachers," Canada said.



Over 200 River Hall Resident's meet at Alva Community Center to decide how to fight high density zoning change by owner of their development

On Wednesday evening, February 24th, over 200 concerned owners of homes in the River Hall Communities on the south side of Rte 80 just east of Olga.

Paul Asfour, presenting organizer at this meeting, shared that the purpose of the meeting was to plan how to legally and respectfully keep the owner of the resident's development, River Hall, from receiving a green light on increasing the current zoning of a large portion of River Hall. This re-zoning would allow more single-family homes in much smaller space. In 2012 GreenPointe received permission to increase the original 1999 homes on its 2,000 acres to 2,695. The residents fought the 2012 increase and lost, and now are opposed to another increase of 489 units, which would bring the total homes to 3,184.

Mr. Asfour began the meeting by sharing a history of the development of River Hall from construction start in 2005. However, he focused on the ongoing efforts by the GreenPointe to increase the approved

number of units from the time the first construction was authorized by Lee County until today.



Lennar Homes (Bayshore Ranch) has revised and resubmitted their application to the county, on the advice from county staff. Instead of applying for a land use change they want to leave the land use as rural land use, but they propose a text amendment to the Lee Plan that would allow more than 1 dwelling unit per acre in the rural land use category.

Lennar originally applied for a land use change from rural and wetlands to sub-outlying suburban and wetlands. That would allow for up to 204 d/u (dwelling units), but they were only asking for 130 d/u. Without any Lee Plan changes they would be allowed up to 101 d/u. Without the land use change, but with the text amendment that they currently propose, they apparently would be allowed 122 d/u on the 109 acres. The rationalization is that they would preserve a certain amount of flow-ways, wetlands, and open space (see PDF pages 11 and 12 of the attachment). However, they are already required to preserve flow-ways and wetlands. A certain amount of open space is currently required for planned developments.

Question: What is the gain for the developer in this change? More to come...

Lee Commissioners award contract for Civic Center assessment



Fort Myers, FL, Feb. 15, 2022 – The Lee Board of County Commissioners voted Tuesday to award a contract for a comprehensive structural and architectural assessment of buildings at the Lee Civic Center.

Weston and Sampson Engineers, Inc. will complete the assessment that includes the engineering systems and overall condition of the site and buildings.

The Lee Civic Center includes 163,255 square feet of floor space and was

constructed to accommodate a variety of shows or events. The center has hosted concerts, agriculture events, fairs, trade shows, high school graduations and other events since its opening in 1978 and sits on 98.93 acres of land that includes fair grounds.

Lee County owns the Civic Center and the surrounding property, including the fairgrounds. The property has been managed by the Southwest Florida & Lee County Fair Association since 1996.


Although improvements and repairs have been made during its lifetime, an assessment of the facility's condition is needed to determine the best course of action to be able to continue to host various activities.

It will take approximately seven months to complete the assessment. The contract is for \$375,765. Lee County will continue to provide updates to the public.





A bit of ALVA History

Queen of the Everglades - Laura Beatrice Upthegrove

(TY Historic Florida)



There is no record I could find of this gang operating in Lee County, let alone the Alva area. However, From rum stealing to murder the King and Queen of the Everglades (which included most of the land south of the Caloosahatchee River in the early 1900's) terrorized our ancestor's and early 20th century residents throughout their criminal lives.

Joanne Iwinski Miller shares that John Ashley was born in Buckingham. His parents were Julius and Lugenia Ashley living in Buckingham in 1888

Laura Beatrice Upthegrove was a 20th-century American outlaw, bank robber, bootlegger, and occasional pirate active in southern Florida during the 1910s and 1920s, along with John Ashley. From 1915 to 1924, the **Ashley Gang** operated from various hideouts in the Florida Everglades. The gang robbed nearly \$1 million from at least 40 banks while at the same time hijacking numerous shipments of illegal whiskey being smuggled into the state from the Bahamas. Ashley's gang was so effective that rum-running on the Florida coast virtually ceased while the gang was active. Ashley's two-man raid on the West End, Grand

Bahama, in 1924 marked the first time in over a century that American pirates had attacked a British Crown colony.

Laura was born October 5, 1896, in Reddick, near Ocala. At age 14, she married 26-year-old Calvin Collier and had two children with Collier by the time she was 18. In 1916, she divorced Collier and married Earnest Tillman, quickly bearing two children. In 1920, she left Tillman for John Ashley and took up a life of crime.

Upthegrove scouted for banks to rob and drove the getaway cars. On April 17, 1925, Upthegrove married Ashley Gang member and childhood friend Joe Tracy in order to avoid testifying in his trial for murdering a taxi driver. In 1924, Laura visited Tracy in a Kissimmee jail cell, attracting Ashley's jealousy. Ashley hatched a plan to storm the jail and kill Tracy, while sharing the plan with Upthegrove as a rescue. When Upthegrove learned Ashley's true intentions, she tipped off law enforcement, who met Ashley and two other gang members at a bridge near Sebastian and killed them all.



Among poor Florida crackers, they were considered folk heroes who represented a symbol of resistance to bankers, lawmen and wealthy landowners. The Bonnie & Clyde of Florida.



After Ashley's death in 1924, Upthegrove hid out in Canal Point, where she owned and operated a gas station until on August 6, 1927, she died during an argument with a man trying to buy moonshine from her. In the heat of the moment, she swallowed a bottle of Lysol disinfectant and died within minutes. Her mother was present and elected not to call a doctor, because she would be better off dead. It is unclear whether it was an accident, as some claim she mistook it for a bottle of gin, but it was widely reported that she had committed suicide. She was 30 years old.

The couple were the subject of the 1973 film Little Laura and Big John, starring Fabian and Karen Black.



Sunny Florida Cake


Ingredients

- 1 (15.25-ounce) box yellow cake mix
- 1 (3.4-ounce) box instant lemon pudding mix
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- 3/4 cup orange juice
- 4 large eggs
- For the glaze:
- 2 cups powdered sugar
- 3/4 cup orange juice
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- Instructions-

Preheat the oven to 350°F

Butter and flour a 10 to 12-cup Bundt pan.

butter and notif a 10 to 12 cap bandt pan.



Bake for 35 to 40 minutes (or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean and the cake is just starting to pull away from the sides of the pan). Allow the cake to cool in the pan while you make the glaze.

In a small sauce pan, combine the powdered sugar, orange juice, and butter. Cook over medium-low heat until the butter has melted, stirring frequently.

Use a skewer or wooden spoon handle to poke holes in the cake. Pour the warm glaze over the cake while it is still in the cake pan. (Seems like a lot of glaze, but just keep pouring). Allow to cool for 15-20 minutes, or until the cake is cool (glaze has been absorbed) invert the cake onto a serving platter. Allow to cool completely before serving. This cake is best served after it has rested for about 8 hours.


