

North Olga Planning Panel Met on October 21 Highlights HERE:




Veronica Martin, consultant with TDM Consulting of Fort Myers, presented the nearly completed plan for the current use of the former Woodmen's Hall on Styles Road, Alva. The owner, RDA Housing Solutions, is seeking a zoning change for their 2 acres from agriculture to commercial so they may host more than one event (wedding, etc) a month and park more cars (with an easement being sought from

FPL on the old railroad right-ofway).

Veronica says she already spoke to Alva INC's Ruby Daniels to receive her blessing before TDM takes the request to the county. It is expected to take up to one year after the zoning change to receive permitting and complete all construction.

For the January meeting: Detailed discussion of the Owl Creek Development off N. River Road by D.R. Horton.



Mike Greenwell, owner of Rte 31 Produce and restaurant shared several major development projects that are on their way through the approval processes.

First, a development by Pulte National construction to build a 400-500 home complex east of Rte 31 and about 700 feet north of North River Road with public access only from Rte 31. A safety vehicle only gated road will access this development from North River Road.

Second, a new 4 or 6 lane (to be determined) highway from the Babcock Ranch town center south to the current Rte 31 drawbridge and Bayshore Rd. When built Rte 31 will become an access road for a large amount of planned commercial retail development.

The biggest current concern is traffic from Babcock Ranch and north on 4-6 lanes ending at the two-lane drawbridge and the two lane Bayshore. Mike has also learned that his Rte 31 retail property will be claimed by the state as "Eminent Domain" for the new highway path.

When he asked the FDOT when the bridge will be rebuilt to handle the Babcock Highway traffic he was told 2035 and asks Sid Kitson, Chairman & CEO of Kitson and Partners, developers of the Babcock Ranch project, and Babcock Ranch residents to take notice and voice their concerns to FDOT. FDOT's website shows a 2 million dollar study of the Bayshore to Rte 80 section of rte 31 begun in 2019 should end in early 2022 and may address the traffic and bridge issue at that time.

Nominations for 2022 NOPP board position elections (held at the January 3rd, 2022 meeting) are Mary Povia, Clark Cary and Dennis Van Runkle.



Hundreds of beehives stolen in massive heist in Olga

(TY TV 2)

The Lee County Sheriff's Office is looking into a massive beehive heist in Olga. Roughly 150 beehives were stolen from a lot, according to deputies.

Beekeepers said the hives could be valued at about \$50,000.

The Florida Beekeepers Association said someone made off with those bees, which can cost hundreds of dollars per hive. Experts said those bees could be on their way to California for pollination.

"These people knew exactly what they were doing," said Robert Meise, the beekeeping director for Gold Star Farms in North Fort Myers.

"It's a very good spot, has all the good vegetation. The bees were very successful. It was a pity." Meise said. The 150 stolen beehives were Meise's project. He's the beekeeping director for Gold Star Farms in North Fort Myers, but he's more like a bee whisperer.

"If you're an operator and you go in there and bang things around, they'll feel attacked and get defensive. But if you go in properly, they should behave," he said. With no protection at all other than a smoker, Bob showed how bees are a highly profitable commodity. "Those being strong healthy hives were worth at least 300 dollars."

He said during this time of the year, beehives from Florida are leased out to California almond growers for pollinations, and criminal gangs will look for hives to steal, making as much as \$200,000 a season on that many hives.

Out of Gold Star Farms 6,000 beehives, those that were stolen were just a small fraction of those they raise for other beekeepers. But now they are planning on taking additional steps to keep it from happening again.

"We're just going to have to try and take safer measures." Meise added.

Stay home

Stay home except to get medical care.

Most people with COVID-19 have mild illness and can recover at home without medical care.

Take care of yourself. Get rest and stay hydrated.

Stay in touch with your health care provider. Call before you get medical care. Be sure to get care if you have trouble breathing, or have any other emergency warning signs, or if you think it is an emergency.

If possible, avoid public transportation, ride-sharing, or taxis.

Stay away from others

As much as possible, stay in a specific room and away from other people and pets in your home. If possible, you should use a separate bathroom.

Tell your close contacts that they may have been exposed to COVID-19. An infected person can spread COVID-19 starting 48 hours (or 2 days) before the person has any symptoms or tests positive. By letting your close contacts know they may have been exposed to COVID-19, you are helping to protect everyone.

Monitor your symptoms

Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough, or other symptoms.

Follow care instructions from your health care provider.

Call ahead before visiting your doctor

If you have a medical appointment that cannot be postponed, call your doctor's office, and tell them you

have or may have COVID-19. This will help the office protect themselves and other patients.

Get tested

If you have symptoms of COVID-19, get tested. While waiting for test results, you should stay away from others, including staying apart from those living in your household.

Florida has many sites that are providing testing for COVID-19. You can find testing site locations in your area here.



If you are sick, wear a mask over your nose and mouthou should wear a mask over your nose and mouth if you must be around other people.

You do not need to wear the mask if you are alone. If you cannot put on a mask (because of trouble breathing, for example), cover your coughs and sneezes in some other way. Try to stay at least 6 feet away from other people. This will help protect the people around you.

Masks should not be placed on young children under 2 years of age, anyone who has trouble breathing, or anyone who is not able to remove the mask without

help.

Avoid sharing personal household items

Do not share dishes, drinking glasses, cups, eating utensils, towels, or bedding with other people in your home. Wash these items thoroughly after using them with soap and water or put in the dishwasher.

Florida, especially Southwest Florida, struggles to remain a strong citrus producer

(TY Florida Phoenix News)



In a citrus crop forecast released in Mid-October, Agriculture
Commissioner Nikki
Fried mentioned a startling number for Florida's peak citrus production: 244 million boxes in the 1997-98 season.

Some 25 years later, the citrus forecast shows much lower numbers.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture forecast reported 47 million boxes of Florida oranges for the 2021-22 season.

Here's the USDA's final 2020-21 citrus forecast.


The Florida Phoenix has followed the citrus challenges, including a deadly epidemic of citrus greening, an imported bacterial infection spread by an Asian insect.

Citrus greening, found in groves around the world, broke out in south Florida in 2005 and quickly spread throughout the state's citrus zones, slashing production by about two-thirds: from 240 million 90-pound boxes a year to a little over 70 million boxes.

Still, Fried said in a statement that Tuesday's forecast 'is a testament to the resilience of Florida's citrus growers, our state's dedication to our proud citrus industry, and our department's commitment to innovation in the face of ongoing challenges."

She added: Citrus is Florida's signature crop, full of heart-healthy and immune-boosting vitamins and nutrients that consumers demand as we continue the fight against COVID-19. We remain committed to supporting our citrus producers with research, technology, and techniques to fight the spread of citrus greening."

For the 2022-23 state budget, which will be put together by lawmakers during the 2022 legislative session, Fried has requested \$15.6 million to support Florida citrus production, health, and research, among other initiatives.






Photo 9. The Devil's Elbow, on the north shore, opposite Olga.

Dubville (2018)

Robert Young has done an amazing job with the property and he has preserved Dub's old buildings. The trees look to be over a hundred years old and there is an artesian well that still works. The view is still amazing but now million dollar homes are within sight.

I love the fact it appears that time has stood still.

I told him I wondered if someday people would call his property Youngville, he just smiled and softly laughed.



Local, state and federal law enforcement agencies receive an almost immeasurable number of complaints, related to fraud, on an annual basis. As a result of online capabilities, scammers can operate from the farthest reaches of the globe and, as a result, losses are rarely recovered.

It seems that as quickly as we warn the community of a particular scam, criminals find a new method...a new manner in which to perpetrate these crimes.

I believe that recognizing the common components of these scams may save our residents from falling prey to these criminal behaviors.

If the call or message that you receive indicates that there is a problem or a prize...pay close attention. By claiming that you are in some form of trouble with law enforcement or a government agency, that one of your accounts has been compromised, or that you are the lucky winner of a lottery, contest or sweepstakes...people, especially seniors, become increasingly vulnerable.

Scammers/fraudsters often pretend to be from an organization, an agency or a company that you are familiar with. By pretending to represent government agencies such as the Social Security Administration, the Internal Revenue Service, or Medicare...or by stating that they represent a common local utility or a nationally-recognized charity or a large financial institution, many victims trust the credibility of the message. Please don't.

Criminals will, almost always, pressure you to act immediately. By insisting that you act quickly, your ability to think clearly...to verify their identity...to discuss the matter with a friend or relative is eliminated. There are no credible institutions or agencies that will make such demands.

Lastly, criminals will instruct you to send money in a specific and often unusual way. Legitimate and creditable agencies and organizations will never ask for payment using gift cards, ask you to send money through a money transfer company or to send cash...NEVER.

Time is your friend and a criminal's worst enemy. Slow down. If you're not certain, request a name and call-back number. Verifying identity, confirming affiliation and ensuring validity takes minutes and can save you from becoming a victim of fraud.

 - Follow up with a letter, including copies of FTC complaint, police report, and proof, if you have it.
- Monitor your credit reports and bank accounts for unauthorized transactions.
