



Is there a river island park in Alva's future?



Alva native and retiring long time real estate attorney Jay Watkins has released his research and examination of the title to the Alva Island Park. He determined it is in fact owned by Lee County. The Park is shown on the 1890 Alva plat lying west of Josephine Street. It is now the western



portion of the oxbow island on the south side of the river across from Alva village created by the channelization of the Caloosahatchee River almost 100 years ago.

A 1962 Lee County Circuit Court condemnation case taking part of the island to widen and deepen the river ruled that it belonged to Lee County and \$15,500.00 was paid to the county. Lee County used the money to purchase the current Alva Community Center Park in 1965. The island park is mentioned in the 2006 Final Draft of the Alva Community Plan goals (at page 29):

Work with the Army Corps of Engineers to find a means by which the portion of Alva Oxbow Island that is not privately owned, may be made available for passive recreational use.

Although county records show it is privately owned, the issue of ownership is being reviewed by Lee County by the Lee County PROPERTY APPRAISER. Not only is it public property, but every property owner in the original Village of Alva has the private right to use the park because it is dedicated and shown on the Alva plat.

Jay suggests that, like Bowditch Park on Fort Myers Beach, it is an undeveloped gem that needs more private and governmental support to develop passive recreational uses such as kayak/canoe trails, small boat docks, picnic tables/pavilions, BBQ facilities and so forth. It would showcase the original beauty of Alva envisioned by its founder Captain Peter Nelson.

Riverdale High School supports 11-year-old boy battling cancer

Its nice to read positive stories about our local schools in the midst of pandemic stress



Dominick Nino is 11 years old, and he's been living at Golisano Children's Hospital of Southwest Florida since January. Cheerleaders and football players from Riverdale High School had a big surprise in store for Dominick when they brought a little of the Friday night lights to him. They sent over some swag, including a jersey and a piece of the game.

"Eight, my favorite number," Dominick said. "They got me a football that they use, and they wrote the same thing on it, 'In this family, no one fights alone.'" That's the motto Dominick designed for a T-shirt the school is selling, with proceeds going to Golisano Children's Hospital.

"You're now part of this family, and I want you to know that you and everybody else at Golisano's, we're with ya, and we're fightin with ya, and we look forward to maybe coming by the parking lot one of these days and waving at you a whole lot closer than this Zoom will allow us to," head coach James Delgado said.

In January, Dominick went from playing a soccer game to being diagnosed with leukemia hours later. Before his diagnosis, he was considered a healthy and active 10-year-old boy. Dominick was experiencing pain in his legs, but his family attributed it to growing pains or a minor soccer injury. When the pain woke Dominick up in the middle of the night, they knew something else was wrong.

His parents took him to the emergency room in Naples, where doctors ran tests which revealed concerning results. Dominick was then brought to Golisano by ambulance, where additional blood work was done. The answer was every parent's worst fear — Dominick has leukemia.

Now, Dominick is undergoing aggressive treatments. They will involve month-long stays at Golisano, as he receives inpatient chemotherapy. Dominick and his family will never have to walk this journey alone. Every step of the way, Golisano staff and Barbara's Friends will be there as this reality becomes their new normal.

Dominick's mom says the support from the school and the hospital is what helps keeps his spirits up at a time when he really needs it. He's relapsed twice and is now in isolation...

He showed us around his room where he spends all his time. "That's the rocket we made," Dominick said. Everyone is waiting to see if his numbers get strong enough for a bone marrow transplant. He has a lot of people hopeful they do. Riverdale high school students will wear the shirt Dominick made to school Friday and for the football game Friday night.

Cancer is the second leading cause of death for children ages 1 to 14.

Ross Chastain, Alva's NASCAR WATERMELON MAN UPDATES

(TY NASCAR News)



DARLINGTON, S.C. Sept 6 — Ross Chastain held his head high as fireworks went off around the track following Sunday night's Cook Out Southern 500 at Darlington Raceway.

Chastain finished tops among non-playoff drivers as the NASCAR Cup Series opened up its 10-race postseason stretch at the 1.366-mile South Carolina oval. The third-place result validated that Chastain and the No. 42 Chip Ganassi Racing team could be closing in on a potential

race victory before Trackhouse Racing absorbs the operation in 2022 and Chastain becomes the second driver alongside Daniel Suarez.

But it was who Chastain was racing against at the end that added an extra pep to his step — Kyle Larson.

"It was really cool to say we were close on speed to the 5 cars," Chastain said. "That's crazy. We were close at Nashville (Superspeedway) and we were close here. Similar package, you know, you see a trend. So, we'll keep working on that."

New technology being used to prevent blue-green algae in Lake Okeechobee

New technology is working to prevent thick, blue-green gunk from growing in our vital water. The system is up and running to treat dangerous algae blooms. A machine called a nanobubble generator is

working in Pahokee Marina at Lake Okeechobee Thursday. It's being used to help prevent another water crisis.

The machine releases tiny oxygen bubbles into Lake Okeechobee to reduce and prevent blue-green algae. The bubbles are so small they can't be seen. The question is does this cutting-edge technology actually work.

"We've been invited to partner with Florida Gulf Coast University to install and test our nanobubble generators here in Pahokee Marina," said Eli Kersh, the director of Surface Water Treatment for Moleaer. Moleaer is the company behind the nanobubble generator. Kersh is confident the technology will work against blue-green algae.

"A nanobubble generator is a device that takes water and air and creates microscopic bubbles," Kersh said. Those bubbles increase oxygen in the water to make water more resilient to algal blooms. A nanobubble generator is relatively new to the world of science. Kersh's company partnered with FGCU's The Water School.

"We're turning on these nanobubble generators for the first time, so will get some samples before," FGCU professor Barry Rosen said. Rosen said we won't see any effects because this is a long-term thing. "The nanobubbles will spread throughout the basin, and we'll see if they have an effect or not," Rosen said.


Rosen and Kersh can't say the nanobubble generators will make a big difference. "The best outcome we could hope for I think would be complete reduction of algae of course, but I think we will be happy with understanding, learning more about the impact," Kersh said.

FGCU students will monitor the progress of the bubble generator, and they will report back if and when there's a noticeable difference in the blue-green algae levels.

Italian Stuffed Tomatoes

4 medium sized tomatoes

1 c cooked rice

1/2 c fresh shaved parmesan cheese

1/2 c crumbled feta cheese (or mozzarella)

1/4 c toasted chopped macadamia nuts

2Tbsp snipped basil leaves (plus small whole leaves for garnish)

3 cloves fresh garlic chopped fine

1/4 c Italian style seasoned bread crumbs

2 Tbsp olive oil

Cut off tomato tops. Using a melon baller, scoop sides out. (Leave half inch thick sides and bottom).

Stir together rice, cheeses, nuts, chopped basil, garlic in bowl. Fill the scooped tomatoes with the mixture.

Stir together the breadcrumbs and the oil in a bowl and then sprinkle it over top of the tomatoes.



Preheat an air fryer to 370°F. Fryer basket with cooking spray. Arrange the tomatoes in the basket. Cook until tender and filling is heated through (about 15 minutes)....garnish with reserved whole basil leaves and serve.

Note-if you do not have air fryer you may make the same recipe by assembling as described abovebake at 350 for 30 minutes




