# A second bridge, all new traffic pattern, being decided for downtown LaBelle,

# possibly foretelling a future N-S expressway close to the Lee County line

Please save the date for the FDOT Work Shop now rescheduled to **Wed 11/30, 5 pm at the Civic Center**, just behind the LaBelle City Hall (not courthouse) on Rte 80.

FDOT is presenting in the attached documents their current proposed layout for locating a second bridge that would create a "Dogleg" onto Main Street (permanently turning Main Street into a busy, wider roadway with the probable removal of many oaks), and would likely require demolition, embankment buildup, overpass building, and paving over much of our Riverfront).

It would also concentrate on Bridge Street the growing heavy through-traffic (heavy trucks and other high-speed through-traffic vehicles). Unfortunately, thanks to the heavy, high speed through-traffic even today, Bridge Street has become uncrossable and often scary for anyone walking North-South along its sidewalks. Since 8/15/2022, many of us in the Second Bridge Group have been proposing full consideration of a "Bypass Option" that would move the heavy/high speed through-traffic to a river crossing in uninhabited areas within reasonable distance, east of the city.



This all starts with the district-wide challenge FDOT has in which they forecast the need to increase North-South capacity along SR29. We believe that FDOT is working professionally and in good faith, and has simply picked some of the simplest and straightest layout lines possible on a drawing in order to come up with the Dogleg option. But we should help FDOT find a solution for their North-South capacity problem, where that solution still preserves all of our Historic Assets and the soul of the City.

At the same time, we have every reason to believe that they want to know what is important to us as a community, so this 11/30 Workshop is our chance to mention what those "hot buttons" are. FDOT is likely to welcome our ideas on how to balance these two needs.

ALL are welcome from Lee or Hendry County.

## ALVA INC hosted a presentation on the Two Bridge FDOT plan for LaBelle and discussion about rezoning of another parcel along Route 80.

ALVA INC met Tuesday November 15 at 7pm at the Alva

Community Center. Connie Dennis, president of ALVA INC, introduced Leonard Enriquez president of Cambridge Project Development in LaBelle.

Mr. Enriquez is spokesperson for the LaBelle citizens group "Second Bridge". His group and a growing number of Western Hendry and Eastern Lee County residents have learned this summer and fall about Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) plans to build a second river bridge near the current Bridge Street drawbridge that would turn the current oak canopy Main Street into the same kind of highway Bridge Street has become; heavy traffic, noise, and no interest by businesses or homeowners in locating there.

The Second Bridge group recognizes FDOT's need to move more of the increasing traffic on Route 29 from the current bridge to a second bridge, but is trying to encourage the city, county and FDOT to build it as a bypass for through vehicles east of Port LaBelle, and allow the city to make Bridge Street an attractive historic and retail street again, leaving Main Street alone.

Alva's concern is that such an idea might take hold, but the second bridge would be built west of town. Indeed, west of the Walmart on Route 80, close to the Lee County line, which could then bring back the "Southwest Toll Road" expressway plan which was cancelled during 2020 and the covid pandemic.

All interested persons are invited to attend the next FDOT 'workshop' on this project on Wed, November 30, 5 to 7pm in the LaBelle Civic Center, behind the city hall, on route 80.

The plan for a new Seven/Eleven convenience and fuel store was to be shared at this meeting. However, it was cancelled shortly before the meeting by the applicant, as was the case for the North Olga group several weeks ago. Perhaps plans have changed for the Alva site.

The meeting closed on a challenging note. A Bonita Bay area construction company (Pro Con) owner has purchased a 1 ¾ acre unimproved lot on the north side of Route 80 at Lippincott Road.

Shellie Johnson of Land Planning Service (not in LaBelle) presented the project to ALVA INC because they have been hired by the owner to have the lot approved for a zoning change from agricultural to neighborhood commercial. The application is currently under review with the county. A public hearing is required for approval.

Because the site is so small, too small for a single home site (in fact nothing larger than 5,000 sq ft may be built there under the requested zone change) in Alva according to the Lee County Plan, it has attracted the attention of some Alva residents.

The neighbors directly to the north of this formerly wooded lot came to the meeting to share their

concern that no plans for the use of this lot have yet been announced. They had a taste of it after IAN struck.

The owner received Lee County permission to clear some of the trees and underbrush earlier this year. Note the permission taped to the sign on the property.

Much of the cut vegetation and trees that he left on the lot before the storm was blown onto Joshua Street, and into their front yards.





They said neither he nor any representative of his company came to look at the damage, and they had to remove it from the street and their own home front yards.

Connie Dennis promised on behalf of ALVA INC that her members would not only pay attention to this property but help the neighbors of it any way they could.

The presenter, Ms. Johnson, informed all that the next step in the requested zoning

change process would be a public hearing with the county hearing examiner. Connie emphasized the

importance of a large group of residents to attend to address their concerns using facts, not just opinions and emotions. A large showing from Alva Inc will show the county how much we all care about our community!

The next ALVA INC meeting is scheduled for 7pm, Tuesday December 6, 2022. The Caloosa 80 zoning request will be presented along with a presentation by Saint Matthews House Ministries about their plans for the ministry center they currently operate west of Alva at North River Road and Cypress Creek Road.

It is hoped that if the Seven / Eleven is still being planned for Alva that Alexis Crespo will be able to present that project as well.

# Enough is never enough for Lee residential densities

(Opinion article from the Nov 20 News-Press)

Paul Asfour's guest column in the Sept. 25 News-Press asked three very important questions: 1) Do Lee County residents matter? 2) When is enough, enough? 3) What does the language 'may not exceed' mean?

Asfour's focus was the relentless pursuit of additional units in River Hall by developer Green Pointe. River Hall has been a local conversation since 2005 when the original developer requested additional density before the ink had dried on the permit. It didn't matter that the permit included the words, 'may not exceed' 1,999 units. Strangely, this request didn't actually get an approval. Maybe, at that time, the words 'may not exceed' actually meant something.

The development was later bought by Green Pointe, whose CEO made a \$10,000 donation to Rick Scott who then happened to become governor. This new owner of River Hall put in his claim for additional units when Scott appointed Brian Hamman to fill the vacancy on the Lee County Board of County Commissioners in 2013. Hamman didn't let the governor or the CEO down, voting with a block of newer commissioners who were development-friendly. Green Pointe received permission 'not to exceed 2,695 dwelling units.' River Hall residents were incensed. They cited the 'may not exceed' number of units and, along with Commissioner Frank Mann, took the matter to the state hearing officer, who agreed with the residents that 'may not exceed' actually meant something.

In a move worthy of a comedy stage production, county staff -- one must suppose at the direction of the County Commission (and on taxpayer \$) flew to Tallahassee to plead the developer's case for increased density. Mann, getting information of the staff 's mission, flew to Tallahassee to present the resident's side of the density issue. Nothing had changed to warrant more density in River Hall. But, despite Mann's efforts, the hearing officer was overruled and the new governor and his cabinet agreed to the additional density which (again) 'may not exceed 2,695 dwelling units.' Back at the commissioners' next meeting, Hamman was furious. Mann, he exclaimed, was 'out of line.' He told Chairman Mann he had lost confidence in him to chair the commission -- because Mann had stood with his constituents against the 'may not exceed' exception.

Now, Asfour informs us, Green Pointe has returned with a request for even more density, this time a paltry 489 units. If this were a unique situation, it could possibly be dismissed as an anomaly. Sadly, it's all too common. Look no further than Cameratta Companies and their footprint in our water resource area (DR/GR) all along Cork-screw Road. And their continuing quest for more, which now includes a small city they plan to build along the Cork-screw Road corridor -- with the county's blessing, although this is in an environmentally sensitive area.



In Lee County, as in most of Florida, residents do not matter. We are not represented. Plunder matters. Enough is never enough as evidenced by River Hall.








# UF scientist studies impact of climate change on septic systems

(TY News Press)

Note: So many ON THE RIVER readers have private sewer systems it seemed in light of the storm we have all just gone through to repeat this instructional article for the NEWS-PRESS for all of us.

Nearly one-fourth of the world's wastewater comes from



residential septic systems, according to the United Nations. But only 48% of such systems adequately treat wastewater.

The most common type of septic system includes the tank and a drain field – sometimes called a leach field. In Florida, nearly one-third of households depend on a septic system. The tank is a water-tight container buried in the ground. Treated waste goes from the septic tank to a drain field, where it's absorbed in the ground.

Mary Lusk, a UF/IFAS assistant professor of soil, water, and ecosystem sciences, wrote an article in which she connects climate change with septic systems.

We asked Lusk to explain this connection.

Can you please tell us how climate change impacts septic tanks?

Answer: Climate change is causing a gradual rise in sea levels, and often that means higher groundwater levels for coastal areas. Septic systems need at least 24 inches of soil beneath them to adequately remove pollutants and their accompanying

pathogens. Every fraction of rise in groundwater means septic systems treat pollutants less effectively. In many low-lying areas, like coastal Florida or small islands in the Caribbean and Pacific, the groundwater is already close to the surface, and these areas are especially vulnerable to small increases in groundwater rise. How do septic systems remove wastewater contaminants?



Answer: Each contaminant in wastewater may go through different processes in the septic system. Some pathogens die in the septic tank. Other pathogens and contaminants like nitrogen move out of the tank in the septic system effluent (the liquid waste that flows out of the tank) and begin to percolate down through the

soil. There, the contaminants may either degrade by natural soil bacteria or get trapped by soil particles. This process is usually

adequate for pathogen removal in unsaturated soils.

What challenges do the pathogens from household septic

systems pose, and why are socioeconomically challenged areas at risk?

Answer: If so meone in a



home is infected with a virus or bacteria, that infection can become part of their waste and enter the septic system. If the septic system does not remove that pathogen, it may travel to drinking water and infect someone else – sometimes even

causing an outbreak of multiple infections. In Florida, septic systems typically remove pathogens very effectively, thereby protecting public health. But I'm concerned about what is typical in many lower-income areas, especially small, low-income islands in the Pacific and Caribbean. In those places, septic systems don't remove pathogens optimally. Add sea level and groundwater rise to the mix, and we're looking at an important public health concern. What tips would you give homeowners to ensure their septic systems are functioning properly?

Answer: You can ensure the system works properly throughout the year. That inclu des flushing only toilet paper and human waste down the toilet. Never flush items such as napkins, facial tissues, cotton swabs, 'flushable' wipes or cigarette butts. You also may not know this, but don't pour oil and fat into the kitchen drain. It's best to limit use of your garbage disposal. Using a garbage disposal prevents excess organic matter from building up inside your septic tank. Composting is a good alternative.



What do you suggest homeowners do to make sure their septic systems cope with rain that may saturate the soil?

Answer: Homeowners need to get their systems inspected and pumped every three to five years, depending on how many people live in the home. This will help keep the

system working at its best even during heavy storms or other disasters. But if you see waste backing up in the toilet or bathtub, or if the area around your septic system stinks, that's a sign that it's not working correctly, and you should call a professional septic system inspector right away.
