

ALVA INC introduces new Board of Directors at April Meeting



Connie Dennis, Alva INC secretary, opened the April meeting at the Alva Community Center with the pledge to the American Flag. It occurred to me in bold capital letters at that moment why America is supporting the Ukrainian Government and people in its war of defense against the Russian invasion. Because a meeting for open discussion like this would never be allowed in Russia, or any country ruled by an autocrat and his or her cronies. God bless America.

Connie introduced the new Board of Directors of Alva INC and reminded us that the officers will be elected by the board at the regular May meeting.

Emily Smith, treasurer, announced that more members and over \$600.00, mostly in new member dues, have been received in March than in any single month in years. The current balance of the organization is over \$1,301.09. Emily and Connie told us this money, and a hoped for continued increase in membership, will fund new actions by Alva INC in promotion of its primary purpose to KEEP ALVA RURAL and to develop Action Teams made up of small groups of members focused on key areas of concern or education of all Alva area residents.

One of the board members commented that her reason for being on the board is that she knows developers and most county officials are very pro-development and that she feels Alva INC and other concerned resident groups are important because they can help make whatever development is approved be more environment smart and lifestyle friendly for former and newer residents.

Discussion of the following subjects followed. First, the proposed wedding and party venue at the former Woodsmen of the World site on Packinghouse Road:

Roxanne Gause reported on a March 30th hearing which was held at the Lee County offices for this project. 18 Alva INC folk attended, most to speak about concerns for the project. It was felt by the attenders that their concerns were well heard. The hearing official, Amanda Rivera, will soon offer her decision on the hearing. She can pass her recommendations on to the County Commissioners or reject the project all together.

Parking, alcohol sales and plans for a new 3,600 SF. building on site are Alva INC's primary issues, though it appears the 9 residents within 500 feet of the site are all opposed, and may not have been approached early on by the developer as required. The land owner still has the entire project's land for sale as well. No one at the meeting knows why.

Leslie Roberts shared that the River Hall community residents opposed to any high density expansion of new homes in the River Hall community on rte 80 near Old Olga are organizing an effective voice against the planned addition of about 400+ smaller homes on smaller sites to the community.

A new NEXT DOOR social media page has been started for the group and the last meeting by the developer and Lee County has resulted in several 'insufficiencies' in the plan which the developer must satisfy before the plan can go forward with Lee County. Noted is the fact that River Hall is experiencing difficulty with providing enough lawn water now, and is still planning a new 9-hole golf course. Potable water as well as sewer access is purchased from county infrastructure by the residents.

Paul Furbay shared information on the Owl Creek development of almost 400 homes surrounding the present Owl Creek Marina, off Rte 78 near rte 31. The plan was passed on to the Lee County Commissioners to Tallahassee before the State Department of Economic Opportunity. This will be the first development of others on the way containing several thousand homes now being planned within a couple of miles of the rte 31 and rte 78 intersection in the next couple of years.

Gambling comes to Alva

Ramona and I arrived in Alva at Christmas, 2014. One of the first things we noticed when we drove our Alpine motor coach across the drawbridge on the way to park for a short while at the Alva United Methodist Church was the cute but empty river-side store by the post office. "Hey, maybe we'll be dining there soon!" Fast forward to March 2022 and after several attempts by a few folks to make a restaurant work (not enough parking), or a boater's haven (dock is too small), or a gift shop (rent was too high) and the place is emptier looking than it was over seven years ago. Until...



The week of April 17 the signs went up. A brand-new ARCADE 777 mini gambling center is coming to the quaint and quiet village of Alva. What!!??

The Dunn & Bradstreet website lists this company as doing business as 777 Arcade. The main office is located at 7147 South US Highway 1, Port Saint Lucie, Florida, 34952-1412. The company phone is listed as 772-237-5075. The business seems to have begun in 2018.

If you Google 777 Arcade you will find several locations scattered around South Florida, on both coasts and the center.

There are not many Google reviews on the business but of the ones you will find a fair amount of them remark on the cleanliness of the facilities and good service of the staff.

I tried to connect with the owners at their Facebook Page but so far have received no response. Here are the comments shared by local residents on the Alva Friends and Family Facebook Page:



---It will bring in a lot of undesirables. These always do. I thought they were outlawed. How do they get around this? Do they have to get permitted?



- ---Arcades do not bring in undesirables. LoL. It's mostly older people with nothing better to do.
- ---Lots of businesses have tried to go in there but can't get the permits because of various reasons (not enough parking, not big enough septic, etc.).

- ---I spoke with the leasing Agent a few months ago, I was considering it for a possible fabric, furniture accessory store but they were asking \$3000-\$3500 per month. And it needed renovation.
- ---They were telling me they wanted a business that would complement the neighborhood. Looks like they didn't stick to their plan.
- ---They don't sell or allow alcoholic beverages! Most that I have been in, won't even allow you to smoke inside! Most are a quiet place to relax and unwind.





As to the last comment, looks like Alva shall all find out soon.

ANOTHER new gated community planned for North River Road near Rte 31

On Thursday evening, April 21, the North Olga Association of residents met for their regular quarterly meeting at the Bayshore Fire Company on Nalle Road, North Fort Myers. Three items were on the



agenda including the hoped-for new firehouse and helicopter pad on rte 31 near Shirley Lane and the current Sunoco Gas Station on two acres donated by Babcock Ranch. The new Pulte housing development is planned for much of the land around this fire station, on the east side of Rte 31.

Dennis Van Roekle presented the present status of the project, which is in need of funding and volunteers, who we hear are being sought primarily by the fire station team on Rte 80, Palm Beach Blvd, in Fort Myers Shores. Dennis is approaching developers of the several new housing projects being planned for this area now to consider donating, or donating toward, a new fire truck, which

will be an estimated \$1 million expenditure for the new fire company.

Speaking of new developments, D R Horton's development of the Owl Creek Property south of Rte 78 just east of Rte 31 received its final Florida state approval on April 20. This project should break ground before the end of summer. Water and sewer will be cared for by an extension from the present county utility station on Bayshore Road.





Mike Greenwell gave an update to his plans for the site of his Rte 31 Produce and Cracker Shack Restaurant.

While all of his plans hinge on when the state purchases by 'eminent domain' about 300 feet deep of the entire frontage along his property to build the 4-6 lane Rte 31/service road

from Babcock Ranch to the light at Bayshore Road, he is trying to be flexible, hoping to receive permission to remove his store, restaurant, horse arena, and his family's three homes on the property an build at least a 400,000 SF retail area and possibly multi-family and 2-3 story condos in the area left after the Rte 31 construction is complete.

In speaking with several Florida Department of Transportation managers recently, he feels strongly that



the road expansion will come much sooner than he thought last year, maybe as soon as the end of 2022. He also expects that if that happens an entirely new Rte 31 Caloosahatchee River bridge will come next with expanded Rte 31 south from there to Rte 80, Palm Beach Highway.

The NEWEST development being planned along our river:

Alexis Crespo, who presented for the Pulte Company's development south of the Lee/Charlotte County line off Rte 31 at the end of year North Olga Association meeting, shared the initial plan for the Cary-Duke Ranch development. 480 acres of pasture/prairie, wetland and dry.



As Ms. Crespo shared, the plan is only in the very ground floor of development, though they hope to have a land development plan to show the members of the NOA by this July.



At this stage the hope is for a gated private community with single family homes on large lots, high quality amenities, and a clubhouse and pool. No room for golf, even 9 holes.

The developer is Neal Communities, a fifty-year builder of similar developments from Naples north to Tampa. To the right is an existing project that might look similar to this North Olga development.

Jason Frost, VP of Acquisitions, shared that the main entrance would be off of North River Road, and a rear, or possibly only emergency vehicle entrance would connect to Duke Highway, near the river.





Water and sewer will be continued east on Rte 78 from the Owl Creek development connection.

Ivory Matthews, VP of Community Affairs, reassured several neighbors who live on Duke Highway of the firm's intent to involve them often as the project progresses. They are particularly concerned that the project be spacious and attractive from the outside, though one new resident shared, "We will miss the cows".



Riverdale Branch Library Renovations to Begin in May!



Lee County's Riverdale Branch Library is receiving extensive renovations. Our Lee County library is getting a huge makeover starting at the end of April, with an upgraded parking lot and new areas inside the building to make it more accessible and aesthetically pleasing.

The total cost to renovate the Riverdale Branch Library, located at 2421 Buckingham Road in Olga, is around \$4 million, including design, construction and furniture. It will include interior renovations to the central service desk,

more meeting rooms and separate spaces for adults, teens and children. External improvements will include a redesign of the building and landscaping and parking lot upgrades that will help the function and appearance of the library.

Jill Horrom, the manager of internal services for the Lee County Library System, says these renovations were long overdue and she's glad the county approved them for April. "This is such a growing area; we've been in this area for many years and now we really want to upgrade the site and the interior to meet the growing needs," Horrom said. (See the concluding comments to this OTR article concerning our 'growing area').

Horrom says this library will have something no other Lee County Library has had before. "For the First time in the Lee County Library System, we're gonna have a meeting room that's flexible: We're gonna have a wall that completely opens up, it's a glass wall that opens up so we can really activate the space, so you can have a story time in the room, then a community meeting in the afternoon by opening up the wall," Horrom said.

Construction is set to begin at the end of April and will take around 7 months to finish. During this time, residents are encouraged to visit another one of the 13 branches within the Lee County Library System

The Riverdale Library will close to the public at 5p.m. Saturday, April 30 for renovations expected to last seven months. The renovation project will make improvements to both the interior and exterior of the building, including a covered entrance, outdoor reading areas, and spaces redesigned for children, teens, and adults.

(The next closest Lee County Library Branch is the Lehigh Acres Library on Gunnery Road at the high school)

My wife Ramona and I visited the public information meeting at the library on Friday April 15th along with four other residents of the Alva-Olga area and expressed our joys and concerns about this project.

Jill Horrom, Central Library/Branch Liasson, shared that the project was first planned over four years ago, then held up during 2020 and 2021 because of the Covid pandemic. There were no required public listening sessions in the area for the project since it involves renovation, not expansion, though an effort might have been more strongly to get ideas of what this library needs from the most active library members who make this their book resource of choice. I am sure the local staff talked about the coming changes with some patrons when they had time.


When we moved to Oak Park Mobile Home Village in Alva itself we knew our choice of a home site would put us about 10 miles west of the LaBelle Library and the same distance east of the Riverdale Branch, so we have used both small libraries as best we could, relying on the Lee County Library book sharing system and the very user-friendly LIBBY and HOOPLA eBook, audiobook, etc free member borrowing apps as well.

However now, with the first major renovation/upgrade since the library was moved here from its tiny store site east of the former Winn-Dixie next door (now a brand-new Publix Market) we hoped for more space, perhaps even a second floor, on the same building footprint. Constraints unknown to us, and also apparently to the library officials present, kept expansion off the table. The project, to be completed by Stevens Construction, is approved by the county as presented.

So, what are the enhancements this renovation brings? Certainly, more efficient work-space for the staff. In the WINK article above Jill Horrom mentions the multi-use feature of a movable wall to close off or open a large section of the floorplan. Larger windows will let in more light, and new, lower shelving will allow that light to brighten the stacks of books much better than at present. Open air, roofed over, outside tables and benches on the front of the building will no doubt be used well.

The downsides revolve around the fact that though Jill mentioned our growing area (over 4,000 new homes are planned by various developers within 6 miles of this library in the next two to three years) the library will actually have less books than before, the same amount of computer stations, and no area for the once popular sale of donated Used Books.

Once completed this renovation will provide a very attractive place to choose, borrow, and read books, magazines and newspapers. We also hope that local groups of all kinds seek to use the multi-use, sliding glass-walled conference room for their meetings. We do have the Olga, Buckingham and Alva Community Centers for larger gatherings. However, our library is the most easily accessed centrally located small meeting space in our area. And those new chairs promise to be comfy!

Crisis in Ukraine: One way YOU can help.

A new child refugee every second



One month since the start of the war in Ukraine on Feb. 24, more than half of Ukraine's estimated 7.5 million children have been displaced. The outflux of people — mostly children and women — fleeing violence in Ukraine dwarfs all other refugee crises of recent years in terms of scale and speed. As of March 24, more than 4 million people — including 1.8 million children — had crossed into Poland, Romania, Moldova, Slovakia, Hungary and other neighboring countries — according to data from UNHCR, the UN's lead refugee agency.

The humanitarian crisis in Ukraine continues to evolve and deepen at an alarming pace.

Even before the heavy weapons fire and air strikes on cities and civilian neighborhoods, insecurity and deprivation had become a way of life for families in Ukraine's eastern Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts due to a conflict that started in March 2014. Humanitarian needs have been particularly acute for those living in the vicinity of the 'contact line' that separates government-controlled areas from non-government-controlled areas.





Ingredients:

- 1 carton (8 ounces) mascarpone cheese
- 1 (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
- 1 (3.4 ounces) instant lemon pudding mix
- 1 cup whole milk
- 1 teaspoon lemon extract
- 2/3 cup lemon juice
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 24 crisp ladyfinger cookies
- 2 teaspoons grated lemon zest



Instructions:

- Beat first 5 ingredients on medium speed until blended, 2-3 minutes (do not overbeat).
- •Whisk lemon juice and sugar in a shallow bowl until sugar is dissolved. Quickly dip 8 ladyfingers into lemon juice, allowing excess to drip off; place in a single layer in an 8-in. square dish. Spread a third of the mascarpone mixture over top. Repeat layers twice.
- •Sprinkle with lemon zest. Refrigerate, covered, at least 2 hours before serving.



Lee Commissioners approve construction contract to renovate Riverdale Branch Library

Fort Myers, FL, April 5, 2022 – The Lee Board of County Commissioners voted Tuesday to approve a \$3.5 million construction contract with Stevens Construction Inc. to renovate the Riverdale Branch Library, 2421 Buckingham Road.

Interior renovations will include a central service desk, increased meeting rooms and separate spaces for adults, teens and children. The external improvements will include architectural, landscaping and parking lot upgrades that will enhance the function and appearance of the Library. ADA upgrades also will be made to both the building and parking lot.

The total cost of the project is about \$4.1 million, which includes design, construction and furniture. The project is being paid from the Library Fund property taxes.

Construction is set to begin at the end of April and will take about seven months to complete. The library will be closed for the renovations beginning at 5 p.m. Saturday, April 30. During this period residents and visitors are encouraged to visit another one of the 13 branches within the Lee County Library System. The new Lee County Residence Tool, which can be accessed by visiting www.leegov.com/rit, can be used to find the library locations. Library eServices are also available to anyone with a library card to borrow eBooks, audiobooks, magazines and stream content by visiting www.leegov.com/library/online.



ANIMAL CRUELTY TASK FORCE BUSTS LEHIGH ACRES DOG-BAITING PAIR

Following receipt of a tip regarding possible animal neglect in Lehigh Acres, the Lee County Sheriff's Office Animal Cruelty Task Force and East District Criminal Investigations Division responded to homes on West 9th Street and on Aspen Avenue South to investigate the allegations.

Following an investigation and interviews, Anthony Coneal Pew, Sr. (DOB 03-24-1964) and his son, Anthony Coneal Pew, Jr. (DOB 03-03-1991), were both arrested for their involvement in felony dog-baiting.





"Baiting," according to Florida Statute 828.122(2)(b) means "to attack with violence, to provoke, or to harass an animal with one or more animals for the purpose of training an animal for, or to cause an animal to engage in, fights with or among other animals."

Anthony Pew, Jr. was subsequently charged with five felonies for Fighting or Baiting Animals.

Anthony Pew, Sr. was subsequently charged with eight felonies for Fighting or Baiting Animals. A total of 16 canines were seized by the task force.

We will continue to collect towels (cloth and paper), disinfectant, disinfectant wipes, large trash bags, mops, buckets, squeegees, bleach, laundry detergent, Dawn dishwashing liquid, dog and cat toys (especially toys for "heavy chewers"), harnesses, potty pads, dog and cat food, puppy replacement milk, cat litter, leashes, grooming supplies, large Nylabones, Kong toys, Isopropyl alcohol, Hydrogen peroxide, garden hoses and spray nozzles for our local animal rescues and shelters.


