Ireland Bank presentation on services. Renee McBride – Okay, first of all I just want to thank the City of Lava. I don't know if you are aware that you have banked with Ireland Bank for 36 years and Ireland Bank has been in Lava for 36 years. So we really appreciate that. The bank owns the building here in town so that we pay property taxes. So we are contributing to the taxing district which is our ambulance, our library, the city, itself, the cemetery, the school. We know that our customers work hard for their money and you have other choices that are available to you, We recognize that. That's why we're here to offer some choices that might be appealing to you that you are not utilizing. So in your packet the first one is a business credit card. Which was asked for when your clerk retired and the new ones came in they asked for a business credit card. There are two to choose from one is the standard and one is the preferred card. The standard card has no annual fee but the preferred card has an annual fee. So a business may link up to five cards to one account. The city decides who gets the cards. There is a way to track. A summary billing and a sub-billing so that you can see who made each purchase. You can set limits on their purchases and controls on what can be purchased. Leah Navarro, "I have a question. Do they have to sign on the signature card for the account?" Renee McBride, "The city itself is applying for the card. The city would decide who uses the cards." In the folder, it shows the types of accounts. Ireland bank has your general account right now. Another option is the remote capture. There is a fee for that." Randy Benglan, "What is that fee?" Renee McBride, "That fee is \$50.00." Jill Makuaole, "Can you waive that fee?" Renee McBride, "No." Mayor Thomson, "Is there anything we should be taking advantage of that we aren't or something we should be doing differently than we are currently doing?" Renee McBride, "No, just the things in the folder." Mayor Thomson, "Council any questions or comments for Renee? Nothing else? Ok, thank you, Renee."

Mayor Thomson, "I have another presentation- Key Bank. So you have heard what our other institution has had to say. I'll place the same information in front of you guys. You're one of our multiple banks and we're all new to this and wondering what we can do to do our job better. If there is suggestions, financial guidance or anything we can do to improve our business. Please let us have what you've got to say and what you can do for us. You might reiterate for me and the council what we have with you now because we are all learning." "My name is Sonya Hawley, area retail leader for Key Bank and this is

Braxton Farnsworth. He is the manager in Pocatello. You currently have a savings account with us. Braxton is prepared to talk to you about all kinds of things. What perked my interest was that you were talking about investments and we have a team that does invest with city and county. But I was not under the impression that you were interested in that." Braxton Farnsworth, "Investment is a wide world but one thing that we have in the banking aspect is a sweep account that are similar to other institutions but ours are fully collateralized. We don't go off the \$250,000 FDIC insurance. So anything you have on deposit with us can be fully collateralized and then it sweeps into a sub-account every night and these funds are then invested in US government agencies and bonds. Which then keeps secure and helps you earn interest. Each time you write a check or have a transaction out of this account it just moves that amount out of this account to pay those items. The bulk of the account is still earning interest. This is just one of the options. One of our main goals is to keep our fees way below what our fees are.

#### Chamber

One percent- Sherill Tilllotson-Updated information \$15,750 is the Chamber is contributing to advertising and marketing. Randy Benglan – What was the amount budgeted for last year?

> Sherill Tillotson – For 2022 the Chamber budgeted \$ 19,500 that included a new website.

Randy Benglan- What was the one percent request? This one is \$60,000.

The request from the one percent was \$50,000. Remember the amount we were charged exceeded the amount we had budgeted. We have limited the amount of hard copy to the brochure and the Idaho Adventure guide (both hard copy and digital). We are trying very hard to do more digital. Everything is up. So it's costing about 10% more.

We will keep you informed as he reviews that and as we get conformation from the property owner on their willingness to allow the well drilled there.

Randy Benglan – Do we need a task order or anything for the hydrogeologist to do his stuff?

Bryan Phinney - I am going to see if I can get him to do that under the existing contract. I will keep you posted as soon as he gets a chance to glance at his original report to see what he put in there.

Item number 2 is the water grant agreement sent to the city by DEQ for the Mayor's signature. We that will get that signed and that will put everything in place for that 50% grant for the water study update. Item number 3 is the wastewater grant. I was concerned that I had missed an email. I reached out to DEQ to find out where that one was at because everything else that we've come through where we have a water and wastewater they come through together. Yours did not. I got ahold of Zoe McCardy, with DEQ she said that they were having to dig up some information on the wastewater so they haven't sent yours. hey are expecting it to come out tomorrow or Monday. We will get that forwarded as soon as we get it for the Mayor to sign.

Law Enforcement – The deputy had a call in Downey so he took that and he didn't really have anything for us.

# Planning and Developmental Services

Mayor Thomson – Last month I asked you to review contracting services with Bruce Parker as city planner, comprehensive plan and Bryan Phinney as City engineer. I had Jill make some spreadsheets of our contracting folks. I felt like we have two types of contracts here. One for services i.e. planning services or engineering services. A couple of the contracts like the one for the Developmental Ordinance and the Comprehensive Plan have deliverables attached to them. It was my thought that they were yearly contracts that were up at the end of the fiscal year, which was September 30<sup>th</sup> and need to be renewed. But I felt like we should at least have a review particularly on those that have deliverable products of where we are at and where we need to go. Then we can rewrite the contracts with some direction in mind. I will also point out that at the time we did our budget we didn't have any information on actual costs to these contracts. All we had is what we had budgeted and we used that as a guideline for next year. They all exceeded the contract for various reasons.

Randy Benglan – There are two contracts. Bruce sent over a new contract to me. I sent it to Gary for review. So my thinking is, there has been some discussion about liking to go more local with our planner. I'm not necessarily opposed to that but I think at this moment where Bruce is pretty involved with the comp plan, the permitting resolution, the Jesse lawsuit, the short term rental lawsuit I would recommend we keep him on for this year. We can review it again next year. 3 separate contracts Developmental contract deals with the Developmental Ordinance. The engineer also works on that.

He said, "probably the beginning of January." So I said, let's extend the term of the agreement through January 30<sup>th</sup>.
