			QUESTION: Shall the Board of Trustees of Marsh Valley Jt. School District #21, Bannock and Caribou Counties, Idaho, be authorized and empowered to levy a Supplemental Levy in the amount of One Million Four Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$1,490,000) per year for two (2) years, commencing with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026 and ending on June 30, 2028, for the purpose of financing any lawful expenses of maintaining and operating the District; all as provided in the Resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees on August 25, 2025.					
			The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed Supplemental Levy is a tax of \$62.74 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions. If the proposed levy is approved, the tax per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value is expected to increase by \$62.74 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value.

A sixty percent (60%) majority of the voters must vote "In Favor" to impose a new Local Option Non-Property Tax, to change the rate of such a tax previously implemented, or to change the purpose(s) for which these tax funds will be used.

These local option non-property taxes reduce the property taxes assessed and collected from the owners of real property in Lava Hot Springs.

The City of Lava Hot Springs desires the voters to vote on whether to amend the City's local option tax ordinance to allow local option tax funds to be used for the benefit of the Lava Hot Springs Academy Charter School.
