### **Types of cookies used on our website:**

- **First-party analytics cookies:** We use these cookies to estimate the number of unique visitors, to improve our websites and the websites of our merchants, and to detect the most searched words in search engines that lead to a web page. These cookies are not used to target you with online marketing. We use these cookies to understand how our websites and the websites of our merchants are performing and to make relevant improvements to improve your browsing experience.

## Operational

- **Third-party analytics cookies:** We also use Google Analytics and other third-party analytics providers listed below to help measure how users interact with the content on our website. These cookies "remember" what our users have done on previous pages and how they have interacted with the website. To learn more about Google Analytics, visit Google's information page. For instructions on how to opt-out of Google Analytics, see below.

## Operational

- **Advertising cookies:** These are used on our website to personalise marketing to you and your interests and to provide you with a more personalised service in the future. These cookies remember that you visited our website and we may share this information with third parties, such as advertisers. Although these cookies can track your device's visits to our website and other sites, they generally cannot identify you personally. Without these cookies, the advertisements you see may be less relevant and interesting to you. Read more about how companies use cookies to conduct targeted or retargeted advertising here. We do not set advertising cookies through our merchants' storefronts, although merchants may choose to do so independently.

## Operational

- **Social and content cookies:** These are placed on many social media plug-ins (e.g., the Facebook "like" button) and other tools intended to provide or improve the content of a website (e.g., services that allow the playback of video files, or that create comment sections). We integrate these modules into our platform to improve the experience of browsing and interacting with our websites. Please note that some of these third-party services place cookies that are also used for things like behavioral advertising, analytics, and/or market research.

## **Operational**

### **How long will cookies stay on my computer or mobile device?**

The length of time a cookie remains on your computer or mobile device depends on whether it is a "persistent" or "session" cookie. Session cookies last until you stop browsing and persistent cookies last until they expire or are deleted. Most of the cookies we use are persistent and will expire between 30 minutes and two years from the date they are downloaded to your device. Please see the section below on how to control cookies for more information on how to delete them before they expire.

### **How to control cookies?**

You can control and manage cookies in a variety of ways. Please note that deleting or blocking cookies may negatively impact your user experience and some parts of our website may no longer be fully accessible.

Most browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can choose whether or not to accept cookies through your browser's controls, which are often found in your browser's "Tools" or "Preferences" menu. For more information on how to modify your browser settings or how to block, manage, or filter cookies, you can find them in your browser's help file or on sites such as: [www.allaboutcookies.org](http://www.allaboutcookies.org).

### **What are cookies?**

Cookies are used to store and retrieve information relating to users who visit a website. They are used to track the pages visited, as well as to remember certain user actions such as browsing preferences. These preferences are remembered when a user visits the page again.

### **What information is stored on the website?**

1. Statistical information on the use of the site.
2. Record of activity carried out by the visitor (pages viewed, searches, purchases, etc.)
3. Social network connection data for users who log in with their Facebook or Twitter username.

### **What happens if I block its use?**

If you block their use, some web services may not be available.

### **WHAT IS A COOKIE?**

A cookie is a harmless text file that is saved in your browser when you visit a website that uses them, almost all of them do. The usefulness of the cookie is that the website is able to remember your visit when you browse this website again. Cookies have been used for more than 20 years, when the first browsers for the World Wide Web appeared.

### **WHAT IS NOT A COOKIE?**

It's not a virus, or a Trojan, or a worm, or spam, or spyware, or opens pop-up windows.

## **WHAT INFORMATION CAN A COOKIE STORE?**

Cookies do not usually store sensitive information about you, such as credit cards or bank details, photographs, your ID or personal information, etc. The data that is stored is of a technical nature, personal preferences, personalization of content, etc. The web server does not associate you as a person but in your web browser. In fact, if you regularly browse with Internet Explorer and try browsing the same website with Firefox or Chrome you will see that the web does not realize that you are the same person you are actually associating with the browser, not the person.

## **WHAT ARE FIRST-PARTY AND THIRD-PARTY COOKIES?**

First-party cookies are those generated by the page you are visiting and third-party cookies are those generated by external services or providers such as Facebook, Twitter, Google, etc.

## **WHAT HAPPENS IF I disable COOKIES?**

Because you understand the consequences of disabling cookies, here are some examples:

- You may not share content from this website on Facebook, Twitter or any other social network.
- The website will not be able to tailor the content to your personal preferences, as is often the case in online stores.
- You will not be able to access the personal area of this website, such as My Account, or My Profile or My Orders.
- Online stores: It will be impossible for you to make purchases online, they must be by phone or by visiting the physical store if they have one.
- It will not be possible to customize your geographical preferences such as time slot, currency or language.

- The website will not be able to perform web analytics on visitors and traffic on the website, this will make it difficult for the website to be competitive.
- You will not be able to write on the blog, you will not be able to upload images, post comments, rate or rate content. The web will also not be able to tell if you are a human or an automated application that posts spam.
- It will not be possible to show targeted advertising, this will reduce the advertising revenue of the website.
- All social networks make use of cookies, if you disable them, you will not be able to use any social networks.

### **CAN COOKIES BE DELETED?**

Yes. Not only delete, but also block, in a general or particular way for a specific domain. To delete cookies from a website, you have to go to your browser settings and there you can search for those associated with the domain in question and proceed to delete them.

### **COOKIE SETTINGS FOR MOST POPULAR BROWSERS**

Here's how to access a particular Chrome browser cookie. Note: These steps may vary depending on your browser and version:

1. Go to Settings or Preferences using the File menu or by tapping the personalization icon that appears in the top right.
2. You will see different sections, choose the Show Advanced Options option.
3. Go to Privacy, Content Settings.
4. Select All cookies and site data.

5. A list of all cookies will appear sorted by domain. To make it easier for you to find the Cookies of a certain domain, enter partially or fully the address in the Search Cookies field.
6. Once this filter has been carried out, one or more lines with the the cookies for the selected website will appear on the screen. Now you just have to select it and press the X to proceed to delete them.

To access your browser's cookie settings, Internet Explorer does the following (they may vary depending on your browser version):

1. Go to Tools, Internet Options
2. Click Privacy.
3. Move the drop-down to adjust the level of privacy you want.

To access the cookie settings of the Firefox browser, do the following (they may vary depending on the browser version):

1. Go to Options or Preferences depending on your operating system.
2. Click Privacy.
3. Under History, choose Use custom settings for history.
4. You will now see the option Accept cookies, you can enable or disable it according to your preferences.

To access the cookie settings of the Safari for OSX browser do the following (they may vary depending on the browser version):

1. Go to Preferences, then Privacy.
2. In this place you will see the option Block Cookies so that you can adjust the type of blocking you want to perform.

To access the cookie settings of the Safari for iOS browser, do the following (they may vary depending on the browser version):

1. Go to Settings, then Safari.
2. Go to Privacy and Security, you will see the option Block Cookies so that you can adjust the type of blocking you want to perform.

To access the cookie settings of the browser for Android devices do the following (they may vary depending on the browser version):

1. Run the browser and press the Menu key, then Settings.
2. Go to Privacy, you will see the Accept cookies option to enable or uncheck the check box.

To access your browser's cookie settings for Windows Phone devices, do the following (they may vary depending on your browser version):

1. Open Internet Explorer, then More, then Settings
2. You can now enable or disable the Allow cookies check box.
