

Grandtully Slalom Site Terms of Use

The Slalom Infrastructure at Grandtully may only be utilised by paddlers who are registered individual members of Paddle Scotland (Full, Junior or Recreational) or one of the other Home Nations (Paddle England, Paddle Cymru or Paddle Northern Ireland) and follow these Terms of Use.

All individuals using the site **must**:

1. Have [Checked in via JustGo](#) to use the Slalom infrastructure or are participating in an authorised Paddle Scotland event.
2. Act in accordance with the Paddlers' Code, Scottish Outdoor Access Code and Scottish environmental legislation.
3. Be respectful of and considerate to other river users.
4. Park all vehicles at Grandtully Station Park, a Pay & Display car park using a parking machine for on-the-day payments. A Grandtully Annual Pass is the best value for parking at Grandtully. During events, parking is covered by event fees and you will be directed to parking (including any offsite parking) by staff/volunteers who are managing authorised Paddle Scotland events.
5. Always act in a way that will not disturb or cause concern or inconvenience to local residents and businesses.
6. Conduct a comprehensive risk assessment of planned activities and keep that under review based on factors including but not limited to the weather, the river level and other activities taking place on the river.
7. Please ensure all equipment is reset at the end of every session. This includes raising the lines (in case of rising river levels) and moving all gates to the riverbank, well out of the flow. Coaches and paddlers are jointly responsible for making sure this happens — **do not assume someone else will take care of it**. If others are using the slalom infrastructure during your session, it is your responsibility to agree in advance who will handle this.
8. Between sessions taking place on the same day, gates must be moved to the side of the river, out of the flow. However, between sessions on the same day the lines do not need to be raised unless the river is on the rise.

All individuals using the site **must not**:

9. Make any adjustments to, change or cause damage to the river or surrounding areas.
10. Litter or discard any waste in or near the river or surrounding areas.
11. Damage any vegetation or wildlife.
12. Engage in any activities that could disturb or increase danger to other river users.

Organisers of Club Training Sessions / Training Camps (Level 2 or 3 activities/events) **must**:

13. Ensure all participants, officials and coaches check in prior to utilising the facilities. This can be managed on an individual basis or by a club official checking in all participants together.
14. Only permit paddlers and coaches who are competent in the environment to participate, based on current and predicted conditions.

Organisers of [Level 4 or Level 5](#) events **must**:

15. Communicate to all participants, officials and supporters of the event the Paddle Scotland [Code of Conduct](#) and Grandtully Terms of Use and the requirement to check in if using any slalom infrastructure outside of the days of the actual competition/event.
16. Provide a list of all event participants and others who will utilise the slalom site on the water within 3 days of the event's completion in order to comply with the check in requirement of the lease.
17. Carry out a site check at the end of each event to ensure the site is left in good condition and free of any litter or waste.
18. Only permit paddlers and coaches who are competent in the environment to participate, based on current and predicted conditions.
19. Report any breaches of the Code of Conduct to Paddle Scotland staff at the earliest opportunity.

Organisers of Club Training Sessions / Training Camps / all events **must not**:

20. Make any alterations to the site which breach the Scottish Outdoor Access Code or any laws of Scotland.
