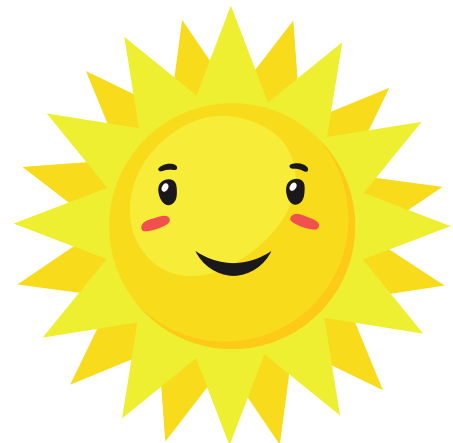

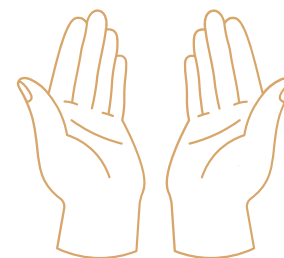

SO MANY REASONS TO CELEBRATE...



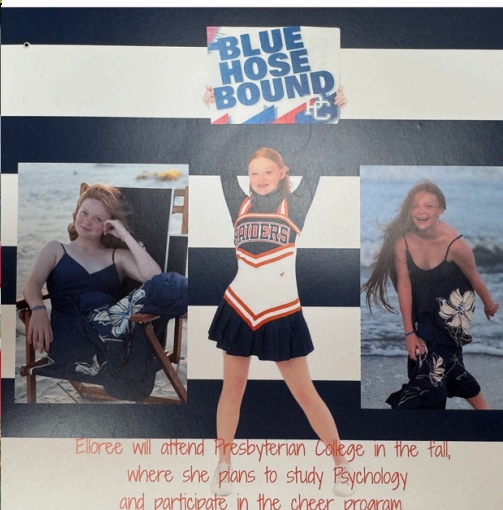

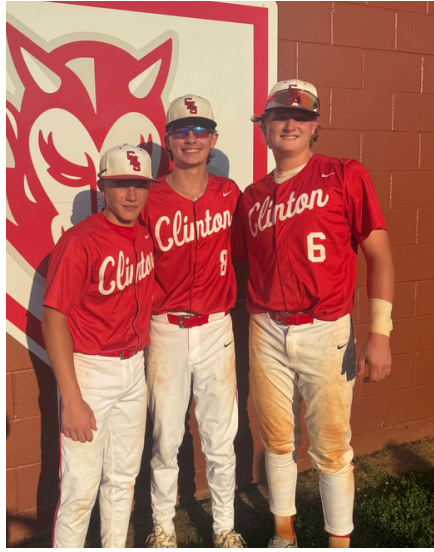
