ERSKINE ACADEMY'S MISSION is dedicated to providing ALL students a high quality education. Through an extensive academic program, rich and meaningful experiences, and a caring school community, the Academy develops a firm foundation in scholarship, leadership, stewardship, and relationships.

ERSKINE ACADEMY is an independent secondary school with an enrollment of 511 students in grades 9 – 12. Erskine employs 53 professional faculty and 30 support staff. Founded in 1883 by Mary T. Erskine, the Academy is the third largest Town Academy in Maine and is situated in the village of South China, on 25 acres of land. Erskine Academy is governed by a five member Board of Trustees, all of who are alumni. The school is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) and named by the Washington Post for four consecutive years as one of "America's Most Challenging Schools."

THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY is comprised of students in grades 9-12 primarily from the communities of Chelsea, China, Jefferson, Palermo, Somerville, Vassalboro, Whitefield, and Windsor on a public paid tuition, school choice basis. Erskine Academy offers athletics and over 20 different clubs for students to participate in.

A COMPREHENSIVE CURRICULUM is core to the academic success of ALL students who attend the academy. Serving students who possess unique strengths and needs, the curriculum ranges from Traditional Core, College Preparatory, Honors, and Advanced Placement courses. Courses are also offered in the Culinary and Industrial Arts, Computer Science and Programming, Robotics, Music, Band, Chorus, World Languages, and Theater. Students have access to technical education programs in Augusta at the Capital Area Technical Center.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT programs are designed to ensure the achievement of ALL students and are prominent throughout the academic program. Starting with faculty who commit their professional energy to the success of each student, and supported by assistance programs such as advisor/advisee, special education services, 504 services, academic assistance, and Job for Maine Graduates. Students who attend Erskine Academy benefit from a support network intent on realizing each student's potential.

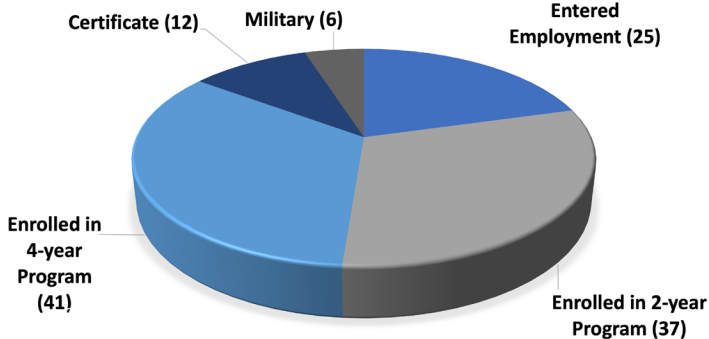
