

INFANT BAPTISM INFO PACKET

Congratulations and thank you for choosing to have your child baptized into the Catholic Church. Below is a step-by-step walk through of the process as well as a checklist of items that you will go through before having your child baptized. Please read it carefully to avoid any delays in the process.

- □ Paperwork Please turn in the following forms to the parish office. **Please note** that all items must be turned in together. No individual documents will be accepted. Baptismal Registration Form

 - Copy of your child's birth certificate
 - A completed Godparent Form for each godparent. You can have up to 2 godparents. If you have 2 godparents, they must be 1 male and 1 female.
- □ A priest will contact you to schedule an interview with the parents.
- ☐ After the interview, all parents and godparents are required to attend a baptism workshop.
 - o If godparents are from out of town, they can attend the workshop at their home parish and provide proof of attendance.
 - o If parents or godparents have taken a baptism workshop within the past 3 years, they do not need to attend the workshop. However, we do encourage godparents to attend the workshop with parents as they journey together with the parents.
 - o Please contact the Faith Formation Office **BEFORE** you take any online course to ensure that we accept the course.
- □ Parents can schedule the baptism **only** after all the above items are complete.
 - o English baptisms take place on the 2nd and 3rd Sundays of the month at 3:30 PM.
 - Vietnamese baptisms take place on the 4th Sunday of the month at 3:30
 - o Spanish baptisms take place on the 1st Sunday of the month at 3:30 PM.

Note: The priests and deacons are very busy in the evenings after six with mass and parish meetings and on the weekends with sacraments and meetings. If the parents have some time between 9 am and 5 pm, Monday through Friday, it will be easier and faster to schedule the appointment. Otherwise the priest or deacon will make every effort to be able to meet with you at the time you have indicated but it may take a little longer for them to find a time.

Rationale of Godparent Eligibility: Godparents for the Sacrament of Baptism are called to be good examples and witnesses of the faith to those whom they are a godparent. To ensure that the Prospective Godparent can fulfill their responsibilities in raising the person in the faith, the Church has listed guidelines for a person to be a godparent. (Code of Canon Law, cc. 872-874 & 893)

Instructions:

As Catholics we are bound to Catholic rules to be good examples and witnesses to those we are godparents to. These are the guidelines that, in choosing to be a godparent, you are obligated to follow.

- The Prospective Godparent is to fill out the form and answer the questions truthfully in front of a member of their parish staff.
 - o No proof of the validity of the Prospective Godparent's answers is necessary.
 - o If married, must be sacramentally married in the Catholic Church.
 - o If not married, must not be living with their significant other.
 - o If has children, they are being educated in the faith.
 - Attends mass every Sunday and all holy days of obligations.
 - Regularly receives the Eucharistic and goes to Confession.
- The Prospective Godparent will sign as evidence of the validity of the answers they have provided.
- Parish staff signs and seals the form with the Parish Seal.

Rationale of Godparent Eligibility: Godparents for the Sacrament of Baptism are called to be good examples and witnesses of the faith to those whom they are a godparent. To ensure that the Prospective Godparent can fulfill their responsibilities in raising the person in the faith, the Church has listed guidelines for a person to be a godparent. (Code of Canon Law, cc. 872-874 & 893)

Instructions:

As Catholics we are bound to Catholic rules to be good examples and witnesses to those we are godparents to. These are the guidelines that, in choosing to be a godparent, you are obligated to follow.

- The Prospective Godparent is to fill out the form and answer the questions truthfully in front of a member of their parish staff.
 - o No proof of the validity of the Prospective Godparent's answers is necessary.
 - o If married, must be sacramentally married in the Catholic Church.
 - o If not married, must not be living with their significant other.
 - o If has children, they are being educated in the faith.
 - Attends mass every Sunday and all holy days of obligations.
 - Regularly receives the Eucharistic and goes to Confession.
- The Prospective Godparent will sign as evidence of the validity of the answers they have provided.
- Parish staff signs and seals the form with the Parish Seal.
