

Jonathan Pageau, Jonah and The Sea Monster

Meditations on Sunday Readings and Famous Art

In this depiction, we witness Jonah being regurgitated by a massive fish along the shores of Nineveh, the capital city of the formidable Assyrian Empire, which stood as the largest world empire of its time. Drawing parallels to the 20th-century Nazis, the Assyrians exhibited brutal dominance over other nations, including the Jews, in their quest for global supremacy.

Jonah is called to be God's prophet to the evil Assyrian Empire. A prophet is a mouthpiece of God. Jonah does not want to answer his vocation as prophet because he is afraid that Nineveh might actually listen to God and repent, thus being spared by God. Jonah does not want to see God be merciful to this wicked people who have already brutalized his own country and people. We might understand this if we consider how a Jew from Nazi Germany, might not want to see Adolf Hitler and the Nazis repent and thus receive God's mercy. They might prefer God's judgement on the Germans.

In the image below, Jonah has presumably just died after being swallowed by the large fish. He has been resurrected by God after being dead for three days in the belly of the fish. Jonah is the only prophet Jesus explicitly compares himself to in the four Gospels. Jonah is a type to prefigure Jesus. He comes to preach repentance to a rebellious, wicked foreign people. In the same way, God became human (a foreigner) and proclaimed a message of repentance so that man might be reconciled to God.

The image below is meant to remind us of Jesus through Jonah. As Jonah's mouth is level with the city, he speaks order into the human chaos.

The below is also an image of the death and resurrection of Jesus. Jesus has conquered man's greatest fear, death. As Jonah uses the fish as a throne, so has Christ conquered death.

This image also reminds us that we, like Jonah, are called to participate in Christ's mission of salvation through our specific, personalized vocations. These vocations often pull us into the unknown, chaotic depths and force us to be conformed to the cross and die in some way. If we are obedient, this ultimately leads to union with Christ, resurrection, and becoming the source of salvation for others.
