Nationwide, organizations similar to the **Grafton County Senior Citizens Council (GCSCC)** are implementing waiting lists due to a lack of funding. Fortunately, we have not had to make that difficult decision. GCSCC's critical services continue uninterrupted for community members throughout Grafton County. We don't turn anyone away, yet that is becoming increasingly challenging as the need for our services grows along with the cost of providing those services. To reduce costs and balance our budget, last year we made some difficult decisions including merging our Orford location with the Horse Meadow Senior Center in North Haverhill.

This report describes the remarkable work accomplished last year by GCSCC's dedicated team of employees, volunteers, and community partners. In 2025, we provided more meals, bus rides, and activities than the year before and we expect that trend to continue.

Also included in this report is a list of individuals and organizations that provided financial support to GCSCC during fiscal year 2024 - 2025. It is that financial support that ensures older adults and individuals with disabilities in our region receive nutritious meals, safe transportation, social connection, volunteer opportunities, Medicare counseling, caregiver support, and so much more.

WE PROVIDE SERVICES FOR RESIDENTS OF EVERY TOWN IN GRAFTON COUNTY. ALL SERVICES ARE FREE.



Nutrition. This GCSCC core service addresses vulnerability to food insecurity for our large and growing older population. We provide hot, nutritious meals and wellness checks each weekday. Our program includes both home-delivered and congregate meals.

On-Demand, Door-to-Door Transportation. When an older adult can no longer drive, reliable transportation is key to ensuring safety and quality of life. Our fleet of buses travel to every town in Grafton County and are wheelchair accessible. This allows participation in social activities, going shopping, and attending healthcare appointments.

Outreach & Social Services. We provide vital support systems and access to essential resources. This includes assistance with daily living needs, complex healthcare navigation, mental health support, and community connection programs, to name a few.

Senior Center Activities & Socialization Programs. Fun, activity, and socialization are key contributors to overall well-being as we age. We offer three primary categories: **Health:** multiple exercise options, health discussions, classes. **Creative & Recreational:** art, music, crafts, dance, hobbies, games **Informative:** seminars, special speakers, computer training, tax prep.

Grafton County Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC).

GCSCC sponsors ADRC (formerly known as ServiceLink) in Grafton County. ADRC provides counseling in Medicaid, Medicare, caregiver support, information, and referrals. Our ADRC staff members are the only certified Medicare counselors in New Hampshire.

RSVP Volunteer Center. (an AmeriCorps Seniors project) works through GCSCC in Grafton and Sullivan counties to offer these programs:

- ♥ Bone Builders: exercise program, designed to prevent or reverse osteoporosis by focusing on strength training and balance
- ♥ Chore Corps: offering caring, screened assistance with small jobs around the home
- ♥ Good Morning!: a telephone reassurance service for people living at home.

An excellent example of someone who has created a lasting ripple effect in Grafton County is Kate Vaughan. Born and raised in Boston, Kate attended Girls Latin School, spent her junior year of college in Freiburg, Germany, and earned her BA from the University of Massachusetts. She moved to the White Mountains in 1973, where she and her husband, Tim, built a life centered around community, the outdoors, and family, including their three grandchildren.

Before joining GCSCC, Kate taught German, worked in a physician's office, served as a case manager assisting injured workers in New Hampshire and Vermont, and operated a vintage jewelry business working with artists around the world. Music has always been an important part of her life, and she continues to play the flute today.

Kate served as Director of the Littleton Area Senior Center from 2003 to 2013. She oversaw core nutrition programs including home delivered and congregate meals, as well as critical transportation services in the rural North Country. She worked closely with the Advisory Council and hundreds of volunteers, whose dedication remains essential to GCSCC's success. Over the past 25 years, Kate has also leveraged strong community connections through organizations such as the Rotary Club of Littleton and the North Country Chamber Players to support volunteer engagement and fundraising efforts.

Even in retirement, Kate continues to give back. She serves on the GCSCC Marketing and Development Committee, and she and Tim deliver meals twice weekly. Through her leadership, service, and generosity, Kate exemplifies the power of saying yes to opportunities that uplift others and strengthen the community.

DEB FOSTER

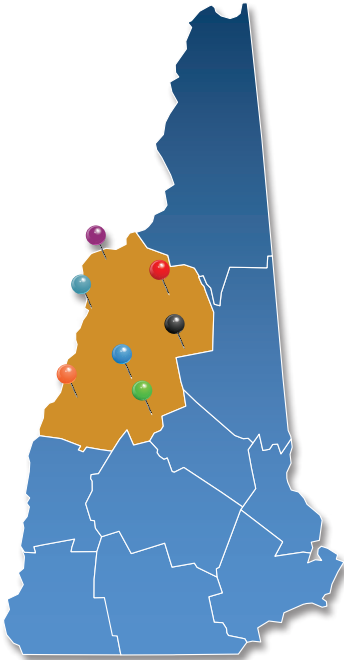
