


Happy Easter and welcome to the Cathedral Parish!

To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."



GOSPEL JOHN 20:1-9

Mary Magdalene and the disciples went to the tomb and found it empty.

Priest/Deacon: The Lord be with you.

On the first day of the week,

Celebrant/Deacon: The Gospel of the Lord.


