1 . Revelation 1: Introduction and Inaugural Vision (53:23)	
Begin this exciting Bible study on Revelation with chapter one, which not only anticipates what is to come but assumes that the reader has knowledge of the first century. This first chapter contains the initial vision, sometimes called the "Inaugural Vision," which holds a message of hope for all of us.

2 . Revelation 2–3: Letters to the Seven Churches (60:29)	
This session discusses the letters to the seven churches mentioned in chapters two and three in Revelation. You turn from the glorious inaugural vision and toward specific messages for seven particular churches in Western Asia. Jeff explains how each letter also follows a seven part pattern.

3 . Revelation 4–5: Creation and Redemption (52:41)	
The Lord leads you into the throne room in this session as you witness a glimpse of heaven itself. The chapters in this session compare the liturgy of creation and the liturgy of redemption, and explain how each vision follows similar patterns for important revelation.

Set yourself up for some intense judgement by reading about the seven-sealed scrolls found in chapters six and seven in Revelation. You realize in this session that God wants to bring you back to heaven to focus on the throne room whenever you feel overwhelmed or trapped in fear.

Break into sound as the seventh seal unleashes the angelic sound of seven trumpet blasts, which announce judgment upon the earth in response to the persistent rebellion and idolatry. This session ends with the witnessing of two dozen elders in faithful worship.

Now that the stage is set for the final conflict between good and evil, this session introduces the major players found in chapters twelve and thirteen in Revelation. Pull back the curtain to witness the full drama on a cosmic scale against the satanic beasts. But be careful because the cast is full of stars!

Although the want is to remain in the heavenly courts forever, there are more angelic announcements to be heard in chapter fifteen.
