Every Life Is Worth the Fight Two Women. The Same Invitation to Hope. A Daily Battle for Every Soul.

Every person who walks through the doors of Haiti Teen Challenge carries a story. Some stories end in healing and restoration. Others remind us that the battle for a soul is real, relentless, and often heartbreaking.

In November 2017, Wideline entered the Haiti Teen Challenge Women's Center burdened by a painful past. Over the next 18 months, she encountered the hope of Christ, embraced biblical discipleship, and allowed God to transform her life.

When she graduated in May 2019 with a certificate in Discipleship and Leadership, her journey was only beginning. With the continued support of our Alumni Department, she enrolled in a fashion design school.



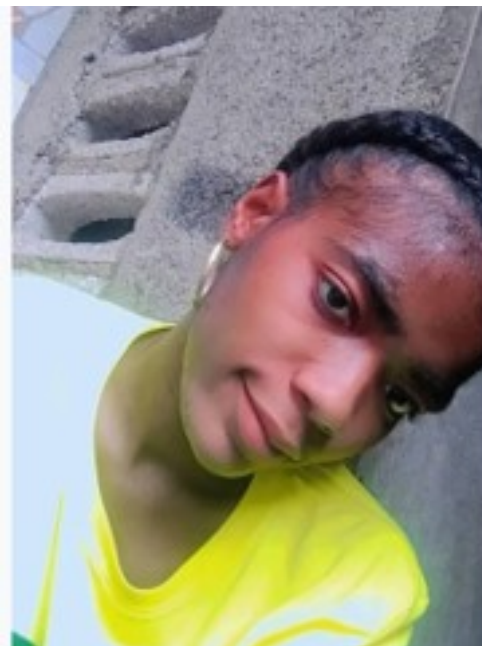
Today, nearly seven years after first entering the program, she is a successful fashion designer, operating her own business and serving as an example to other women who long for a new beginning. Her life is a testimony to what God can do when someone is surrounded by truth, love, accountability, and unwavering support.

Because her own life had been transformed, Wideline wanted others to experience the same hope. In November 2024, she referred a 22-year-old woman named Lansy to Haiti Teen Challenge. Like so many who come to us, Lansy was battling multiple addictions, including illicit drugs, compulsive sexual behavior, marijuana, and gambling. From the very beginning, our

team walked beside her with patience and compassion—listening, counseling, praying with her, and encouraging her through every challenge.

When Lansy decided to leave the program after a short month and a half, our staff did everything they could to persuade her to stay. Wideline rushed to the center and pleaded with her, reminding her that freedom and a new life were still within reach. Together, the staff and the woman who had once stood where Lansy now stood fought for her future.

Despite every effort, Lansy chose to leave the program on January 7, 2025.



Seventeen months later, devastating news reached our center. Lansy had tragically and violently taken her own life.

We grieved deeply—not only the loss of a young woman, but also the loss of the future we had prayed she would embrace. Her passing was a painful reminder that the battle against addiction, despair, and hopelessness does not end when someone walks away from our doors. **It is a battle for life itself.** Yet **even in our grief, we remain committed to fighting for every person God entrusts to our care.** As Scripture reminds us, *"Our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against... the spiritual forces of evil"* (Ephesians 6:12).

Every day, our staff and mentors stand on the front lines of that battle. They invest months—and often years—walking alongside men and women whose addictions, trauma, and hopelessness have convinced them there is no way out. **Yet we continue because we know that every life is worth fighting for.**
