

# ***Introduction to Icon Painting in Egg Tempera: Beginning Project Classes 2026***

***The Theotokos—Feb 14-April 25, 2026***

***The Archangels Michael and Gabriel—Sept 12-Nov 14, 2026***



## **\*\*\*Prerequisite: Paint Mixing & Pigments Class\*\*\***

Each of the beginning projects (a series of 10 classes each) is designed to introduce students to the experience of painting an icon in accord with the iconographic style of the Prosopon School of Iconology. These classes are recommended for students who have never painted an icon and for students who have taken live Prosopon workshops but who have never painted an icon on their own, mixing their own paint. In order to participate in this class, students must be able to prepare their own egg mixture and mix their own paint as instructed in our introductory class *Paint Mixing and Pigments*. ***The three-day Paint Mixing & Pigments Class is a prerequisite for taking these project classes.***

Over the course of ten weekly 4-hour sessions (2 hours in the morning, 2 hours in the afternoon) students will be guided through all the steps of painting an icon. Classes are held on **Saturdays** and are recorded for those who cannot attend the live Zoom class. In addition to the ten Saturday classes, students also may attend weekly **Tuesday** critique sessions where they receive individual advice about their work. Tuesday sessions are at 3:00 pm and 7:00 pm Central Time.

The beginning projects are painted on 6"x 8" rectangular icon boards and are pictured above. In 2026 we will begin the year in February painting Mary, the Mother of God, who is known in the Eastern Church as the **Theotokos**. In September we will paint the **Archangel Gabriel**, with the option to also paint the companion icon of the Archangel Michael. Each of these projects is a sacred icon, painted with prayer and used for prayer. When placed together, the Archangel Gabriel and Our Lady form an Annunciation diptych, reminding us of Mary's words, "Be it done unto me according to Thy will." All three of these pieces can also be used as part of a *deisis*, which will be completed in 2027 with the painting of the icons of Christ and St. John the Baptist. Students may begin with any project in the series, and they may choose to continue to reinforce their learning by continuing with the other projects.

***NOTE: In 2026 an intensive July series of classes painting a small Virgin & Child will be available for those who have completed the February beginning series. This will be an excellent transition to intermediate level painting. See the schedule for more information on that class.***

The focus of the beginning classes is on the mastery of the basic techniques of the transparent Prosopon style painting process, which will enable the student later to paint more complex images. These beginning images have been specifically designed to focus on painting the Byzantine face and basic garments. Each project introduces and teaches line work and stroke work, the application of the basecoat layer (roskrish), applying the highlights in multiple layers, veiling the paint with floats, and painting the final details. No previous painting experience is necessary to enroll in these beginning level classes, other than taking our Paint Mixing class as stated above.

On the day before each class, students will receive by email both written text instructions and color photographs of the work to be introduced in the class the next day. During the class the instructor will review the text instructions, answer questions, and demonstrate the work. Students may either paint along with the instructor or simply watch the demonstrations. On the day following each class, the students will receive a link to the Zoom recording of the class, which they may access at their convenience for review and reinforcement. These recordings will remain accessible for at least three months after the final day of the series of classes.

Cost of the class is \$495.00. This cost includes one 6"x8" icon board, plus two 4" and one 6"x8" claybord. **First-time students must purchase a kit of basic icon painting supplies (\$75.00) that will be used in all future classes: two fine-quality artists' brushes, a plastic palette, and other specialty supplies for icon painting. This kit does not include the pigments, which must be purchased separately.** For those students who do not have pigments, we recommend purchasing one of our pigment kits, which is the most economical way to acquire a variety of pigments. Our basic pigment kit is most economical, and it contains all the pigments needed to complete the beginning projects. In addition to purchasing the pigments, students must also purchase a few other supplies, including a compass with a painting tip. A list of these supplies and sources to purchase them, along with a class schedule, will be provided upon registration for the class.

***Register for this workshop either electronically or by mail. Cost of the class, including the icon board, is \$495.00, plus \$75 basic kit for first-time students. Final Deadline for registration is one week before the beginning date of the class.***
