



# Winter 2026 Regional Homelessness Snapshot

## January 2026 Point-in-Time Count

The **Point-in-Time (PIT)** count provides a one-night snapshot of homelessness in our region, including those in shelters, transitional housing, domestic violence shelters, or unsheltered locations. Homelessness takes many forms, all reflecting broader crises of economic inequality and housing affordability. The Greater Richmond Continuum of Care (GRCoC) unites community-based agencies\* to **focus on supporting those without a stable place to live.**

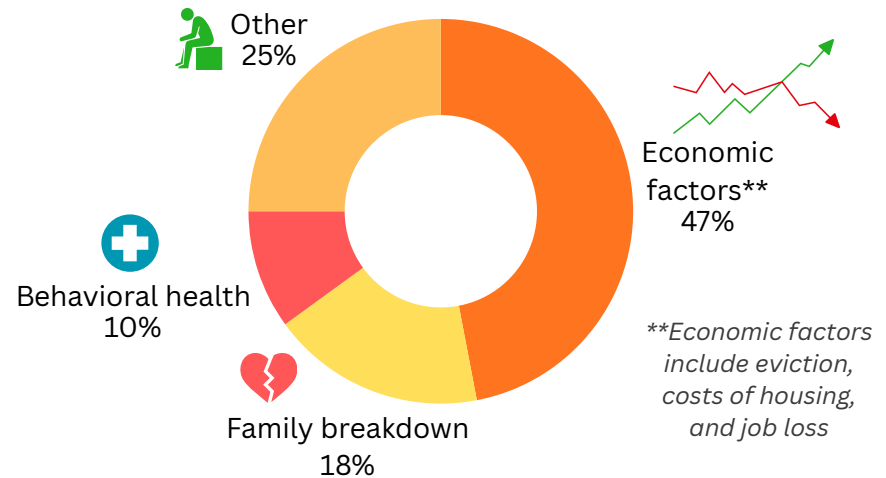
Although extreme weather prevented an official count of unsheltered homelessness in January 2026, those counted in the additional seasonal shelters would likely have been unsheltered.

Between July 1, 2025 and December 31, 2025:

individuals were served by agencies in the Greater Richmond Continuum of Care (GRCoC), through programs such as triage and assessment, street outreach, emergency shelter, transitional housing, rapid re-housing, permanent supportive housing, and other programs.
