July 2008 Snapshot of Individuals and Families

Experiencing Homelessness in the Richmond Region

The following data were collected in Homeward's second summer (July 24, 2008) count of individuals and families experiencing homelessness in the Richmond region. A total of 823 adults and 153 children were counted. The statistics reported below represent the 549 (66.7%) of adults who completed the Homeward point-in-time survey.

- 72.6% of adults are males, 27.1% are females, and .4% are transgendered. Most homeless persons are single adults (56.2%). 43.8% of people experiencing homelessness are or have been in families, including those who are married, separated, widowed or divorced. (The combined total for single, widowed, separated and divorced adults is 94.9%).
- A majority of persons report that they are African-American (63.4%), followed by White (31.6%) or Hispanic (2.4%).
- The average age for adults is 43.6 years.
- 50.5% have a high school education or GED. 18.8% attended some college, and 11.2% have a college degree or higher.
- 22.0% are veterans.
- The majority (71.7%) served some time in jail and/or prison. Out of all individuals surveyed (including those who have not served time in jail and/or prison), 47.3% reported serving time in jail, 4.8% reported serving time in prison, and 19.6% indicated that they had served time in both jail and prison.
- 29.0% have experienced domestic violence in their lifetime. Of those experiencing domestic violence, 7.6% had experienced it in the past month, and 32.6% had experienced it in the past year.
- 49.0% report having a problem with alcohol sometime in their lifetime. Of those reporting a problem with alcohol, 78.0% are currently in recovery.
- 56.9% report having a problem with substance abuse sometime in their lifetime. Of those reporting a problem, 81.2% are currently in recovery.
- 36.1% report having a mental health problem sometime in their lifetime. Of these, 62.2% are currently being treated and 54.7% are taking medication for mental health problems.
- 34.9% report having a long-term disability.
- 32.8% are employed. Of those who are employed, 61.1% work full-time, 26.1% work part-time, and 12.7% do day labor or temp work.
- 46.9% of respondents have lived in Greater Richmond for 5 years or more; 33.5% have lived in the area for 17 years or more.
- Most (50.2%) reported having their last housing in Richmond. Others indicated previous housing in Henrico (10.6%), Chesterfield (9.0%) and Hanover (2.0%). 17.5% of respondents last lived elsewhere in Virginia, and 10.4% lived in other states.
- 12.1% of homeless persons have children living with them.
- In the past three years, most homeless persons have been homeless once (59.5%) or twice (23.6%); 16.9% have been homeless three or more times during this time period.
- A little less than half (48.3%) of homeless persons have been homeless for 5 months or less.
