## July 2008 Snapshot of Veterans

## **Experiencing Homelessness in the Richmond Region**

The following data were collected in Homeward's second summer (July 24, 2008) count of individuals and families experiencing homelessness in the Richmond region. A total of 823 adults and 153 children were counted, and 66.7% of adults completed the Homeward point-in-time survey. The statistics reported below represent the 22.0% of those adults surveyed who indicated that they were veterans.

- 92.2% of veterans are males, 6.9% are females, and .9% are transgendered.
- A majority of veterans report that they are African-American (59.8%), followed by White (34.2%) or two or more races (2.6%). Hispanics comprised 3.7% of the sample.
- The average age for adult veterans is 49.2 years.
- 73.2% were honorably discharged. 3.6% of all discharges were medical.
- 48.7% have a high school education or GED. 31.3% attended some college, and 13.9% have a college degree or higher.
- The majority (76.0%) served some time in jail and/or prison. Out of the individuals surveyed, 46.0% reported serving time in jail, 4.0% reported serving time in prison, and 26.0% indicated that they had served time in both jail and prison. Of the individuals who served time in jail or prison, 55.3% reported having felony convictions; 37.5% indicated that they were homeless prior to their last incarceration; and 56.0% reported being homeless upon discharge from their last incarceration.
- 17.8% have experienced domestic violence in their lifetime. Of those experiencing domestic violence, none had experienced it in the past month, and 25.0% had experienced it in the past year.
- 60.4% report having a problem with alcohol sometime in their lifetime. Of those reporting a problem with alcohol, 85.2% are currently in recovery.
- 61.4% report having a problem with substance abuse sometime in their lifetime. Of those reporting a problem with substance abuse, 85.5% are currently in recovery.
- 39.0% report having a mental health problem sometime in their lifetime. Of these, 74.4% are currently being treated, and 61.5% are taking medication for mental health problems.
- 37.4% report having a long-term disability.
- 35.0% are employed. Of those who are employed, 68.6% work full-time, 28.6% work part-time, and 2.9% do day labor or temp work.
- 51.0% of respondents have lived in Greater Richmond for 3 years or more; 35.7% have lived in the area for 17 years or more.
- Most (49.5%) reported having their last housing in Richmond. Others indicated previous housing in Henrico (7.9%), Chesterfield (7.9%) and Hanover (3.0%). 16.8% of respondents last lived elsewhere in Virginia, and 14.9% lived in other states.
- In the past three years, most homeless veterans have been homeless once (55.0%), twice (22.9%), or three times (13.8%); 8.3% have been homeless more than three times during this time period.
- 40.0% have been homeless for 4 months or less.
