## July 2016 Snapshot of People Who Were Homeless or in Foster Care as Children

## **Experiencing Homelessness in the Richmond Region**

The following data were collected in Homeward's 10<sup>th</sup> winter (July 20, 2016) count of individuals and families experiencing homelessness in the Richmond region. A total of 607 adults and 84 children were counted, and 88.1% of adults completed the Homeward point-in-time survey. The statistics below represent the 14.0% of individuals who indicated that they were homeless or in foster care as children.

- 69.3% of adults are males, and 29.3% are females. Most are single, never married adults (53.3%). 46.7% have been in families, including those who are married, as well as those who are widowed, separated, or divorced.
- 17.0% have children living with them.
- A majority report that they are African-American (56.3%), followed by White (28.2%). 9.7% indicated that they are Hispanic.
- The average age for adults now homeless who experienced homelessness as children or were in foster care is 40.3 years.
- 49.3% have just a high school education or GED. 25.3% attended some college, and 9.3% have a college degree or higher.
- 20.3% are veterans.
- 75.7% have been to jail and/or prison. Of those serving time in jail and/or prison, 58.5% reported having felony convictions, and 47.2% reported being homeless before incarceration.
- 34.7% have experienced domestic violence in their lifetime. Of those experiencing domestic violence, 37.5% had experienced it in the past year.
- 45.9% report having a problem with alcohol sometime in their lifetime. Of those reporting a problem with alcohol, 61.8% are currently in recovery.
- 45.9% report having a problem with drugs sometime in their lifetime. Of those reporting a problem with drugs, 64.7% are currently in recovery.
- 62.2% report having a mental health problem sometime in their lifetime. Of these, 60.9% are currently being treated, and 47.8% are taking medication for mental health problems. 89.1% have also received counseling for mental health problems at some time in their lifetime.
- 39.4% report having a long-term disability. Of those reporting a long-term disability, 65.4% indicated that their disability was drug or alcohol abuse; 63.0% indicated that their disability was a mental illness; and 42.3% indicated that their disability was a physical disability. (Note that respondents could select all, some, or none of these options.)
- 18.9% are employed. Of those who are employed, 14.3% do day labor or temporary work, 28.6% work part-time, and 57.1% work full-time.
- The median length of time respondents have lived in Greater Richmond is four years, and 31.3% have lived in the area for 20 or more years.
- The largest percentage of respondents (61.6%) reported having their last housing in Richmond. Others indicated previous housing in Henrico (9.6%) and Chesterfield (4.1%). 12.4% of respondents last lived elsewhere in Virginia, and 9.6% lived in other states.
- In the past three years, most homeless adults have been homeless once (44.0%) or twice (17.3%); 38.7% had been homeless three or more times during this time period.
- A little less than half (46.3%) have been homeless for six months or less.
