July 2018 Snapshot of Adults in Families

Experiencing Homelessness in the Richmond Region

The following data were collected in Homeward's 12th summer (July 19, 2018) count of individuals and families experiencing homelessness in the Richmond region. A total of 491 adults and 86 children were counted, and 79.4% of adults completed the Homeward point-in-time survey. The statistics below represent the 9.0% of individuals who indicated that they were accompanied by children.

- 91.2% of adults are females, and 5.9% are males. Most adults in families are single, never married adults (73.5%). 26.5% are or have been in families, including those who are married, as well as those who are partnered, separated, widowed, or divorced.
- A majority of persons in families report that they are African-American (82.4%), followed by White (14.7%). None indicated that they are Hispanic.
- The average age for adults is 33.1 years.
- 69.7% have just a high school education or GED. 15.2% attended some college, and 6.1% have a college degree.
- 29.4% served some time in jail and/or prison. Out of all individuals surveyed (including those
 who have not served time in jail and/or prison), 23.5% reported serving time in jail, and 5.9%
 indicated that they had served time in both jail and prison.
- 61.8% have experienced domestic violence in their lifetime. Of those experiencing domestic violence, 47.4% had experienced it in the past year.
- 6.7% report having a problem with alcohol sometime in their lifetime, and 15.2% have reported having a problem with drugs sometime in their lifetime.
- 27.3% report having a mental health problem sometime in their lifetime. Of these, 44.4% are currently being treated, and 44.4% are taking medication for mental health problems.
- 12.1% report having a long-term disability.
- 50.0% are employed. Of those who are employed, 58.8 work full-time, and 41.2 work part-time.
- The median length of time respondents have lived in Greater Richmond is 8.9 years. 41.4% have lived in the area for 17 years or more.
- The majority of respondents (58.8%) reported having their last housing in Richmond. Others indicated previous housing in Henrico (11.8%), Chesterfield (11.8%), and Hanover (2.9%). 2.9% of respondents last lived elsewhere in Virginia, and 5.9% lived in other states.
- In the past three years, most homeless adults in families have been homeless once (66.7%) or twice (18.2%); 15.1% have been homeless three or more times during this time period.
- More than half (59.4%) have been homeless for four months or less.
