## July 2018 Snapshot of People Who Were Homeless or in Foster Care as Children

## **Experiencing Homelessness in the Richmond Region**

The following data were collected in Homeward's 12<sup>th</sup> summer (July 19, 2018) count of individuals and families experiencing homelessness in the Richmond region. A total of 491 adults and 86 children were counted, and 79.4% of adults completed the Homeward point-in-time survey. The statistics below represent the 18.0% of individuals who indicated that they were homeless or in foster care as children.

- 57.1% of adults are males, and 42.9% are females. Most are single, never married adults (70.0%). 30.0% have been in families, including those who are married, as well as those who are widowed, separated, or divorced.
- 12.9% have children living with them.
- The largest percentage report that they are African-American (61.4%), followed by White (24.3%). 12.9% indicated that they are Hispanic.
- The average age for adults now homeless who experienced homelessness as children or were in foster care is 41.1 years.
- 44.9% have just a high school education or GED. 33.3% attended some college or have a college degree.
- 20.0% are veterans.
- 69.6% have been to jail and/or prison. Of those serving time in jail and/or prison, 64.6% reported having felony convictions, and 41.7% reported being homeless before incarceration.
- 52.9% have experienced domestic violence in their lifetime. Of those experiencing domestic violence, 40.0% had experienced it in the past year.
- 42.0% report having a problem with alcohol sometime in their lifetime, and 37.1% report having a problem with drugs sometime in their lifetime.
- 68.6% report having a mental health problem sometime in their lifetime. Of these, 58.3% are currently being treated, and 46.8% are taking medication for mental health problems. 95.8% have also received counseling for mental health problems at some time in their lifetime.
- 40.0% report having a long-term disability. Of those reporting a long-term disability, 28.6% indicated that their disability was drug or alcohol abuse; 67.9% indicated that their disability was a mental illness; and 53.6% indicated that their disability was a physical disability. (Note that respondents could select all, some, or none of these options.)
- 25.7% are employed. Of those who are employed, 11.1% do day labor or temporary work,
  50.0% work part-time, and 38.9% work full-time.
- The median length of time respondents have lived in Greater Richmond is 5.2 years, and 38.6% have lived in the area for 10 or more years.
- The largest percentage of respondents (50.0%) reported having their last housing in Richmond. 10.0% last lived in Henrico, 1.4% in Chesterfield, and 1.4% in Hanover. 12.9% of respondents last lived elsewhere in Virginia, and 22.9% lived in other states.
- In the past three years, most homeless adults have been homeless once (40.9%) or twice (15.2%); 44.0% had been homeless three or more times during this time period.
- Less than half (49.0%) have been homeless for nine months or less.
