## July 2019 Snapshot of Veterans

## **Experiencing Homelessness in the Richmond Region**

The following data were collected in Homeward's 13<sup>th</sup> summer (July 31, 2019) count of individuals and families experiencing homelessness in the Richmond region. A total of 436 adults and 57 children were counted, and 74.3% of adults completed the Homeward point-in-time survey. The statistics below represent the 17.6% of individuals who indicated that they were veterans.

- 94.6% of adults are males, and 5.4% are females. 55.4% are or have been in families (including those who are married, as well as those who are separated, widowed, or divorced) or are currently partnered.
- 3.6% of veterans reported having children living with them.
- The largest percentage of veterans report that they are African-American (56.4%), followed by White (36.4%). None indicated that they are Hispanic.
- The average age for adult veterans is 57.6 years.
- 25.0% of veterans reported that they served in combat. 75.6% were honorably discharged. 7.3% of all discharges were general.
- 42.9% have just a high school education or GED. 28.6% attended some college, and 16.1% have a college degree or higher.
- 66.1% have been to jail and/or prison. Of those serving time in jail and/or prison, 50.0% reported having felony convictions, and 17.9% reported being homeless before incarceration.
- 23.2% have experienced domestic violence in their lifetime. Of those experiencing domestic violence,
  27.3% had experienced it in the past year.
- 42.9% report having a problem with alcohol and 38.1% report having a problem with drugs sometime in their lifetime.
- 38.1% report having received treatment of counseling for mental health problems sometime in their lifetime. Of these, 75.0% are currently being treated, and 73.3% are taking medication for mental health problems.
- 30.4% report having a long-term disability. Of those reporting a long-term disability, 35.3% indicated that their disability was drug or alcohol abuse; 58.8% indicated that their disability was a mental illness; and 64.7% indicated that their disability was physical. (Note that respondents could select multiple disability types.)
- 35.7% are employed. Of those who are employed, 50.0% work full-time, 25.0% work part-time, and 25.0% do day labor or temp work.
- The median length of time respondents have lived in Greater Richmond is 2.3 years, and 28.6% have lived in the area for 17 years or more.
- The largest percentage of respondents (48.2%) reported having their last housing in Richmond. Others indicated previous housing in Chesterfield (5.4%) and Henrico (10.7%). 26.8% of respondents last lived elsewhere in Virginia, and 8.9% lived in other states.
- In the past three years, most homeless persons have been homeless once (48.1%) or twice (22.2%). 29.6% have been homeless three or more times during this time period.
- 47.5% have been homeless for six months or less.
