JOINING OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Moving from primary school to secondary school is a milestone for every young person, it brings new challenges and exciting opportunities. At Robert Clack School we offer a supportive and well structured environment to ensure students settle in quickly and embrace the opportunities available to them.

How do we help your child settle in?

Before students join the school

- A member of the transition team will visit local primary schools to meet prospective students.
- We meet all of our parents/carers at transition evening to ensure we have all the information we require to best support their child when they start school.
- We have a year 6 induction day for students in June. This is designed for pupils to familiarise themselves with the site, staff and make friends.

After pupils join the school

- We have a transition team comprising of an Assistant Headteacher, Head of Year and form tutor to ensure each pupil is settling in well.
- All parents/carers have an opportunity to meet form tutors in the second half term to receive feedback from all subject teachers.
- We offer an extensive range of enrichment activities throughout the academic year to engage and enrich pupils.
- Every pupil has an opportunity to join the school council allowing our students to voice their opinions and develop not only their leadership skills but also peer mentorship.

OUR CURRICULUM

At Robert Clack School we offer our students a broad and enriching curriculum which enables them to make outstanding progress, engage with challenging concepts and prepare for success in the professional world of work.

At Key Stage 3 (Years 7 to 9) students study the full National Curriculum and following subjects:

We encourage our students to work towards their aspirations by utilising the different learning pathways available to them. Our pupils are set challenging targets and their progress towards them is reviewed and monitored by class teachers during our assessment rounds. We recognise the importance of open communication between home and school and the successes which come with a proactive relationship between the two.

At Key Stage 4 all students study the core curriculum of English, Mathematics, Science (double or triple), PE and RE.

Students have a further wide range of subjects to choose from:

Each year group has a dedicated pastoral team who are the first point of contact for parents and carers; they are able to give an overview of a child's progress and welfare in all areas of school life.

By tracking pupil progress we are able to identify students requiring further support. We have a range of out of school hours sessions being run by staff to help pupils. We also have a numeracy and literacy mentoring programme which helps students enhance relevant skills to improve overall progress. Pupils with additional learning needs are supported by the Special Educational Needs team who utilise various strategies to support students.

Our teachers support a magnitude of extracurricular clubs which run not only after school but also on weekends and during holidays. This facilitates learning beyond the classroom, giving our pupils not only additional academic support but encouraging them to explore and build on other talents and any interests they may have.











Robert Clack School has excellent sports facilities, with a newly built state of the art sports centre at the Green Lane site which complements the Leisure Centre facilities on the Gosfield site. With our dance studios, indoor sports halls, all-weather pitches, fully equipped fitness suites, outdoor tennis courts and cricket nets, we are able to provide our students with facilities to be coached for all aspects of sporting success on-site.

Our PE staff are not only dedicated teachers but also coaches who work tirelessly with their teams to get the best out of them. Coaching sessions run before school, after school and on Saturdays. There is a vast variety of sports clubs to choose from and we encourage pupils to take part, as it gives them the opportunity to integrate with the school community. Some students will take part to keep fit, some will do as a fun activity and others may participate to compete with other schools/teams.

Robert Clack School has a strong reputation for its sporting success locally and regionally but also nationally and internationally.















Robert Clack Sixth Form has an extensive track record of working with pupils to secure places at top Universities, including Oxbridge and Russell Group on highly completive courses such as Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Medicine and Law. Pupils also progress to internships and apprenticeships including ones at international firms in the city of London.

A range of programmes of study are available to our Sixth Form pupils to cater for a wide range of interests and aspirations. Pupils can chose to study a purely academic programme (i.e. A Levels only) or a purely vocational programme (i.e. BTEC and Cambridge Technical qualifications) or a mixture of the two.

In total there are over 30 subjects available for students to study. Our wide curriculum enables students to pursue a tailored pathway to lead them to their chosen destination.

In addition to the core academic or vocational subjects that a pupil studies, a wide range of enrichment and personal development opportunities These form an integral part of a pupil's are on offer. timetable and ensure that they develop the skills and valued attributes that are by universities options include employers. These our prestigious Rugby and Netball academies, the Duke of Edinburgh award, the Extended Project Qualification, Debate and community outreach programmes.







Ford

Ford supports Robert Clack School with initiatives for pupils aged 11-18 years. The partnership has resulted in positive outcomes, including mentoring support, improving levels of self-esteem and confidence which has resulted in higher commitment and application to their studies. Those who worked on Insight to Management projects, Formula 24 and the Safety Film have gained valuable skills and experiences. The partnership has provided accessibility to previously unattainable experiences, which have impacted and inspired future generations.



Robert Clack Alumni

The Robert Clack Alumni Association was established in February 2010. The alumni are very active within the school – inspiring students by attending skills for life sessions and presentation evenings, funding trips, travel costs and university taster days, donating cash prizes at awards evenings, opening up opportunities for work experience and apprenticeships and kitting out some of our very talented sporting students.

For the Sixth Form students, a Mentoring Programme has been set up which is now well established. The Brilliant Club and Study Skills Workshops, which are aimed at developing students' knowledge, skills and ambition to secure places at highly-selective universities, are funded by the alumni.
