

Dear Friends

Dear Friends,

(Note: I am plagiarizing a great deal of this week's column from an article by Holy Beginnings Outreach – LGBTQ for the simple reason that they have been able to put into words what I have believed/felt for some time now. Holy Beginnings is a part of the National Eucharistic Revival)

The media attention surrounding the recent declaration from the Vatican concerning blessings in IRREGULAR SITUATIONS SUCH AS SAME-SEX COUPLES, can challenge you depending on how you feel about this particular topic. While some question whether this declaration goes too far, others will think it does not go far enough. I would like to attempt to describe what it means by taking what is intended to be a balanced approach.

The purpose of the Vatican's declaration (entitled "Fiducia Supplicans"), allowing for official blessings of same-sex couples by ministers of the church, is without question another step towards being a more welcoming church. It further affirms Pope Francis' commitment to reaching out to those on the margins and encouraging all of us to do the same.

This declaration responds, at least in part, to recent Synod feedback to be a more welcoming church, in particular to the LGBTQ community. It also reinforces our call to be a Eucharistic people, to be the living of presence of Christ in the world.

The declaration makes clear that a blessing can be extended to couples in irregular situations and same-sex couples. This request should be received and valued outside of a liturgical framework allowing for a realm of greater spontaneity and freedom.

What we can all agree on is that it is a significant change. I believe it is a much-needed pastoral response to Catholic LGBTQ couples who desire God's blessing and who ask that all that is true, good, and humanly valid in their lives and their relationships be enriched, healed, and elevated by the presence of the Holy Spirit.

I look forward with joy to blessing those couples who desire the graces that God wishes for us all. God bless,


