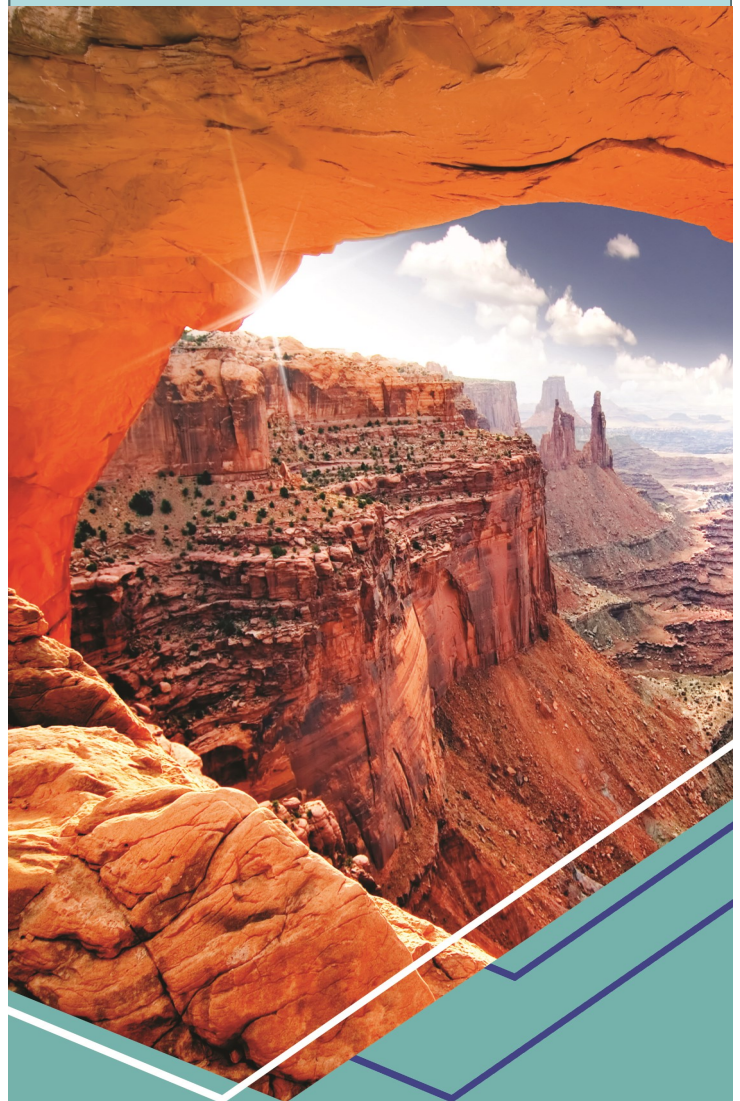

The Vineyard

The second son never showed up to the vineyard. Did he get lost? Did he get tired? Did he not know where to begin?

When it comes right down to it, good intentions amount to very little. We all know this, don't we? "Show me, don't tell me." "I'll believe it when I see it." It's as true in the workplace and in relationships as it is in the life of the Christian disciple.

It doesn't matter if we *intend* to work in the vineyard. It doesn't matter if we promise to, if we think about it a lot, or if we make grand plans for what we will accomplish there. None of that matters if we don't show up. Before we show up, we have to find the way.

Showing up is the whole point. The work is the point, not the intention.

But all this begs the question: what does the *work* mean for us as baptized Catholics in the modern world? Spending our Saturdays in soup kitchens and homeless shelters? Standing on a street corner shouting out the words of the Gospel?

Our baptismal call is to the vineyard. Where is our vineyard? How do we show up? *We are ready, Lord, we say. We intend to work. But where do we go?*

My vineyard is not your vineyard, and so it's not my place to tell you how to get there. I am glad you want to go, but you'll have to find your own way, just like I will. But I can tell you this: only one voice will lead you there. If you listen to it, you will find your vineyard.

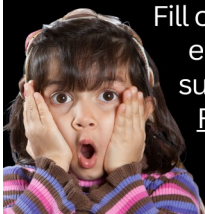

Rosary History Trivia



Pope Leo XIII is still known to be the oldest pope to hold the Vicar of Christ at 93 years old, pope from 1878-1903. Known as one of the greatest Marian Popes, he wrote 11 rosary encyclicals and was largely responsible for turning the month of October into a month dedicated to the rosary. Since this time, many Catholics increased their devotion of this precious prayer of ours. While repeating the prayers on each bead, one of the 20 mysteries are to be meditated on. These mysteries are reflective of the entire life of Jesus from the cradle to the cross. The rosary meditation done consistently and with a sincere heart will deepen your conviction to faith, prompt a conversion of your heart and strengthen your will to follow Christ.

When meditating on the mysteries during prayer, placing yourself at the scene of the mystery has a profound effect. At the Nativity, see yourself kneeling at the manger and find that Mary offers for you to hold the Infant Jesus. At the wedding feast at Cana, see yourself drinking wine with the disciples. At the crucifixion, see yourself at the foot of the cross with Mary weeping next to you. At the Ascension, see yourself on the hill witnessing the full Glory of Jesus rising into Heaven. Each week in the month of October, the bulletin will give a historical trivia account on our rosary.

"The Eucharist is the source of our life. It's the beating heart of the church where we receive the life of Christ as the body of Christ.

Catholics need to recover a sense of awe and adoration before the Eucharist, knowing that it is the real and loving presence of the Lord. Indeed, the Eucharist is God's response to the deepest hunger of the human heart, the hunger for authentic life because, in the Eucharist, Christ himself is truly in our midst to nourish, console and sustain us on our journey. It [the Eucharist] is more than a symbol; it is the real and loving presence of the Lord."

Please come as we consider how God and God's beloved people make themselves truly present to one another, moving with Christ from the Table at the sacrifice of the Mass to the world.
